



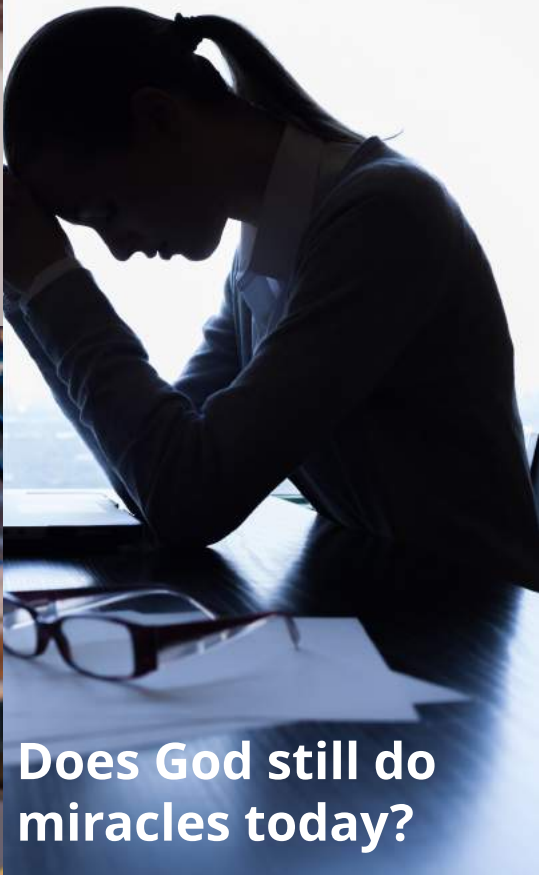

Can Prayer

Really Make *The Difference*?

Based on the authority of God's Word, we know God answers prayer. Sometimes prayers are answered quickly, even while we are yet praying and other times we must persevere in prayer. Isaiah 65:24, Luke 18:1. His Word tells us to pray and faint not, to keep asking, keep seeking and keep knocking. Matthew 7:7 & 8

Recently during one of my miracle services, a woman was healed of sciatica pain which she had struggled with for many years. As another woman was walking by she saw the power of God at work and said, "I'm next, Lord. Do it again." I overheard her declaration and went over to pray for her. As I prayed for her, her leg grew out and all her sciatica pain left. The medical condition which severely restricted her movement for two years was completely gone! She was overwhelmed with joy and walked back and forth across the sanctuary giving God all the glory for this miracle that she had just experienced.

As soon as she left the building and the atmosphere of glory, her healing was challenged as the pain began to return. She did not give in to the doubt. But armed with faith in Jesus Christ our Healer, and the understanding of the authority of the Word of God, she reminded the devil that he is a liar and he is under her feet.

She continued standing on the truth declaring it out loud. God's Word is truth and never fails. The next day she shared her testimony at a small group meeting and all the pain left again! Revelation 12:11 says, "...We overcome the devil by the blood of the Lamb and the word of our testimony."

Prayer works because when we pray we are bringing the kingdom of heaven down to earth. Whatever is being done in heaven will be done on earth. Jesus instructed His disciples in Matthew 6:9-13, "...This is how you should pray, "Your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as it is in heaven..."

When we pray, we need to stand on His Word. Ephesians 6:10-13 says "Finally, be strong in the Lord and in His mighty power. According to the eternal Word of God, "The effective fervent prayer of a righteous man avails much. And he prayed again, and the heaven gave rain, and the earth produced its fruit". James 5:16-18

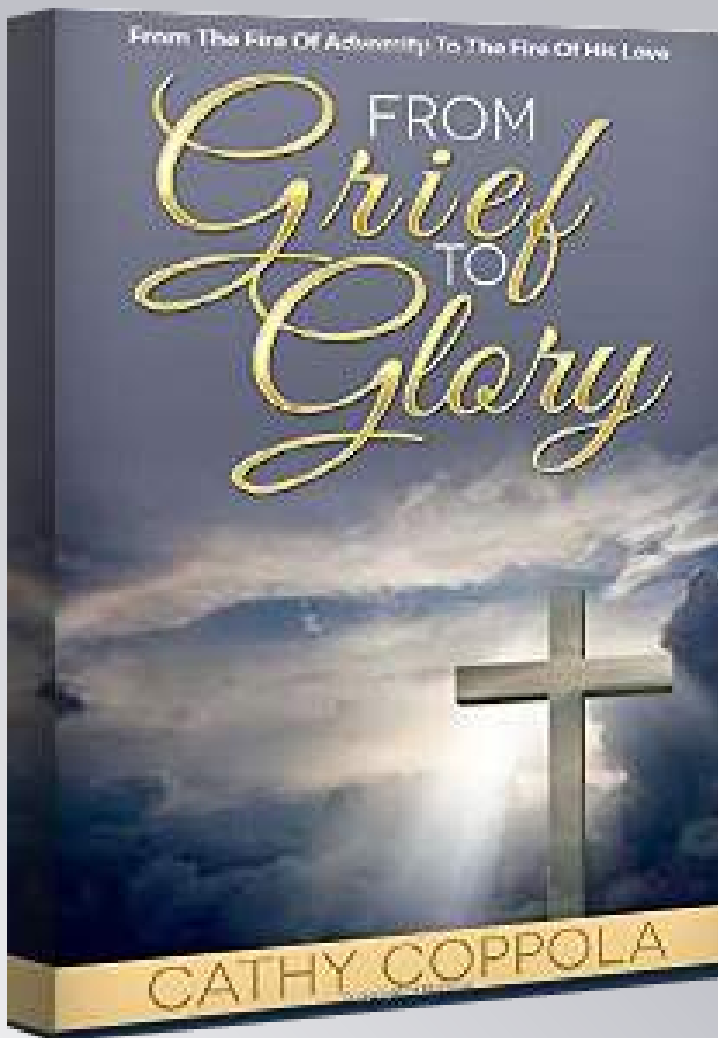
Prayer works; it makes a difference and yes, it changes everything.

