


The figure poses are based on a classic picture from <u>SIGNAL!</u> Magazine, photographed during street fighting early in the war.

Painting guides are included on the back of the box. The uniforms are a bit on the green side; the color on should be field grey.

The gun can also be mounted on Tamiya's Hanomag Kit.

Accessories include open and closed ammo boxes, 3.7cm spent and ready rounds, and full indiviual equipment for the soldiers. Also included, but not modeled here, is the 3.7 cm Stielgranat 41 upgraded hollow charge ammunition. This takes the form of a replacement part for the end of the barrel.



This one is built almost straight out of the box, except for the groundwork and base. I recycled an old trophy plaque for the base. Groundwork is real rocks and dirt set into Durham's Rock Hard Water Putty before it sets up. Various shades of green tan and brown were splotched around. The whole thing was oversprayed with a faint dusty color. Somewhere along the line, the gun captain came off the base and got separated from his comrades.
