Join this informational, coaching, and intervention group to support you in supporting your child with autism.

◆ What Does the Program Entail?

- My mission is to empower parents of toddlers who may have autism by providing **autism education, parent intervention strategies, and a social support network.**
- Participation in 1 weekly one-on-one coaching session and 1 weekly optional group meetup.
- Group meetings will be caregiver & child style interactive, strategy-focused play dates and/or caregiver-only information, intervention, and social support sessions (based on participant needs and group feedback)
- Individual coaching will provide specific parent-implemented strategies to support your child's communication and engagement
- Location of meetings will vary but may include local libraries, Hope Center for Autism, local playground, or your home (individual sessions only).
- Your feedback during the program is an important part of making sure this program meets the needs of families of toddlers with autism
- Free of charge

◆ Eligibility

Participants should:

- have a child between 18-48 months old who was recently diagnosed with autism or suspected of having autism
- live in Martin County or be willing to drive to a location in Martin County for meet-ups
- be willing to complete pre and post data collection tools which include: Autism screening tool, interviews, and surveys