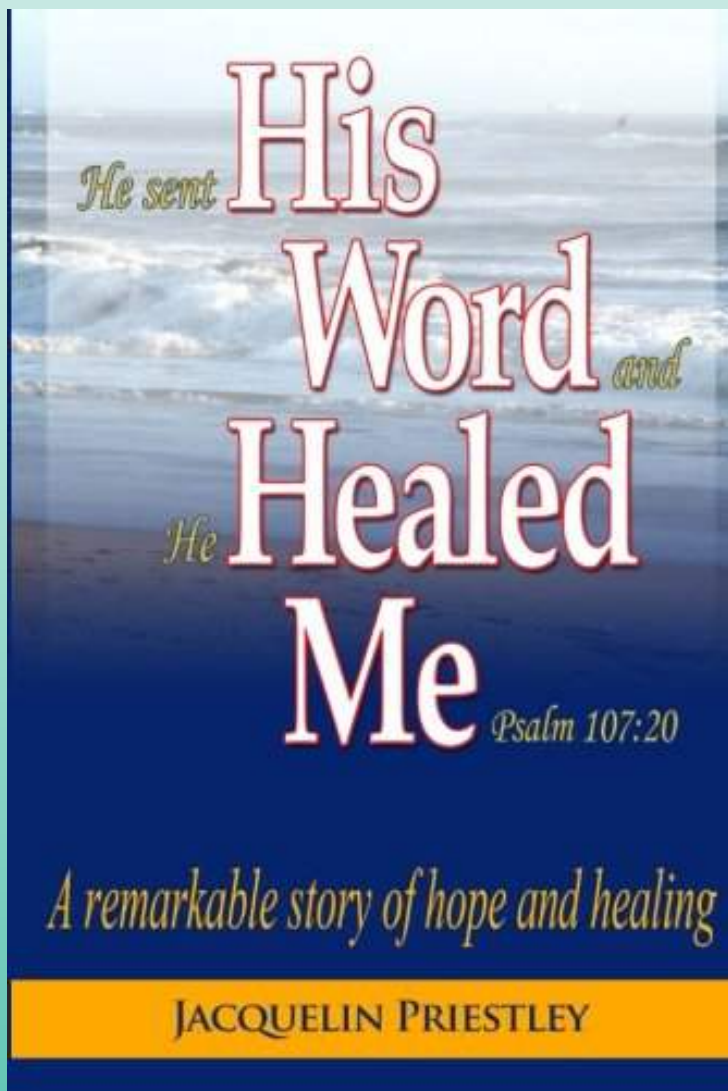

God's Healing & Transforming Grace

Fifteen years ago, I was a broken person. I'd had the courage to re-marry, only to be told a month later by my new husband that he wasn't attracted to me, wasn't in love with me, and he felt he'd made a mistake in marrying me. I was shattered, dumbfounded, and felt my entire self just sort of crumpled on the inside.

Several people suggested I annul the marriage, because he had not been honest with me the entire time we were courting, but I was determined to make it work somehow. I did my best to be sunny, bright, attractive, and loving, hoping and praying he would somehow love me.

Six months after our "I do's" I needed medical tests – a C-scan on my liver and kidneys. My physician discovered a large mass growing in my left kidney, said it was cancer, and that the kidney had to go!

Wanting some *good* news in my life somewhere, I consulted with five oncologists hoping to get a different opinion, but they said the ex-rays indicated cancer, agreeing

the kidney had to be removed.

I'm so glad I know Jesus Christ as my personal Lord and Savior. Dealing with despair about the attitudes of the man I'd married, knowing I wasn't wanted or loved, I'd already felt as if I was losing my mind; then getting that medical news.... It felt like my world was crumbling. I *clung* to God, asking for His direction. The sadness in my heart and home life was hurting me emotionally, psychologically, spiritually, and even physically. I needed God's help in so many ways.

The Lord led me into deeper study of healing scriptures than I'd ever done before. The Holy Spirit told me to read all the healing verses to my left kidney every day, and to **TELL my kidney to "Hear, Receive, and Obey the Word of the Living God Who created you."**

I hadn't ever heard anything like that before! I was believing for healing *and* for God to somehow let me get to *keep* my kidney. I needed a medical miracle.



I learned to declare what GOD declares over me (His Healing Word!). The myriad of medical tests, fighting fear, and spending hours per day reading the Word served a powerful purpose in my life. Remarkable things began to happen in my body that stunned the doctors and me. The mass began to move from the center of the kidney to the side within the kidney, making it more operable.

