Wayne Griswold was born in Illinois. At the age of 4, his parents moved his family to California where Wayne spent his childhood growing up in Citrus Heights. A graduate of San Juan High School, he attended America River College where he majored in Psychology. In 1971, Wayne began his working career as a freight car inspector for the Southern Pacific Transportation Company in Roseville, CA. In 1977, he became a locomotive engineer, and in 1995, he went on the road as a freight engineer pulling trains throughout northern California. Among other things, his hobbies include genealogy and graphic arts.

Wayne joined the Gold Country Chapter SAR in August 2000. His patriot ancestor, Daniel Griswold, served multiple enlistments in the Connecticut and Massachusetts State Militias. A special award went to honor one of our own:

Gene Myers, Mother Lode Chapter Chaplain. President Adams said, "Gene, we wanted to find a way recognize you for your long and dedicated service to the Chapter as our Chaplain. In talking it over we came to realization that serving others is part of who you are. You served in the Navy for 4 years during the Korean War; after getting your college degrees you then taught high school for over 30 years. You were one of the Chapter founding members in 2007, where you assumed the role of Chaplain. We felt the SAR Military Service Medal would best express our gratitude and admiration."

Presentation:

Our guest speaker was Major General Douglas Stone United States Marine Corp Reserve, Retired. President Adams introduced General Stone as a member of the Sons of the American Revolution, and the recipient of the SAR War Service Medal. He is also the recipient of the Daughters of American Revolution highest award, their Medal of Honor. General Stone is a highly decorated Marine with more than 37 years of commissioned service. Starting his career after graduation from the United States Naval Academy with early service in the Vietnam War, and continuing on with tours in Pakistan, Afghanistan, and Iraq. In Iraq, General Stone served as Deputy Commander over all Multi-National Forces under General David Petraeus, overseeing all theatre interrogation and detention. General Stone's many achievements have been documented in books and articles, but pertinent to our interest tonight in the book "The Gamble," by Tom Ricks. In discussing General Stone's accomplishments in Iraq during the 'Surge', Ricks says General Stone "rewrote the book on effective multinational law enforcement and detention operations" and "forever changed the strategic view of how to handle detainees and theatre interrogation."

General Stone delivered an inspirational talk directed at our guests and honorees from law enforcement and fire safety community.

(The reception from our guests and honorees to our awards banquet, following General Stone's speech, was wholehearted appreciation.)

Past State President Wayne Griswold led the SAR Recessional. The Benediction was given by Gene Myers; and Past President Tommy Douglas led us in singing "God Bless America". The meeting was adjourned at 8:50 PM.




Freedom is not free!!

We have all heard the story of the fate of the signers of the Declaration of Independence. Here is the story of the fate of the men who raised "Old Glory" on Iwo Jima, on February 23, 1945. There are six men in the photo, four in the front line and two in the back line. Who are these men, and what happened to them?

Mike Strank was their Sergeant and leader. He was born in Czechoslovakia in 1919, and died on Iwo Jima in 1945.

Harlon Block was born in Texas in 1924, and died on Iwo Jima in 1945.

Franklin Sousley was born in Kentucky in 1925, and died on lwo Jima on March 21, 1945.



Rene Gagnon was born in Manchester, NH, March 7, 1925. He was the youngest survivor, and the man who carried the flag up Mt. Suribachi. Rene was the first survivor to arrive back in the US. He died in Manchester, NN, on Oct. 12, 1979.

John Bradley was born on July 10, 1923, in Antigo, WI. "Doc" Bradley was a Navy Corpsman who "just jumped in to lend a hand." He was wounded in both legs, and won the **Navy Cross** for his heroism. Bradley, a quiet, private man, gave just one interview in his life. In it he said, "People refer to us as heroes--I personally don't look at it that way. I just think that I happened to be at a certain place at a certain time and anybody on that island could have been in there--and we certainly weren't heroes--and I speak for the rest of them as well. That's the way they thought of themselves also." John Bradley died on January 11, 1994, in Antigo, WI.
