The Shop Class experience is built on emotion. Our workshop is designed to help our learners feel safe and inspired to create. We cheer for students and coach them safely through skill-building workshops. We inspire confidence in young people as we provide them opportunities to succeed. Our programs encourage playtime and focus on storytelling, positive coaching, creative expression, and curiosity to drive learner engagement. A team of neurodivergent coaches proudly operates Shop Class programs and camps.

Shop Class Student Clubs



Builder's Club

The 4-week Builders Club explores wood, tools, joinery, and finishing work. Learners pick from 3 creative projects that will help guide them through lessons about pride in craft, safety, and sustainability. The Builder's Club meets in the workshop once a week for a 2-hour session.



Climate Care Club

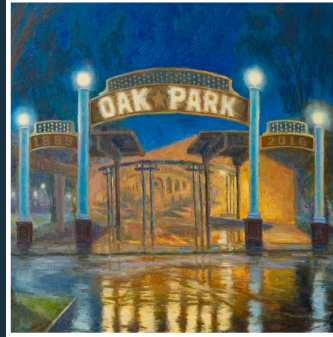
Climate Care Club offers learners a 4-week journey into urban agriculture, sustainable living, and climate resilience. Learners build tiny greenhouses, solar projects, and learn about urban agriculture and growing food. Climate Care Club meets once a week for a 2-hour session in our outdoor garden classroom



Inventor's Club

The Inventor's club is a 4-week exploration of 3D printing, laser engraving, soldering, and electronics. Topics include: design, prototyping, and entrepreneurship. This club offers projects of varying levels of difficulty to ensure learners are challenged and engaged with the build. The Inventors' Club meets in our tiny makerspace once a week for a 2-hour session.

Drama Club & After School Arts Club



After School Arts & Crafting Club

The after-school Arts and Crafting Club is a safe place for self-expression and exploring new forms of art and creativity, individually or in small groups.

Members can choose coach-led activities, team projects, or personal project time. Our inspirational workshop is filled with music instruments, tools, high-tech equipment, and all the supplies needed to create any kind of masterpiece.

This program is offered Tue through Fri, 3-5p

Drama Club

Theater and stagecraft are important components of our learning center. Our stage will host short plays written and directed by our learners. This is a 2-month club for ages 11-17 and meets twice a week for 2 hours. Learners will create, direct, and build the sets for this tiny production.

Club members will learn team building, public speaking, and marketing as they express themselves in the performing arts.

The Shop Class **Big Ideas** Camp is an exciting weeklong, fun-filled learning experience created for young inventors, artists, and entrepreneurs.

Days are packed with creative projects and play. We honor neurodiverse learners' individual learning styles and work to provide a place where everyone has a chance to thrive. We celebrate curiosity and innovation as we share inspirational stories about motivation, resilience, and creative courage.

The Shop Class Big Idea Camp is an immersive way to experience the path from initial scribble to product launch. Campers walk through the steps to start a business, then design, prototype, manufacture, and market real products. Give your future entrepreneur the confidence to build their big idea.

A fast-paced, condensed version of this class is available on the last weekend of non-summer months.

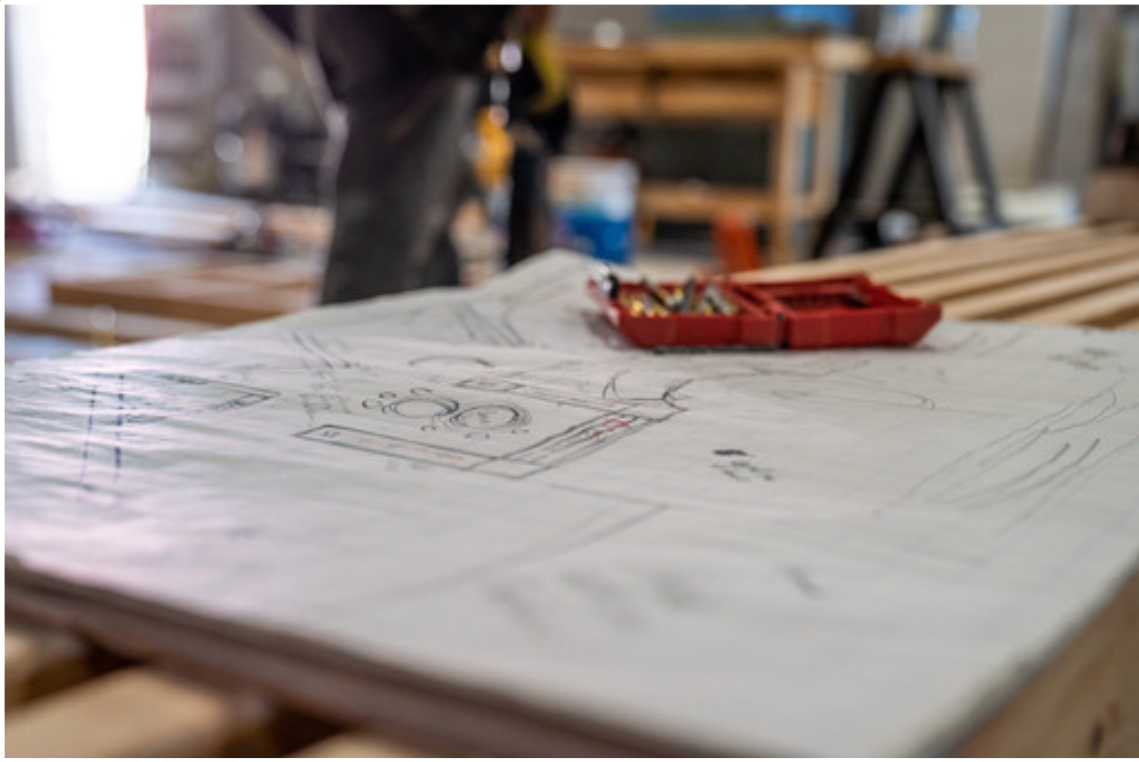
Tiny Home Academy at Shop Class

The **Tiny Home Academy** is a 6-week workforce development experience for 17 to 24-year-olds experiencing food, housing, or opportunity insecurity. Students learn the basics of carpentry while exploring technology, urban agriculture, community service, and climate resilience. The program uses an inspirational environment, emotional components, and experiential learning to drive retention and understanding. Building meaningful projects helps students find purpose while learning.

The class for 2025 offers graduates new opportunities for expanded learning, pathways to entrepreneurship, apprenticeships, employment, and educational opportunities. Through a strategic partnership with Outreach Construction and Hire Hope Learning, all Tiny Home Academy students will receive the first CORE module of the NCCER Basic Construction Skills training course. This allows learners preparing for a career in carpentry or building to accrue academic and hands-on work hours toward their union career goals.

Community Shop Class (Shop Class Inc 501c3) is a neighborhood learning center and workforce development facility that fosters community resilience, youth empowerment, and neighborhood learning. The neuro-inclusive education framework delivers classes, learning programs, youth camps, and neighborhood events that inspire collaboration, volunteerism, and sustainable living. All programs are built and delivered by a neurodiverse coalition of coaches, educators, industry professionals, and community advocates.

Shop Class champions its mission to revolutionize equitable access to education and housing in Oak Park (an SB 535 Disadvantaged Community and a Climate Investment Priority Population). Years of strategic partnerships with Hire Hope Education, Outreach Construction, Sierra Service Project, Sacramento Sustainability Academy, SABA, The City of Sacramento, and CADClass.org, have yielded impactful training and coaching initiatives that propelled transformative change in Oak Park, Sacramento.