I gained so much insight from the Lord due to the deep seeking I did, I became full of joy despite the medical challenge and what my home life was like. After the surgery I asked my spouse what the whole thing had been like for him. Hoping for a response of love or concern, instead he said, "Well, the whole time I kept thinking, I didn't sign up for this". Once again, I was stunned by his coldness and sort of went numb. Worried friends told me they felt like they were watching me die inside. He abandoned the marriage during the fourth year, in 2006. I felt like a failure.

*Well, let me tell you about our **amazing God** who heals hurting lives!*

I got a miracle in my body and ended up writing a book about the entire journey and

all the remarkable insights I gained from God. My book, HIS WORD HEALED ME, was published in 2010. By 2012 it was also in Spanish! Readers write me telling of the anointing on the book and its impact on their faith and their relationship with God. I marvel at it all. To GOD be ALL the glory!

I now fondly refer to myself as a "happy, healthy, two-kidney woman," *and there is another blessing to add.....*

After being single for over 12 years, God suddenly brought an amazing Christian man into my life who is one of the dearest people I've ever met. It is amazing to be wanted, cherished, respected and honored by a loving husband. I finally know what that is like, and again, all glory to GOD.

I never would have guessed when I was struggling so deeply on so many levels in 2002, that now in 2018 I would be happily married, the producer of two Christian programs on The Holy Spirit Broadcasting Network, www.hsbntv.com, and be an ordained minister & international speaker. It's been an amazing adventure! Truly God is a Healing Gracious Lord, and He is the God of "exceedingly-abundantly-above-all-we-can-ask-or-think!" AMEN!

With God, All Things are Possible

Five days before our middle daughter made her grand entrance, I had a vision while praying. Four straws in a tall, old-fashioned milkshake glass representing Michael, me, Dusty (our oldest), and the baby. The liquid in the glass symbolized salvation and all four straws were in that liquid. But one straw was shorter and it represented the baby. Amazingly, I felt peace in that moment. Only after I started thinking about what the picture meant did fear enter my heart.

Bonnie Joy was a beautiful, curly girly with luminous blue-green eyes. Dusty was thrilled to be Bonnie's big sister and, at first, we just added Bonnie into the crazy mix of our lives. She was small, she nursed, slept, and cried like every other baby on the planet. She didn't seem to notice how often the scenery changed around her as we traveled like gypsies across the country with our music ministry. Life was good but, as weeks and months progressed, Bonnie became more aware of her surroundings and couldn't communicate her fear and frustration in words, so she acted out. It was scary. One moment we were convinced she would grow out of these behaviors, and the next we were suddenly sobered, knowing she was very different.

Here was this incredible child who looked like some wild, wide-eyed angel

dropped from Heaven, but eyes wandered everywhere, never connecting with me or any one person—ever! At the beginning we compensated for all her eccentricities without even realizing, but some things were so obviously inappropriate for her age and development. She spoke a language of gibberish, expecting us to comprehend. And the more Bonnie grew and saw and heard, the louder and more frequent her screaming became.

She threw herself down in grocery stores, restaurants, on neighborhood streets, in churches with loud shrill demonstrations of her extreme frustration. She would lean out into the street where cars were zipping by, as far as my tight—almost bone-crushing—grip would permit. She was a kite—and I was desperately tugging on the string, trying to reel her in. Overwhelmed with anxiety and a sense of helplessness in the face of her emotional "meltdowns," I wondered how we would survive as a family.



At her annual check-up our pediatrician couldn't even get near our daughter who was all arms and legs, continually screaming and it hurt to watch him restrain her so he could finish his examination. Afterward he quietly took me aside, explaining: "This is not the behavior of a 3-year-old. This is the behavior of an 18-month-old. You need to take her to a neurologist."

Dr. Niparko was rather unconventional but very direct. After spending time with Bonnie, she told me point blank, "I'm going to challenge your thinking. Your daughter has autism." She said many other things that day like how we needed to provide a real structure, unchanging and secure, so Bonnie could feel safe. I attempted to communicate how impossible that seemed since my husband and I were both in fulltime ministry, traveling everywhere together.

As I walked Bonnie out, it was raining. After buckling her into the car-seat, I sat staring out the windshield as tears filled my eyes, thanking God for the vision before she was born—a kind of heads-up—and for revealing the issue at hand.

Of course there was therapy—speech, occupational, sensory integration, adaptive PE, behavioral. I thank God how He provided everything we needed for our little daughter.

I remember Michael telling me how Bonnie spoke at her 5th grade graduation while I was away. Each child was



encouraged to share what they wanted to be when they grew up. When Bonnie's turn came to speak the mic suddenly went dead. She was left standing there while they tried to fix it. She waited patiently as they corrected the problem, and when the sound system started working Bonnie simply began again. With great poise she told the parents that day: "Hello. My name is Bonnie Joy O'Connor... and I'm going to be a missionary." She didn't hesitate like all the other kids but simply stated her calling. The place exploded with applause.

There were many difficult days during her school years of bullying and struggling with homework, but Bonnie triumphed magnificently in her senior year. Not only did she graduate 16th in a class of 500 at our local public high school, but to everyone's amazement Bonnie gave a speech, entitled "**Think Different**" after the then-famous Apple slogan. In it she shared how she overcame her struggles with autism to encourage her classmates.

