Have you ever realized that the "Spirit of Quit" always attacks your mind when things didn't go the way you'd planned or hoped for?

Well, I've personally discovered the way for "quitters" to turn things around and begin to start again and even prosper, where you've once came up empty handed, felt exhausted, discouraged, depressed or even a failure.

Often our greatest learning opportunities will emerge out of our mistakes, short-comings, defeats and failures. But only if you are willing to take control of your emotions and realize that where you are is not your final disappointment or your fatal breath of air.

One of the greatest passages of scripture that can be used to help you regain motivation, change your focus, readjust your energy and reposition yourself is found in Luke 5: 4-7 NASB:

"When He (Jesus) had finished speaking, He said to Simon, "Put out into the deep water and let down your nets for a catch." Simon answered and said, "Master, we worked hard all night and caught nothing, but

It's through listening to the directions from Christ, that the "Spirit of Quit" can be dealt with and overcome. It's here that you too will realize that "quitting is not your best option."

It's here that you too will learn that The Holy Spirit will often reveal and direct you to do something that either you've never done before or something that may even seem foolish to natural minds. But obedience is your single key towards overcoming a nervous breakdown and receiving your spiritual breakthrough or blessings from God.

The Broken Road to Christ

As a child my earliest memory of being tormented by the enemy was at age four. Demons would literally manifest themselves in my house to terrorize me. And of course it worked! I was only four! As I got older it stopped. I don't remember it happening past that age.

I remember being bullied as early as age six years old. I was molested when I was five and throughout my childhood I would experience molestation at the hands of a few. When I was ten bullying increased and I would cry every night. My journey of low self-esteem, mental oppression and depression started when I was four.

My grandmother (my dad's mom) introduced me and my cousins to God when she would take us to church on Sunday. What is so funny is from one of my earliest memories (between the age of 4 and 6) was me crying because I could not go to church. When I was eleven, I was baptized but I had no understanding of Jesus and his salvation that was offered to me. I only went up to the baptism because I was told too go. I always knew God existed. I would always cry and beg Him to make me beautiful. I had many daydreams about the "ugly" melting off and that underneath I would be a beautiful little girl.

When I was 13 years old, I lost my virginity. I had no idea what I was doing and no awareness of how precious a gift I was giving away. This began my 15 year journey of promiscuity. In my teenage years, I became pregnant 3 times and out of IGNORANCE to what I was doing, I aborted my babies. It was not until my early 30s when I worked for a facility for women and children in crisis situations that I obtained post-abortion counseling. During that time, God taught me that abortion is not something you do, it's people you lose.

My wrong decisions resulted in not only damaging my body but my soul which was already damaged from childhood trauma and bloodline curses.

At the age of 20, I married a fellow classmate. He joined the military and for the first time I lived outside of my hometown. It was a troubled marriage from the start. We were both not mentally ready to be anybody's spouse. I can speak for myself when I say, I needed counseling, healing and deliverance. It was a very hard seven years (nine years on paper before the divorce).

At the beginning of my marriage, God gave me a dream. I had a dream that my ex-husband and I were running from tornadoes. In this dream, we ran from seven tornados and in between the tornados were two babies. One appearing first then disappearing and then another appearing. God was allowing me to see what that marriage would become.

Seven traumatic years with two miscarried children. My daughter was born in 1997 she lived for 2 1/2 hours and my son born in 1999 lived for 30 mins. I had the opportunity to hold my daughter while she was alive. My son was already dead when I held him. There are no words to express just how traumatic these events were for me. My ex-husband and I separated in November of 2000 and divorced in May 2004. After the divorce I started working at a crisis facility. This was emotionally rock bottom for me and all I could do was look up.

In December 2001, I got on my knees in the restroom at work and asked Jesus to be the Lord of my life. God heard my prayers.




After that I began to have a hunger for God. No-one had to tell me to read my bible it was just in me to study His word. I would close myself off in my little apartment and spend hours with the Lord studying His Word and Worshipping Him. I remember crying whenever I took communion because of how much love I would feel from my Father.

I have had many diverse and supernatural experiences in the Kingdom of God. I have experienced supernatural healings for myself and others. I have experienced and witnessed deliverances. I have had many personal encounters of His glory in worship and in intercession with revelation of His Word in my studies.

Fast forward two decades later since that encounter on the bathroom floor I have learned much from the Lord and about His love and His plans for me. As a child I was EXTREMELY creative. I always wanted to be in some facet of the entertainment industry. At the age of 19 (before getting married), I took a T.V. production class. Nope! I did not pass it because of my determination to marry kept me out of school.

In August 2021, I visited the Holy Spirit Broadcasting Network with my former church leader. I was not in the building long before making an impression on the co-founders of the network Apostles Andrew and Ann Marie Bills. We connected almost instantly and when I learned of their need for help, I asked them to pray about considering me.



One week later, I received a call from Pastor Ann Marie. The position was mine. The Bills hired me with no real experience, understanding or knowledge of what to do. They were only going by the leading of the Holy Spirit! I spent one week in training and the rest has been me and God and Pastor Richard Thomas.

