Notes from the CASSAR Board of Managers Meeting, Seaside, CA November 2-3, 2012

The 137th CASSAR Board of Managers Meeting was held at the Embassy Suites Hotel in Seaside. Most attendees arrived on November 1st and many enjoyed the hospitality suite that was setup by the hosting Monterey County Chapter that evening. The meeting was attended by several National officers, including PG Stephen Leishman (DESAR), Secretary General Joseph Dooley (VASSAR), Treasurer General Lindsey Brock (FLSSAR), Registrar General J. Michael Tomme (GASSAR), Librarian General Michael Wells (ALSSAR), and VPG Western District Gene Butler (NVSSAR).

Friday the 2nd began with a calling to order by CASSAR President Keith Bigbee and Presentation of the Colors by members of the CASSAR Color Guard. Following the pledges to the Flag and the SAR, CASSAR Secretary Ronald Barker called the roll confirming that a quorum was present to conduct business. Introductions of distinguished guests and past CASSAR Presidents were followed by reports by the State Officers, National Officers, Committee and Program Reports, and finally the Chapter Reports.

The first session ended with the reports after which the membership and their guests attended a Public Service Luncheon where SAR Law Enforcement and Fire Safety Medals were given to members of the local community. Following the luncheon, the business session was resumed while the ladies went to the Monterey Fisherman's Wharf and the historic section of Monterey. The minutes of the 2012 Annual CASSAR Meeting were

approved, a proposal to create a CASSAR Life Membership for Dual Members who already have National Life Memberships was presented and approved, the continuing ever increasing cost of the California Compatriot was again brought up and a decision was made to print one last issue this year announcing that future issues would be delivered online and those compatriots that wanted to receive a hard copy in the mail could subscribe for a fee (\$10 per year was suggested). Once these issues were addressed and the cost of printing the last hard copy of the California Compatriot determined, the 2013 budget was presented and approved.

The final session of the BOM Meeting heard presentations by those present or their representatives who are running for General Officers for 2013 who are seeking the endorsement of the California Society. Following their presentations, the following candidates were endorsed: for President General, Joseph Dooley; for Secretary General, Lindsey Brock; for Treasurer General, Thomas Lawrence; for Chancellor General, John Dodd; for Genealogist General, Larry Cornwell; for Registrar General, J. Michael Tomme; for Historian General, Robert Bowen; for Librarian General, Michael Wells, for Chaplain General, Louis Carlson; and for the Foundation Board, Stephen Leishman and Randy Ellis.

The business session was followed by a luncheon in which compatriot Curtis Porter made an excellent presentation about the Continental Marines. Following the luncheon, the hospitality room reopened until the Banquet that evening where awards were then presented, with Tom Chilton receiving the State Distinguished Service Medal. With the retirement of the Colors, the 137th Board of Mangers Meeting ended.


Directions

NSSAR Recognizes Mother Lode Couple

At the CASSAR Fall Banquet, President Keith Bigbee, on behalf of the National Society, recognized Tom and Anne Adams of the Mother Lode Chapter. President Bigbee read a letter from NSSAR Executive Director Don Shaw recognizing the couple's financial gift toward the endowment of a National Middle School Brochure Contest. President Bigbee then presented Tom with a framed award from the NSSAR officers for his contribution in developing the Brochure Contest.

The award is signed by National Society President, Larry Magerkurth, and J. Michael Tomme, Sr., Americanism Chairman, and reads: "Certificate of Distinguished Service for his dedicated service to the National Society of the Sons of the American Revolution in the development of the Sgt Moses Adams Memorial Middle School Brochure Contest."

Tom explained afterwards that when he was appointed CASSAR Youth Activities Director by then President Lou Carlson, Lou gave him the

charge to come up with a middle school contest. Tom contacted local teachers in El Dorado County for ideas and was fortunate to meet Rolling Hills Middle School history teacher Kevin Tierney. One of the ideas Kevin had was the brochure contest. Kevin and Tom put together a proposal and submitted it to the CASSAR Executive Committee who liked it immediately. Wayne Griswold, then CASSAR Executive VP, took the California proposal back to Louisville and presented it to the Americanism Committee who very soon also adopted it as the National Middle School Contest program.