Her current challenge has been the greatest of all. Bonnie felt the Lord calling her to follow a dream she had in her heart. Bonnie moved earlier this year from North Hollywood, CA to Oakmont, PA by herself. There were so many firsts in this particular adventure. First time on a plane by herself. First time living on her own, entirely apart from family. First time paying her own expenses. First time staying in a motel by herself. First time finding a congregation to call home. But perhaps nothing was quite as stellar as Bonnie landing a job.

Before leaving for Pittsburgh, she had become quite a favorite working as a courtesy clerk at our local Ralph's. While I was on tour doing concerts in the area, I took Bonnie on a Monday out to job-search and gathered applications to fill out. Giant Eagle is a supermarket chain in the Pittsburgh area. There was one about

a mile from Bonnie's new home. She picked up the application on a Monday and got hired on Tuesday—as a cashier.

Both Michael and I wondered if Bonnie could handle all the facets required for being a checker but, Bonnie came through with flying colors! At last report, she has punned her way into all her co-workers' and customers' hearts.

Sometimes, I stare at her—in scrapbook pictures, or when she is sleeping, or in my mind's image of her, and wonder how did she arrive where she is? It wasn't Michael and I who delivered her from the darkness she was living in. We almost drowned in it. A much stronger hand pulled Bonnie—and all of us—out. And He continues to do so.

"But Jesus looked at them and said to them, 'With men this is impossible, but with God all things are possible.'" (Matthew 19:26)



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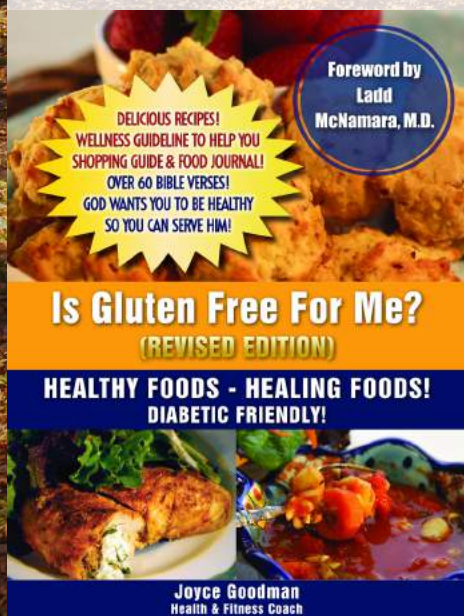
'Let us fear the Lord our God, who gives autumn and spring rains in season, who assures us of the regular weeks of harvest.' Jeremiah 5:25

Roasted Butternut Squash Soup

In keeping with the Fall/Autumn season, I offer this lovely Roasted Butternut Squash Soup recipe for you to consider preparing for you family. It is easy to make and low in calories. Plus, just look at the benefits! This squash can help: Prevent high blood pressure, Promote regularity, Improve eyesight, Keep bones strong, Protect your skin, Boost immune function, Reduce inflammation, and Aid in weight loss. Of course, if you have health challenges, be sure you know what your body can tolerate. That being said - here is the basic recipe:

Ingredients:

1 butternut squash
Approximately 1 teaspoon olive oil
1/2 cup shallots, diced (can't get shallots? Use a sweet onion)
4 garlic cloves minced
1 teaspoon Maple Syrup
1/2 teaspoon Nutmeg
2-1/2 cups chicken or vegetable stock
Salt and pepper to taste

Directions:

Preheat oven to 400 degrees
Rinse the butternut squash, poke holes in squash with fork
Place squash on foil or parchment paper-lined cookie sheet
Rub oil on squash
Roast until tender - approximately 45 minutes depending on the size of the squash
Remove from oven, when cooled, cut squash in half and remove seeds. (You can rinse seeds, sprinkle with salt and roast them! Delicious treat - like pumpkin seeds)
Scoop flesh out and put in food processor
Sauté shallots or onions and garlic in a little olive oil until translucent
Place in food processor with squash. Add broth, shallots or onions, along with remaining ingredients and blend until smooth.
Place in saucepan and reheat to desired temperature.

Variations: You can garnish with chopped bacon, chopped green onions, a dollop of sour cream per bowl. If you like a creamier soup, add approximately 1/2 cup half and half or cream. You can serve with a slice of toasted, crusty, rustic bread.

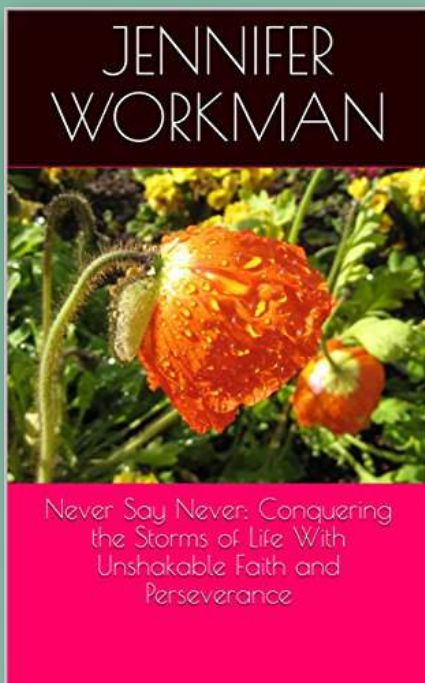

"Lord, Do Whatever it Takes to Get Through to My Husband!"

