We have received a Thank You card from Dave Bailey of the Peel Scale Modelers for involvement with Torcan 2023 on May 27th. See June newsletter for contest report from Ken.

Millenium Games has moved to the Tops Plaza on Jefferson Road. Space is much larger and includes Gundam model kits as well as more figures and paints. Doug Farukhi reported they had very good prices.

Noreastcon: Looking for event locations has not been fruitful. Either the locations are too small or too costly. Going back to Batavia is about \$3500 with \$1,500 more for tables and no onsite food. The Airport Marriot Ballroom is 3300 sq.ft. for \$5000 and has not replied to inquiries. We have not called the Doubletree which has 5000 sq.ft. with the pool in the middle of the restaurant making a dinner and awards ceremony awkward. 
The Pershing represents a Marine tank from the Frozen Chosin battle of Korea. He has had four tries on the tracks as the original ones were horrible. Two aftermarket metal sets and finally settled on a set from China that was too narrow for the drive wheel. He had to section the drive wheel to make it narrower.

The M16 Halftrack with quad mounted 50 caliber machine guns. The stowage and chain were extra items. Cliff likes halftracks because they can be loaded with stowage. This model had already been built by someone else and Cliff had to clean it up and replace items, so it now has a Tamiya chassis and Dragon body. He procured items from a woman who sells body and trees for modeling. A book on halftracks that Cliff got from Grant who originally got it from Phil Pucher was very helpful in rebuilding the halftrack.



Ken Brent



The USS Monitor from Verlinden in 1/200th scale. Ken used books for details as the instructions were very light with information. The ship is resin and metal. It took a lot of sanding to get the hull flat for a waterline display. The board for the display is from IKEA and originally was a cutting board which had a great shape to marry with this kit.

Ken painted with automtive dark gray primer that he buffed with nose oil. He followed that with dry brush rust, and paints from Citadel for the turret. The turret was set up to represent wooden planks inside on the walls which is not accurate so Ken corrected to overlapping steel plates. The parts were on very robust trees so required work to separate and clean up. The turret cover is actually a tent set above the turret on post. Ken replaced the plastic post with wire in accurate positions. The top had Vallejo paint followed by a Tamiya brow wash and then ship black wash to bring out details. The red water line was added before the ship was installed in the water.




Phil had a trio of tanks from his completed shelf. First is a Panzer IV L/70 Sd.Kfz. 162 Jagdpanzer.

The final tank is an SU-122 self propelled howitzer with a 122 mm shell. To appreciate the prototype howitzer one needs to see a photo of the gun elevated to 26°.

Phil is working on a cutaway model of a Regelbau H677 gun casemate armed with the 8.8cm PaK 43/41 towed anti-tank gun from Normandy that fired along the beach. Phil drew up plans using drawings/illustrations and the finished 88 model. He will be using foam to construct the casemate which required a heated foam knife to cut the foam. The casemate has 2 meters of concrete. The casemate was captured by an assault from the rear.



Marty Snow



Warning, a Lindberg Kit. Marty picked up two of these Alien kits at a show for \$10 [current Amazon price is \$10 for one – yep, thinking of buying one]. To correct the body to what Marty wanted took an 8 piece kit and made it 30 pieces. It would be great to see a photo sequence to show what all had to be changed. Marty wanted this alien to match the description from Betty Andreasson's drawings of the aliens she reported abducted her. Marty had to putty the head to reshape it. Adjust and shorten the arms. Redo the hands to make them more life like [kit hands are bland]. He used oils for paints which was a first time for a figure. The eyes were the hardest part, but a Vallejo gloss coat made it work.



Jerry Rinaldi



This is the 2nd edition of the Bride of Frankenstein as Jerry built the first one 12-15 years ago and gave it to a club member's granddaughter who liked the model. This time around Jerry upgraded the paint using rattle can, airbrush, and dry brushing as well as adding pastels.


Jerry has started building Gundam kits starting with 30 minute missions. The Gundam, on the left, is 30MM eEXM-S01U Forestieri 01. Bumble Bee on the right is a Transformer, of course, from Trumpeter and follows the same idea as the Bandai Gundams such that both can be built without additional paint and no glue required. Jerry likes the relaxing approach where he does not have to design a paint scheme and get it on the model. He does find it difficult at times to attach the parts as they are designed for tight fit.



John Trippe



This Lockheed Vega is from Esci/Ertl for the Wiley Post around the world event. Per John it is a simple kit until John decided to make his like Amelia Earhart's. To do that John had to build the interior and cover the windows, with putty, as well as make seatbelts. He likes to build post biplane/pre-WWI aircraft in simple kits and amp them up. He used rattle can Italian Red and discovered there are lots of reds. Gold striping was done by John, and he painted the decal sheet with enamel paints. There was lots of polishing since this is a glossy aircraft. To make finishing easier, John put magnets on the wings and fuselage so it could be disassembled as needed. The final coat was Testors Clear. Joh encourages bashing, or Gunpla for those building Gundams, to make the subject you want.

Chris brought in kits that are in work. The P51B is from KP Models from Ukrane. It is finely molded. Chris is building out of the box.

This kit is a Monte Carlo Super Stocker from Round 2/MPC. It is similar to cars from the 1970's that ran at Spencer Speedway. Interestingly the exhaust pipes go up and aroudn the top and out the side rather than underneath. It is a nice kit.

Ken has both historical and mythical figures. The first is historical and of Saladin Sultan of Egypt. This is a $1/16^{th}$ bust from FER. Ken painted it with acrylics. It is a one piece bust except for the nose pice on the helmet.

Next up are the mythical. First we have Odin, Ruler of Asgard in Norse Mythology followed by a Valkyrie. The bust is from NutsPlanet in 1/10th scale. Ken worked on flesh tones for this bust. He also used non-metallic metal painting techniques with is a new things in figures to control shadows using whites. Non-metallic metal painting is exactly what it sounds like in using paints without metal pieces to simulate metal surfaces. For example grays used to simulate silver.

"The Choice", a Valkyrie. The bust is from a new company Scale 75 and is a 75mm figure. It came in 2 pieces. Generally Ken breaks figures apart to paint but he followed a YouTube video showing finishing as one piece so he gluded it together to try it out. Bad choice. Fortunately the back wing came off which gave him access to paint the figure.