My time with HSBN has been a journey and a half. There has been a lot of personal growth and development as well as professional. I am aware from our Father that this industry is in line with His will for me and my future with HSBN is in His hands. Father may I be a blessing to this network and to the many that will come.

I cook for myself and always have too much food left over that I get tired of eating so it goes bad and I have to throw it out. I come into a dark house unless I've remembered to leave a light on all day if I had to leave.

This past month's time held some special reminders that James wasn't here.

The car battery died so I had to maneuver through calling AAA, talking with the driver about whatever the problem was, taking the car to the dealership for a new battery which was a "special" battery because it had to be hooked up to the dealer's computer to sync all the bells and whistles. (Of course.) James would have handled that.

I had a health problem related to one of my medications. I had to run around to various pharmacies, make multiple calls to my doctor, and wait on hold with my insurance company to get things straightened out. This took several days while I was going without my medication. There was no one here to talk to or complain to about this, or to help me through the concern. James would have been here for that.

My heater was out while it had been really cold outside. It was also cold inside so I had to use electric space heaters, thus running up the electric bill. James would have been taking care of that.

I empty all the little trash cans in the house into the large, smelly trash cans in the yard. Then, every Sunday night, I take the nasty trash cans to the front curb, and every Monday afternoon, I pull those huge, rolling monstrosities back up the



driveway and into their space in the yard. For the past two weeks, it has been raining on Sunday.

James used to do that.

I'm keeping up with the bills. James did that.

I'm figuring out who will take me and pick me up from the airport when I travel. James was my personal Uber--and his service included a hug and a kiss at drop off and pick up. No extra charge!

There's no one special to call when I'm out of town in hotel rooms alone. There's no one special to say, "Did I tell you 'I love you today'?" There's no one special wondering why I didn't call when I'm later than usual getting home. There are no winks, loving looks, or hugs.

There are no kisses.

I'm tired of James being gone.


Of course, I know I have to be a realist in this real world of my new normal. I know all the things you could say to me:

Trusting in God's Deliverance: A Testimony of Faith By Apostle Bryant Robinson

Deliverance, in its truest form, embodies liberation, freedom, and rescue. Biblically, it signifies being regenerated, freed from the clutches of evil, and saved from a sinful state. Revelation 12:11 beautifully captures this essence, "And they overcame him by the blood of the Lamb, and by the word of their testimony.

As believers, we sometimes misinterpret certain conditions, particularly medical ones, as solely physical ailments. However, we must recognize that our deliverance extends beyond mere physical healing. Through the grace of the Holy Spirit, the teachings of Jesus Christ, and the wisdom found in the Word of God, we find our ultimate Deliverer.

I feel compelled to share my personal journey of the battle I've faced for years with a medical condition known as atrial fibrillation (AF) or AFIB. This irregular heartbeat disorder can lead to severe complications, including strokes, and has often left me struggling for breath and facing life-threatening situations. My initial encounter with AFIB led to an emergency situation, landing me in the ICU. Despite medical interventions such as cardioversion, my heart remained out of rhythm. It wasn't until prayer intervened that my heart returned to sinus rhythm. However, this was not the end of my ordeal.

Over the years, I faced recurring episodes, each time relying on prayer for deliverance. The most recent incident, amid the COVID-19 pandemic, left me isolated in the hospital, unable to receive visitors. Yet again, prayer became my lifeline leading to the restoration of my heart's rhythm. However, medical professionals now suggest further interventions such as ablation, a procedure involving the burning or freezing of nerve endings in the heart's chambers. While the success rate of such procedures may seem promising, I've come to realize that true deliverance

lies not in percentages but in unwavering faith. Just as Jesus questioned the blind men in Matthew 9:28-31, "Do you believe that I am able to do this?" I am faced with a similar question. Do I trust in God's ability to deliver me completely? Despite scheduling ablation procedures multiple times, I've postponed them, realizing that my faith in God's deliverance surpasses any earthly prognosis.

Like the man at the pool of Bethesda, Jesus doesn't just want to heal my physical ailment but desires to relieve me from the stress that triggers it. With God, all things are possible. Whether deliverance comes instantly, gradually, or through stages, my faith remains steadfast. I choose to trust in God's deliverance, not bound by statistics but anchored in belief. For me, deliverance isn't just about healing the body but finding peace and wholeness in the arms of my Savior.

So this idea of trust comes into question as I reflect on it. Why is it difficult to trust in God or is it? In pondering this question one has to reflect first on defining our perception of trust. Unfortunately, often times we define trust from experiences and situations where we have been betrayed. We associate that experience of betrayal as a breach of trust.

So, it becomes our foundation of understanding of trust. And since most can make some type of connection, it seemingly becomes the norm



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throughout society even when we subconsciously expect a bridge of trust at some point with someone or something in our day-to-day lives.

The traditional excepted definition of trust is that which is reliable or that which is believed to be reliable. Reliability seems to be the common denominator, so why is it challenging to trust in God? Clearly, the Bible provides multiple scriptures on trust. For example, Proverbs 3:5 "Trust in the Lord with all my heart, and lean not on your own understanding. In all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight" which indicates that we can and should rely on the Lord even when we fail to understand.

