In his autobiography, Bruce Springsteen takes us back to when he was seven years old and he watched the controversial rock star Elvis Presley's appearance on The Ed Sullivan Show: "I sat there transfixed in front of the television set, my mind on fire. I had the same two arms, two legs, two eyes; I looked hideous but I'd figure that part out.... So what was missing? THE GUITAR! The next day I convinced my mom to take me to Diehl's Music on South Street in Freehold. There, with no money to spend, we rented a guitar."

Our job as parents is not to mold our children into our successors or into superstars. It's to help them be what they are meant to become.
