

The following is an excerpt from the book "Making Time for God: Daily Devotions for Children and Families to Share"

"You have heard that it was said, 'Love your neighbor. Hate your enemy.' But here is what I tell you. Love your enemies. Pray for those who hurt you. Then you will be children of your Father who is in heaven. He causes his sun to shine on evil people and good people. He sends rain on those who do right and those who don't...So be perfect, just as your Father in heaven is perfect." Matthew 5:45-45, 48

"No one is perfect." Maybe you've heard people say that before. And yet, Jesus told his followers to "be perfect," just like God in heaven. God gives sunlight and rain—the means of life—even to those who do wrong. God loves everyone, even those who are different from us, or who hurt us. God's love is too great for us to understand.



But it is one of the things that makes God perfect.

You might think it seems just too hard to *love* your enemies,. But you could *pray* for them, couldn't you? That is what Ruby Bridges did. Ruby was the first African-American child to go to an elementary school in New Orleans, Louisiana, where only white children had gone before. Many white grown-ups did not want her to go there. They stood outside and shouted angry words at her when she walked into the school each morning. But instead of shouting back, Ruby prayed for those people.

We can pray for those who are mean to us, and we can also pray for ourselves. We can ask God to make the love in our hearts to grow. Then we too can love one another with "perfect" love.

Prayer: God, your love is so amazing! All people are your children, and you love each one. Let me feel your perfect love, and teach me to love others as you do. Amen.


