The Mother Lode Chapter President, **Mike Muetz**, had the privilege of presenting the **Bronze C.A.R.-SAR Medal of Appreciation** to **Sabine Adams Hall**, for her over ten (10) years of service as a Senior Leader in the local C.A.R. Society in El Dorado County – **The Sacramento C.A.R. Society**.

The award lists three purposes for which the Medal can be awarded, and Sabine meets all three. A local Chapter, may present the **Bronze C.A.R.-SAR Medal of Appreciation** to a member of the C.A.R in good standing in recognition of and in appreciation for:

The Sacramento Society of the C.A.R. was re-activated by Jeannette Barrett, of Placerville, in September 2007 with the understanding the society would serve the children of El Dorado County. In 2008 Sabine brought her four (4) children, along with eight (8) of her nieces and nephews, from her three sibling's families, into the C.A.R. Sabine immediately began to serve as a Senior Leader and eventually Jeanette passed the baton as Senior President to Sabine. In 2020 Sabine was informed by the C.A.R. State President that she had served the maximum number of years allowed as President, and so she has stepped aside.

#3 ... significantly aided SAR programs, or SAR members

Following the June Meeting, Compatriot Drake contacted the **Texas BBQ** caterer. The meal cost is \$17 per person. For 55 people, this works out to slightly over \$1,000 for the caterer. Her contract provides for 15% gratuity, but since we're providing the service, plates, utensils, I'll negotiate a smaller tip for the delivery. That tip should go to the CAP servers and since the CAP will work from start to finish, we should feed them also.

- The food will arrive in thermos containers, hot food hot, salad crisp and cold.
- We'll try the ice cream bars for dessert so that still has to be added.
- The menu will be a choice of BBQ Texas Beef Brisket and BBQ chicken breasts, green salad with dressing, steamed vegetables, and garlic mashed potatoes.
- This dinner will cost about \$500 less than the 2018 caterer Spaghetti Factory.