It must have been the summer of 1994 when, in utter exasperation, I placed my head on my arms that were folded on the counter and whispered this prayer, **"Lord, do whatever it takes to get through to my husband."**

We'd been married nine years—the first five were difficult. Although we were blessed with the joyous birth of our daughter, we also lost a baby during pregnancy, and our second child, our son, was born seriously premature. His life hung in the balance every millisecond of every day for two long weeks. Truly miraculously, he survived.



These factors racked up considerable debt. But this day that I prayed was during the height of our being completely unemployed for what turned out to be four long years. We had to sell everything we'd gained in effort to plan for our future. We sold our rental home, then lost our primary home to foreclosure. The very real possibility we'd have to live in our car stared us in the face.

We were forced to move three times during this season. First because of losing our home, second because the owner of the house we rented took our rent money but did not pay the mortgage. The rental was foreclosed upon forcing us to find housing. It seriously looked like we'd have to live out of our car, when we found a bank-owned property that we were permitted to rent. The economics and job markets at this time in Southern California were dreadful for many people.

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The stress of this reality caused many other health, emotional and relational issues. My husband felt like a failure, though being unemployed was through no fault of his own. He was angry and believed the family, the world and God were against him. I'd tried everything I could to get through to him, but his heart was hard. The day came when he was again gainfully employed, allowing us to move back to Orange County. The story of how we found our home and was able to buy it with a foreclosure on our record was truly miraculous. God answered many prayers for us through this difficult season, but there was little change in my husband.



The house was a major fixer-upper, but hard work has never bothered me. In the summer of 2002, I heard the Lord say, "Get your house in order." I was taken back. I remembered to King Nebuchadnezzar, so I inquired of the Lord. I really didn't hear anything more. Not knowing if this instruction was literal or otherwise, I busily got everything in order I could. Home repairs, painting, stepped up my prayer and devotional life and finally secured health insurance. We'd had none since David lost his job.

The morning of September 16, 2002, I met some friends to play tennis with for the first time. I arrived feeling nervous, wanting to do good job so they'd invite me back. While warming up I hit a ball over the fence—not the net, the fence. The next ball I hit to Debbie, when I was supposed to be warming up with Jill. About this time, I realized I was far more hot and sweaty than I should be for that amount of exertion and I was very short of breath. I told the ladies, I needed to sit down for a moment. I felt embarrassed at my performance and realized I was also feeling nauseous. I told the ladies I needed to leave and suggested they play a three-some. Terri followed me to my car offering to drive me to the doctors. I resisted and the next thing I knew I threw up. I didn't want to get into her car with the chance I'd be sick again, so I found a place in the shade where I could lay on the cold damp sidewalk.

Jill and Debbie came off the courts and Terri called 9-1-1, began praying and one called our church prayer line. Terri followed the instructions of the dispatcher until paramedics arrived six minutes and twenty-one seconds from the time Terri dialed. There was a scurry of men in dark blue uniforms preparing to assist me. My arms were strapped to equipment including an EKG monitor. I was later told my heart rhythms changed so rapidly that Captain Sekins could barely write down the progression as it occurred. What they witnessed was a Sudden Cardiac Arrest that originated in the upper chambers of my heart. The particular documentation showed a Sinus Ventricular Tachycardia, that went into a Ventricular Tachycardia, that went into a Ventricular Fibrillation. The EKG showed my heart beat in excess of 300 per minute. On a good day of tennis, at maximum exertion, my heart rate would be around 190.

Although they administered fifty ccs of Lidocaine, twice, they couldn't get my heart under control. Then my heart stopped—it flat lined and I was dead. I'm told that my body flopped on the sidewalk like a fish out of water and that it turned tomato red for lack of oxygen. The Paramedics positioned everything then using the defibrillator pulsed 200 joules of power through my body. My heart began beating again, and I heard my name being called, "Pam, Pam are you with us? Pam come back."



When my heart stopped, my spirit left my body. I was taken to a place I can only call the threshold of Heaven. There are no adequate words to describe where I was. Utter peace and euphoria and...*there are no adequate words*. I saw a thin white light off in the distance, but it didn't beckon me. When I heard my name being called and felt my spirit leave the magnificent dimension I was in, I was actually agitated. I liked where I was. I knew I was in the very center of God's sovereign care. But Greg Brinkley kept calling my name.

There's much more to the story that I share when presenting in person, but for this publication, know that the Paramedics rushed me to the hospital where I ultimately stayed eight day. Every test imaginable was run on me but they found no cause for the sudden

cardiac arrest, neither did they find any resulting heart damage. I am not restricted in any way and to this day I still play tennis—with Jill.

Several weeks after being discharged, my mind began whirling over the entire ordeal. I spiraled down to thoughts of why God would want to remove me from the earth. Crying and wondering what I'd done, I picked up the phone and called my Pastor. I tearfully asked, "Why is God unhappy with me? Why..." Immediately he interrupted me and said, **"Wait Pam. I have to ask you a question and I think I already know the answer to the question. Was there ever a day you told God to do whatever it took to get through to your husband?"**

The question took my breath away and the tears stopped flowing. Then he began explaining that my experience was demonstration of God's love and answer to my prayer. Especially in light of the fact that I have no residual damage or health concerns, it made perfect sense. What I experienced was not a work against me, it was *for* me and for my husband.