Tom began to attend meetings in Louisville and to work with Americanism Committee Chairman Mike Tomme on developing the concept into a working program. Tom became the Brochure Contest Chairman and has led the very successful pilot of the contest here in California – we are entering our third year. Mike Tomme attended the CASSAR Spring Meeting in April 2012 and observed the complete structured brochure judging process. He was very pleased. Tomme is optimistic, and believes that if contributions to the endowment continue as they have, and the financial markets hold, the Americanism Committee, who now manages the Elementary School Poster Contest, will be able to soon launch a National Middle School Brochure Contest.

It was during the time that Tom was working with Mike Tomme that he learned that National contests, unlike our State contests, are not funded from the general fund, but from the interest earned from endowments. Tom and Anne are strong believers in teaching our young people about their American Heritage. They approached the National Society with a sizable donation, and were granted the great privilege of naming the contest after the family's patriot, Sgt. Moses Adams of the 13 Massachusetts Regiment. Sgt Adams died at Valley Forge. As Tom describes it, "Sgt Moses Adams did not do anything historically significant – other than to give his life for his country." Tom and Anne see Moses' life and death as representative of the nearly 25,000 men who sacrificed their lives so that we can enjoy the promise of our great democratic republic.

Mother Lode Recognizes C.A.R. Brochure Contest Winner - Ciara Barrett

In the 2011-12 School Year the Sacramento Society of the C.A.R. gave the CASSAR <u>five</u> Brochure Entries. It is very unlikely this will ever occur again! ... (See Dispatch February 2012 issue).

Two of those 8th graders, Kaity Malinovsky and Mason Hall, entered the contest through their participating school, Holy Trinity Elementary; the customary means of entering a SAR Contest – through the child's school.

Two other 8th graders (Leslie Young and Hannah Bailey) got the idea and instructions for creating a brochure from CASSAR by attending a C.A.R. meeting.

Leslie attended 8th grade at Country Day School in Sacramento, so she was able to enter the CASSAR contest through the Sacramento SAR Chapter and her school.

Hannah attended 8th grade at St. Rose in Roseville, so she was able to enter the CASSAR contest through the Gold Country SAR Chapter and her school.

That left 8th grader, Ciara Barrett who attended 8th grade at Markham Middle School in Placerville. The Mother Lode Chapter was unable to arrange for Ciara to submit her brochure through her school, unlike the other C.A.R. members had. The inability to accomplish this was the fault of the Mother Lode Chapter – not the school. Our folks were just too screeched to work out the arrangements. However, all was not

lost. Ciara was able to enter the SAR Brochure Contest through the C.A.R. One-Room Schoolhouse option pioneered by a C.A.R. member (Marissa Mancebo) the year before. The option simply states that if child can not enter the contest through their school, they can enter the contest through their C.A.R. Society.

So finally, at the recent Sacramento Society C.A.R. Meeting in Placerville, Ciara received her best in class Medallion from Mother Lode Youth Activities Chairman Tom Adams. Ciara is presently a freshman at El Dorado High School. She is the daughter of Jeannette Barrett.

CAAH's booklet "The American Flag: History and Etiquette" Finds Wide Audience

Members of the Sacramento Society C.A.R. in Placerville, California, received a thorough and impressive presentation on the proper care of the American flag by the Color Guard of the Civilian Air Parole Cadet Squadron 85, also based out of Placerville. (The squadron is over 80 members strong.)

The presentation began with a slide projection on the history and tradition of the flag, which included a lively Q & A session to engage the fifteen attending young people.

Source for the presentation was: "The American Flag: History and Etiquette" – a 22 page booklet published by the SAR's The Center for Advancing America's Heritage (CAAH).



Each C.A.R. member received a copy of the CAAH booklet. The booklets were acquired from CAAH Director, Colleen Wilson, by the local Mother Lode SAR Chapter and provided to the Civilian Air Parole Cadets. (The publication of the booklet was originally funded by a grant from the George Washington Endowment Fund).



The young attendees then had a close up view of how to properly fold, how to present and how to carry the flag. Throughout the presentation, the cadets made reference to the CAAH booklet, such as: "The proper folding of the flag is shown on page 17 of your booklet."

At the conclusion of the presentation, at the request of Sacramento Society C.A.R. Senior President Jeannette Barrett, four members of the C.A.R. Society were selected for one-on-one instruction on the proper procedure for "Posting the Colors" by the Cadets' Color Guard. Mrs. Barrett explained that the C.A.R. Society may be invited to provide this service at local functions.




