#### **Ken Brent**



Here we have Ken's build night clean ups. First is the 1/72<sup>nd</sup> MPC/Airfix Electric Lightning. Ken used this model for his artist pen demo in February 2023. Ken made the Remove Before Flight caps for the missiles from clear dowel. The kit itself had poor fit and the decals all fell apart even when Ken prepared them for use. Also, the old decals will change color over the years [well I am in trouble since 75% of my stash is old]. The aircraft is silver underneath using Tamiya Silver.



Next, we have Ken's 1/72<sup>nd</sup> MPC/Airfix MiG-23 Flogger. This is giving Ken a flogging with all the sanding and filling he is doing. It has a Tamiya silver base right now which reveals fit/finish issues.





#### **Ken Brent**



Here we have the 1/72<sup>nd</sup> Revell MiG-31 Foxhound, which is both the replacement for theMiG-25 Foxbat and similar in design. This is not a bad kit but does have gaps that need to be filled. The undercarriage is unique being large and wheels in opposing places on each main gear. Artist pens are good around the edge of the wheel rim. Silver Paint on the gear is Tamiya Aluminum.



Roger Rouse



Roger's theme is Spitfires. First up is the 1/48<sup>th</sup> kit from Tamiya. It is in a North African version using a deep Mediterranean blue color underneath. The pilot appears oversized and sitting too high in the cockpit. Paints are Vallejo.



Next, we have the 1/32<sup>nd</sup> Revell Spitfire Mk V. Had a lot of sanding on the seams.



# Tom Darcangelo



Tom went for something out of his genre with this Pegasus model of Kathoga from the Relic barging into a museum. It consisted of six parts. Tom added rocks to replace the fake rocks as well as torches. He replaced the plastic hair with deer tail hair. He weathered with multiple colors using new paints from Millenium Games. The extra work added challenge to what initially looked like a simpler model.






# Tom Darcangelo


# **Phil Pucher**

The figures are metal so super glue is used to assemble. Jerry primes and then uses acrylic paints. Oils are used for shadows and shading. The bases are separate and did not come with the figures.
