J Stephen Hurst is currently the CASSAR Executive Vice-President. He is a native of Florida (where his father was stationed), and spent his childhood in Norfolk, VA, and Pensacola, FL. He graduated from California State University at San Diego with a B. S. Degree in Chemistry, and later from the University of Missouri with a MBA. Steve served as a Captain in the U. S. Air Force where he was munitions officer, missile launch officer, and an equal opportunity officer, serving in Okinawa, two tours in Thailand, North Dakota, Missouri, and Vandenberg AFB. He is retired after spending more than thirty years as a financial advisor at a major investment firm.

Steve joined the General George Patton Chapter, SAR, in 2002, and served as its President for several years. He is a CASSAR Life member, and served as the CASSAR Registrar in 2006. He has received the SAR Meritorious Medal, Silver Good Citizenship Award, Outstanding Citizenship Award, and the Bronze Color Guard Award.

Steve is a member of the NRA, American Sailing

Associate, Bareboat Charter Diplomat, the Roseleaf Ragtime Club, life member of the Society for Sedimentary Geology Pacific section, and a subscriber to the New West Symphony Church.

In addition to the SAR, Steve belongs several other lineage societies, including the California Society of the War of 1812 (Past Secretary), Order of the First Family of Maryland (Past Governor General), Society of Colonial Wars, and Life Member Society of Indiana Pioneers.

Steve had three children, stepdaughter Stephanie, foster son Thuan Huynh, and deceased son Eric, who was a recipient of Carnegie Hero Award. Eric lost his life in 2002 while trying to save the life of another boy on a canoeing expedition in Minnesota. Grandson Nathan Huynh is a Youth Registrant of the SAR.


Directions

Cattlemens has a well-lighted lot that accommodates 95 automobiles and is handicap accessible.



Minutes of the Meeting held on September 25, 2012

Tom Chilton introduced the guest speaker, Chris Kinney. Chris is a Project Engineer for the Bureau of Reclamation's Office at Folsom, and oversees the modifications and upgrades to the Folsom Dam and the Mormon Island dike. Sacramento is said to be the largest metropolitan city in the United States to be so close to a large reservoir, and would sustain catastrophic damage in case the dam or dike were to fail. He gave a very interesting explanation and slide presentation of the various changes and modifications that are being made. Work was started in 2007, and is expected to be completed by 2017. President Bob Conover presented Chris with the SAR Certificate of Appreciation for his presentation.

Chaplain Gene Myer gave the Benediction, and Sam Bradley led the SAR Recessional. After the singing of "God Bless America", President Conover adjourned the meeting.