With my husband coming so close to losing me, and seeing the miraculous answers to prayers that spared my life, protected my health and quality of life, his perspective changed. His consideration about God was significantly touched and his heart was softened.

Many people conclude that God doesn't answer prayer because the answer didn't come the way they expected. In the same way most Jews of Jesus' day didn't receive Him as the Messiah resulting in their continued separation from the good God wanted them to have. God is faithful and He only and ever wants what is good for you. If you think God has failed to answer your prayers, take the time with Him, to review your life events to see with His eyes and heart. When your heart is aligned with His, you'll always see your prayers answered.



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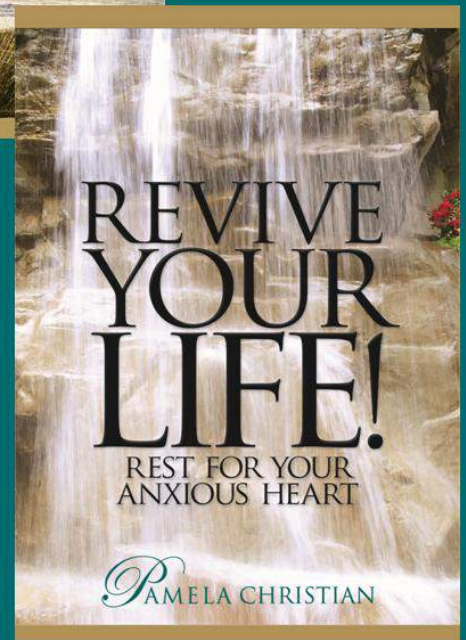
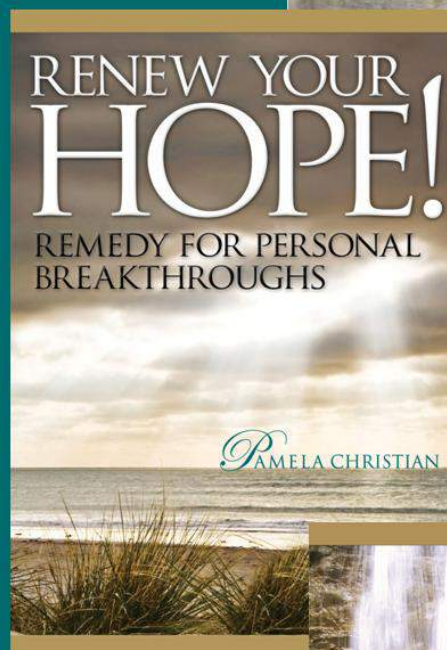
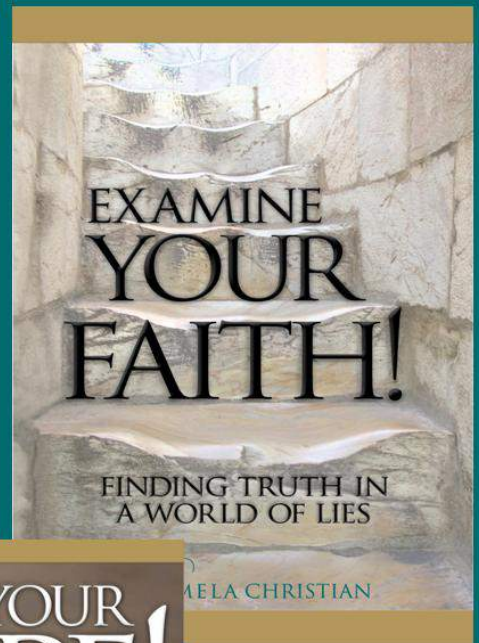
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PRAYING TOGETHER MEANS STAYING TOGETHER THROUGH TOUGH TIMES

My parents were married for sixty-six years, and every morning they prayed together. They prayed through the deaths of their parents, the breast cancer that invaded my mother's body, and the stroke that, for months, robbed my father of his vision and balance. The key word is praying through — not over or under or around, but through. Sometimes we must go through the fire, but as Scripture promises, the fire will not consume us.

When we pray together as couples, we bring a sense of unity to our marriage that will not be easily shattered by difficulties.

Just as your personal prayer life is an indicator of your relationship with the Lord, the prayer life of a marriage is a strong indicator of the health of the whole relationship. Praying together is an intimate activity, and in order for it to be effective, it must be genuine and heartfelt.

My husband, Ron grew up in a family that didn't pray together, so it was hard for him to understand how important it was to our relationship. Through the years, he's learned that his prayers nourish me, our marriage, and our relationship with God. When Ron prays for me, I feel as if I'm covered by a velvety blanket of protection. Even though I still face problems and setbacks, his

prayers shelter me from the sharpness of the pain. We have prayed through financial troubles, difficult decisions about careers, and several health issues.

Here's an example of how our prayer life kept us bonded during the most painful event a couple can experience:
the death of a child.

After an abnormal ultrasound during my second pregnancy, Ron and I went back to the hospital for the amniocentesis results. The doctor said, as if he were reading from a textbook, "Trisomy eighteen is a genetic disorder that always involves profound mental retardation and severe disfigurements."

Then he said the words that still live inside a tiny zipped pocket of my heart. "Your baby's condition is usually incompatible with life. Most women in your position, in order to spare themselves unnecessary anguish, just get an abortion. We can schedule yours for tomorrow morning."

