- A wave of **FIRST-TIME** and **YOUNGER PARTICIPANTS**

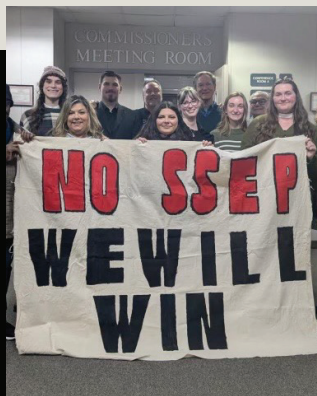


5 Resolutions Against SSEP in 6 Months

Local governments adopted resolutions on the proposed SSEP. Some opposed the project, while others called for stronger regulatory review because of significant concerns.

Davidson County specifically shifted its position after previously supporting the project.