In addition, Psalm 62:8 "Trust in him at all times, you people, Pour out your heart before Him; God is a refuge for us." Therefore, we can rely on God and his promises, and that means all of them. It's true that mankind has the propensity to not be 100% reliable at all times but God is sovereign. He is our refuge and will never leave us or forsake us as referenced in Deuteronomy 31:6 "be strong, and of good courage, fear, not, nor be afraid of them; for the Lord thy God, he goes with you, he will never leave you, nor for sake you". I can apply these lessons of trust to my personal circumstances.



We as people tend to want to test God's reliability rather than believe it, unless we see a miracle. The truth is, we can rely on his words simply because he is sovereign. Nonetheless, we still see miracles and when any other adversity arises, we still struggle to believe although under Greece, it has been demonstrated that he is reliable.

The **T** in trust means sometimes we have a tendency to want to test God it is word.

The **R** in trust means, are resilience in our belief to rely on his word.

The **U** in trust means that our understanding is tied to a degree of belief even when we don't understand we can yet rely on his word.

The **S** in trust means we can submit to our faith and believe and be secure in his word.

The **T** in trust means that we may be tempted to doubt, but in time, if we truly reflect and check our perspective, we see that we can truly rely on his word.

So again, I reiterate, my deliverance from any adversity lies within my trust and faith in God.

First, I was told by the Holy Spirit to focus on Him, not the wisdom of man. It took me awhile to discern what was being said. "Be still and know that I am God; I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth." (Psalms 46:10 NIV) As I kept seeking answers, the Holy Spirit began to remind me of my assignment. I need you to listen to me first before everyone else. I thought listening to your pastor and everyone else that exercises authority over you was obedience. Does this scenario apply to anyone else? I understand spiritual authority. When David penned this verse, the nugget reinforces listening and understanding. As a child listening to their parent, we are protected by the placement of their hand on our shoulder.

We are calmed by them kneeling to our level.

Then, we are comforted by the words of
encouragement and love. This example may need
to include discipline also. This was my
"spiritual aha" moment.

Has anyone felt this way when trying to discover what God wants them to do to fulfill their purpose in the kingdom? This is one of many methods of communication that the Holy Spirit would have for us. This method was exemplified by Dr. Andrew and Ann Marie Bills.

With all the doubters in my ear and the fear that had taken over my body I had already delayed my move two years.

In January of 2023 I started packing my car with the necessary things that I needed and with the mindset that I will be taken care of by God himself. I had no other plan: no job, no home, only God. As I arrived in Arizona, God showed up and showed out very quickly and showed me that my purpose was here and that he would take care of me and allow me the opportunity of walking with his people while I am here on my assignment.

I am truly grateful for the opportunity to be a part of the Holy Spirit Broadcasting Network (HSBN) and being able to share and spread the love of God freely. HSBN is more than a job, an experience to say the least. Join me on this journey of faith, family and experiences on a God ordained assignment.

This journey of faith played a big role in my decision making. As I stated before, it had been a two year delay because of my fears. How could a single mother move to another state without family (specifically my mother) to help navigate my life? All I knew was God and I had talked about a plan and that plan was in Arizona. This plan included growing in love with God, myself and my son. It also included changing my son and my eating habits, fasting, praying, and worshiping God's mighty name on a day-to-day basis.

Let's not forget homeschooling and creating a thriving environment where my son is learning and growing while receiving an understanding of the word of God. I knew it would not be easy. So, I packed up my things in my car and I left and three days later I finally made it to Arizona. I prayed, "Okay, God, I am here like you asked me to be. Now, where do you want me?" His answer was clear "around believers."

I'm not going to act like this was easy for me to accept because I asked with a soft irritation in my spirit, "Where do I find these believers?" God had not answered this question, so I decided to head to IHop restaurant and there I met HSBN's Mesa Campus Production Manager, La'Reca Daniels. At the time, I did not know this but from that day until today, our relationship has given me the inside scoop on what a God ordained connection is. The perfection in the imperfection of our connection is how God places himself in the center of it all. Where we fall short God's word keeps everything connected and in flow. When she asked me to join her as a Production Assistant at HSBN I was more than thrilled! It made sense that God would send me to Arizona and wrap me around Him and his people. In October 2023, God reminded me of why I came to Arizona. I was here to grow in love with God, myself and my son. For eight months it did not seem like that was happening. I made the huge decision to quit my job while reminding myself, "If I don't have it go get it. God's got me." At the same time, La'Reca needed assistance at HSBN and had asked before if I could help but with work and being in need of funds for bills, I just did not have the time. This time, I had more than enough time and God said he had me. As I joined her crew I learned the technical side of things which is so cool by the way.

I met even more of God's people. I listened to God's word daily at HSBN whether it was music created by the speakers or the broadcasting show itself and I met the owners Apostles Andrew and Ann Marie Bills. Apostle Andrew and Ann Marie welcomed me with open arms. He expressed his love and adoration for God's word and that God put it on his heart to have his own network.
