

Mother Lode Chapter Medallion: A Closer Look



The Mother Lode Chapter Winner's Medallion is a relatively unique award. We know of no other Chapter in the state that has created its own award. The most common Chapter Youth Contests awards (beside cash) are ribbons and certificates. We are hopeful that other Chapters will consider switching over to medallions. We would like to see the State adopt the neck ribbon medallion as an award for the State Poster Contest and the State Brochure Contest. Currently the State award is a high quality 18" Red-White-Blue Ribbon for the Poster and the Brochure Contests. (The State Oration Contest already awards medallions.)

Besides being appealing to the young winners, medallions are surprisingly less expensive than ribbons. What we have found is that young people immediately put the medallion on around their neck. A ribbon at best will end up on a bedroom wall. The medallion is like an Olympic medal. People want to wear it.

A special feature of the medallion is that they can be engraved. (Take a look at the picture) The temptation to shop around for a low bid on purchasing a volume number of medallions is appealing. But because we (Mother Lode) purchased our medallions through a local supplier (Arnold's for Awards in Shingle Springs) the cost for engraving is minimal.

The medallions are the same for every award. The difference in the award is indicated by the neck ribbon color.

In the Mother Lode Chapter we award 1st, 2nd, 3rd place for school (Blue, Red, White respectively); and 1st, 2nd, 3rd place for Chapter; (Gold, Green, Green/Gold strip respectively). We also award a 1st in

Class for a school with more than one classroom, (Red/White/Blue strip ribbon). And also an Honorable Mention ribbon on occasion to recognize a special entry (also the Red/White/Blue strip ribbon) such as from a local C.A.R. Society.



In the image shown we see a young person who won 1st in School, and also 1st in Chapter. When multiple awards are made, the ribbons are awarded in series of lesser to greater, so that, as in the case of the example shown, the greater Chapter Winner (Gold) award ribbon rests over the School Winner (Blue) award ribbon.
