

Gene Wright Myers was born in South Gate, California, and spent his childhood in Grass Valley, graduating from Grass Valley High in 1949. He spent a short time at the University of California, Berkeley, before enlisting in the U.S. Navy in January, 1951. He met his wife, Irma Jean Wilson, while stationed at Treasure Island, where she was a civil service worker. They moved to southern California, where he earned B.A. and M.A. Degrees at University of California, Long Beach. Gene and Jeanie have been married for over 62 years. They have two adult children, Sharon Myers Clarke, and Mark Gene Myers.

Gene retired from Paramount Unified School District where he taught high school for 31 years. After retiring, he spent ten years in Colorado pursuing his hobbies of fishing and hunting. Other hobbies have included amateur radio, koi husbandry, boat racing, raising red-factored canaries, raising elkhounds, and touring on a motorcycle for 40 years. Gene and Jeanie have five grandchildren, and eight great-grandchildren.

Gene's application to join the Sons of the American Revolution was approved on December 28, 2005. His patriot ancestor, William King, was a private in the Third New Hampshire Colonist Regiment. He will speak on his experiences as a gold miner.

How King George III Obtained the Hessian Soldiers


In late 1775, when it became obvious that George III could not raise enough men in England to send a strong British army to America, he tried to hire 20,000 Russians from Empress Catherine the Great. She rebuffed him with a wise warning: Using foreign troops was a confession of weakness.

The King ignored her and turned to a more certain source of manpower - his fellow German princes. George III was also the ruler of the Duchy of Hanover, and he had no difficulty hiring soldiers from the noblemen who ruled the 300 little sovereignties that composed Germany in 1776. For generations, they had been in the business of renting bodies to warring powers to pay for their conspicuous consumption.

The best known of these body merchants were the Landgraves of Hesse-Cassel. Their soldiers had been fighting for strangers all over Europe since 1687. The present Landgrave, Frederick II, was a relative. His first wife had been George III's aunt. Frederick was delighted to sign a contract for 12,000 soldiers at £7 4s. 4d. per man.

Frederick also persuaded George III to part with an annual subsidy to Hesse-Cassel of £108,181 5s., to be continued for a year after the troops returned. Finally Frederick pressured George to pay him an old claim from the Seven Years War, which amounted to a neat £41,820. The British also agreed to pay the salaries of officers and men while they were in America.

George struck similar bargains for smaller numbers of troops with Duke of Brunswick, who was married to his sister. The Duke's annual subsidy of £ 11,517 was extended two years after the troops returned, and doubled during that period. Moreover, the Duke would receive the price of a new recruits 4s. 4d. for every man killed, and third of that for every man wounded.
