From the Mother Lode President



Motion to Adjourn was made by Sam Bradley and Seconded by Mike Muetz. The motion was approved.



Featured Speaker for October - Igor Birman

Born in the Soviet Union in 1981, Igor Birman has seen firsthand the misery that tyrannical government inflicts upon its people, and learned the precious nature of freedom by witnessing his parents' struggle under the communist regime. After a decade of Soviet refusals to issue an exit permit, Igor and his family arrived in California as refugees in 1994. By then a firm believer in the American dream, Igor proudly became a U.S. citizen in 2001. At the age of 16, Igor enrolled at UC Davis where he received a political science degree. At 24, Birman graduated as Doctor of Law from Emory University and then joined the California State Bar. In 2009, Representative Tom McClintock appointed Birman as his Chief of Staff, tasking him with managing operations of the Congressional office, serving as senior policy and strategy advisor, and making Birman the youngest Chief of Staff on Capitol Hill. Throughout his life in America, Igor has not stopped promoting the ideals of freedom. Birman's articles and opinion pieces have been published around the country and his guest commentary has appeared on talk radio and TV.

An avid skier and private pilot, Igor splits his time between Washington DC and Sacramento.

Mother Lode Chapter Ranks in Top Third of SAR Chapters Nationally!

Every year the National SAR Society runs "The President General's / Americanism Award" challenge. Chapters from across the Nation compete. A third of SAR's 562 Chapters fill out a monthly multi-page score sheet and send them into National for judging at the annual Congress. Statistically, up against the original colonies and southern States, California Chapters have little chance of winning with our shortage of Revolutionary War sites, cemeteries and monuments to visit. For years, no California Chapter has even bothered to enter – <u>until now</u>. Tom Adams, our fearless leader, heard the Chairman of the Americanism Committee remark at a National meeting: "Doing the activities itemized in this spreadsheet is what every SAR Chapter should be doing." Tom was curious to know what National thinks of what we are doing as a Chapter, so all last year he dutifully prepared the monthly multi-page score sheets describing what we, the Mother Lode members, do! The results were published in August after Congress, and the Mother Lode Chapter ranked 24th out of 75 Chapters our size (under 50 members). That is impressive! We did good!