I couldn't speak. I stopped breathing. I felt like I was drowning. I wanted to sink into the dark water and disappear. We left the office without a word.

We knew that abortion was not an option for us and that this child was the one God chose for us. We began to fall in love with him. Ron laid his hands on my stomach almost every night and prayed for the baby and our marriage. We asked the Lord to help us to bear this unbearable burden through His unfailing strength.

My parents also covered us in prayer and one day my mother gave us a piece of advice that kept us focused. She said, "Try not to think about the future. Your baby is alive today, be alive with him. Treasure every moment."

Over the next few months, we talked to our unseen baby, sang lullabies to him, and prayed for him. I gave him gentle massages through my skin. We knew we probably had to do our best parenting

before he was born.

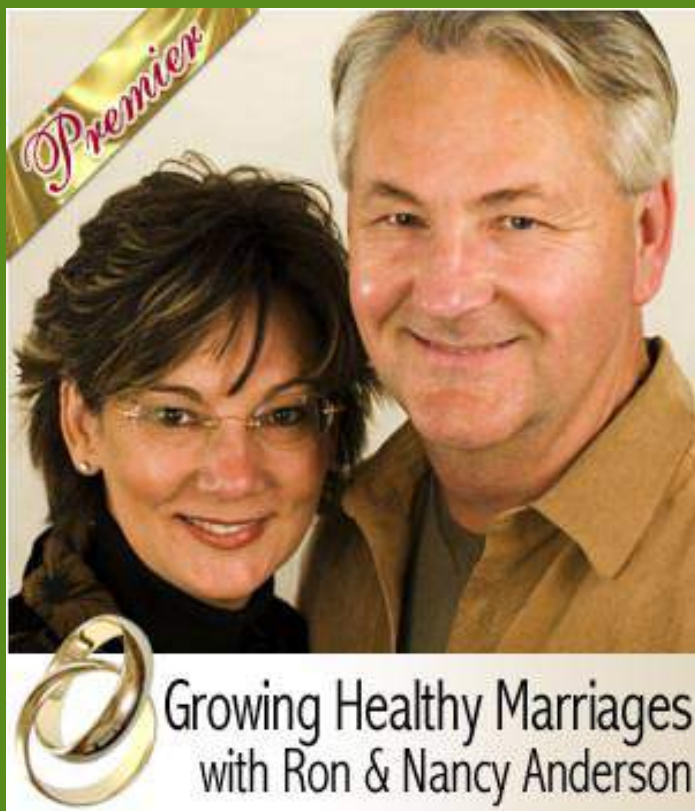
Four months later, we met little Timmy face-to-face. The nurse covered his fragile, twenty-ounce body with a soft blue blanket and matching cap. His heart monitor beeped an unsteady greeting as she handed him to us.

His beautiful little rosebud mouth surprised me. It was an oasis of perfection. We held our emotions in check, knowing we had to pour a lifetime of love into a minuscule cup. Ron and I took turns rocking him as we repeatedly told him, "We love you, Timmy." He never opened his eyes. His heartbeat got slower and slower — and then reluctantly stopped.

We introduced him to his heavenly Father as we prayed, "Lord, here is our son. Thank you for the gift of his precious life and for the privilege of being his parents. We release him into your healing arms."

Then we cried.

Unfortunately, because of the lack of medical insurance, the doctors wouldn't do anything to help me. They would only give me iron for the anemia and birth control pills for the bleeding so, over time, it got worse.

After becoming much weaker, my husband bought the \$700.00 a month medical insurance and I went to the doctor immediately. After the Gynecologist performed a biopsy, within the week, he called and informed us that I had uterine cancer and that he was going to refer me to the Oncologist/OBGyn specialist.

In that doctor visit, the Oncologist informed me that I had a 50/50 chance of survival. He told me, "I won't know how far the Cancer has spread until I'm inside your stomach and from there, we will determine what we are going to do."

I was so scared and begin thinking that my time was up here on earth. I talked to my dad and he told me to fight and don't give up. So, I got on Facebook and asked all my friends and family to help me pray for God to heal me.

At that time, I knew about Jesus, but I didn't know the Gospel, never read the Bible, and didn't have a relationship with God. I knew there was a Creator and I knew that there was a Jesus, who was the son of the living God, and that he died on a Cross at Calvary for all humanity but, there was no personal relationship or fellowship with Him.

Fortunately, people started to pray right away, giving me support. So, I told the doctor to schedule the surgery immediately and stop it from spreading and he scheduled it for the following Friday. My husband Mark was devastated, so he called his cousin Gilbert Silos, who was a born-again Christian.

Gilbert came to our home one day before my scheduled surgery, and all my family was present. That day, I accepted Christ as my Lord and Savior. Then Gilbert told me I have a gift that God gave me, I speak in tongues, I'm going to pray in tongues, and the devil does not understand that language.

Last night I was asleep, and God woke me up and told me to get up and pray for Maggie because He was going to heal her." Gilbert and his wife Martha Silos got up and prayed for three hours. Then Gilbert told my husband, "I truly believe that, when they open Maggie, that the cancer is going to be gone."





It was 6:00 pm when I awoke from the surgery and my husband was next to me. I was in horrible pain and as I looked at my husband he said, "Maggie, the doctors said that they went through your whole stomach and that they didn't understand it, but there was no cancer." The doctors were shocked.

We were all amazed! I got well, but unfortunately, I went back to my sinful ways, partying, drinking, and doing bad things that I'm ashamed of even mentioning. At the time I owned three homes, two in East Los Angeles and one in Desert Hot Springs, California. However, within one year, I lost all three homes. We were broke, homeless, and devastated. Mark went to live with his mother and I went to live with my parents.

I went into a deep depression because we had lost everything. My trials were so horrible that, one day, I went to Soledad Church and I got on my knees and started to cry out to God. I asked him to please help me.

Two weeks later, I went to school to pick up my boys and my mother was with me. I suggested to my mom for us to take the boys to a restaurant. So, as we went my son started to yell at me, "there's your friend." Her name is

Mayte Antillon and she's a born-again Christian. I hadn't seen her in 2 years since she had become a Christian and I lost contact with her.

I went running to her and hugged her and told her everything I was going through. She invited me to Bible class but, I didn't go. Then on the following week, I saw her at the market and I thought what a coincidence that was.

I thought maybe I do need to go to this bible class. When I went, all the brothers and sisters started to pray for me and they impacted me in a good way. I continued to go to that bible class and Jesus came into my heart and set me free and within 5 months I got baptized.

I became the first converted in my family. The Lord told me, "you're the vessel I'm going to use. Through you, your family will come to know me in Spirit and in Truth."

Today, my husband and I are born-again Christians and have been called to be Pastors. Now, my family is getting saved one by one, thank you God. We Serve an amazing God. Living the Christian Life and walking with Jesus is the best thing that has ever happened to us. We are so happy and blessed.

For several days prior to this happening and for some odd reason I kept having a

thought to call a friend that I'd met at a night club to just say hello. We'd talked off and on and hung out from time to time, so I called. My friend invited me over and I shared my condition with him. We talked more and more and soon he invited me to dinner.

While at dinner I thought he'd dropped something on the floor, but he hadn't. He'd actually gotten down on his knee to ask for marriage. I accepted and we later found him to be the father of my second daughter. For whatever reason he was in love with me and wanted to begin life together and we did. We both eventually dedicated our lives to Christ and began our new journey. God did innumerable miracles for us overtime and we were eventually called to ministry.

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What Should You Do If God Seems Silent or Absent?

Does it seem as if God has packed up, moved far away, and left no forwarding address for you? Are you going through a painful situation and you are not seeing His presence or promptings or hearing His voice? Have you been praying to the Lord and all you're getting back is "silence?"

I recently read in a newsletter, the following words, "When you are going through something hard and wonder where God is, remember, the teacher is always quiet during the test."

While that's a cute and humorous saying, the truth of the matter is that many people believe that "silence is painful when it comes to God in our lives." It often leaves a person confused, agonizing with uncertainties entering into their minds and wondering if God has completely abandoned them.

In 1 Kings 19, we read the story of the mighty prophet Elijah. He had just been used by God to perform a great miracle which resulted in the destruction of 450 false prophets of Baal on Mount Carmel. Afterwards, when he received word that the wicked Queen Jezebel wanted to destroy him, he fled and complained about how he was being treated and began to think that God had abandoned him by being silent.

Then, in 1 Kings 19:10 NIV, Elijah cries out in anguish, "I have been very zealous for the Lord God Almighty. The Israelites have rejected your covenant, torn down your altars, and put your prophets to death with the sword. I am the only one left and now they are trying to kill me too."

We see in this passage of Scripture that Elijah's concerns were not true. Elijah thought God was silent and that he was the only one left standing for the Lord. God, who is never silent, revealed to Elijah that He had an army waiting in the wings, ensuring Elijah that he was not alone. In 1 Kings 19:18 God informed him "Yet, I have left me seven thousand in Israel, all the knees which have not bowed unto Baal, and every mouth which hath not kissed him."

God is not indifferent to the needs or the dangers that face His children. He is always mindful of the tears and cries of His people.

If you're not sensing or hearing God's voice in your life, then the very first thing you must do is to examine your heart and make sure that the following sins are not in your life.





That you are not harboring secret sins, that you are not filled with anger, that you are not full of unbelief, that you are not carrying grudges and are not walking in unforgiveness, that you are not living a rebellious lifestyle or not following a rebellious spirit, that you don't have the wrong image or portrait of God, or that you're not too busy to spend intimate quality time in God's word.

However, if you are living a prayer-less life instead of a prayerful life and, if your love for the world is still greater than your love for God, then know that it's time to repent and make changes in your heart.

Whenever it may appear that God is silent, he never is. What may look like silence or inactivity in just our Lord working things out both inside of us and orchestrating in our affairs. He's then allowing you the opportunity and privilege to draw closer to Him and listen to "the still small voice" of the Holy Spirit and receive a fresh revelation of His love, grace, and power as you stand on His Word.

As you're standing, don't panic and be moved by what you see. Standing is your statement of faith, even if you're still under pressure, that you believe God's Word. Standing means that you've set yourself to hold fast to the Word and Promises of God with the confidence that He will do what He said He would in His Word.

Yes, there's always going to be times where we as believers will have to stand in faith, walk in obedience, and endure hardships as we wait on the Lord. Rest in the assurance of His gracious promise, as declared in Hebrews 13:5 where He promised "I'll never leave you nor forsake you."



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
