December meeting of Lodge 6-152 was held at the home of President Karen Holien Buehrer. Prior to the opening of the meeting members were served a traditional Norwegian breakfast. Present were: President Buehrer, Vice President Lynelle Aanestad, Secretary Roger Buehrer, Treasurer Terri Anderson, Foundation Director David Anderson, Trustee Bob Sturgeon, Social Director Kristy McCumby-Hyland, Sports Director Doug Kittelson, Volunteer Coordinator Vicdan Kittelson, Cultural Director Lene Thorsen-Peters, Assistant Membership Director Nancy Paulson, and guests Vikki Renneckar and Gwen Knighton.

The meeting was called to order at 9:18 a.m. with the minutes of the last board meeting approved as printed.

Treasure Terri Anderson reported the following financials:

General Lodge Fund: \$20,764.88
Wells Fargo Savings: \$5,863.49
Headquarters Savings: \$14,058.08
Scholarship Fund: \$1,123.00

Projects and Directors Reports:

Lutefisk Dinner-Lene Thorsen-Peters volunteered to serve as the master of ceremonies. Other volunteers include: Bob Sturgeon, kitchen; Terri Anderson, dining room chairperson; Rory Raymond, raffle; Gwen Knighton, ticket sales; Erik Pappa, public relations; Vikki Renneckar, ordering lefse. Flyers are now being distributed and will be included in the newsletter. A baking day for cookies is scheduled for January; date to be determined.

Membership-Nancy Paulson reported that the Lodge recorded 20 members through the first of December.

Cultural Director-The January program will be a trivia game base on content of the meetings throughout 2022. Nancy Paulson suggested that in an effort to further the cultural and education aspects of the Lodge, that a group be formed to speak Norwegian, or to develop a class for those interested to learn the language.

Cadence Holiday Marketplace-The board congratulated Kristy McCumby-Hyland and Bob Sturgeon for their efforts in coordinating the Holiday Marketplace for the Cadence master-planned community. Treasurer Terri Anderson reported that the Lodge netted \$1,331.34 at the fundraiser. The board expressed mixed feeling about whether the Lodge should undertake such a project again, especially that it was in such close proximity to the Lodge's Scandinavian Bazaar on Nov. 12.

Marketing Committee-The new website was launched on Dec.1 and received accolades from board members. Other projects now before the committee are printing of new business cards and a new brochure. Roger Buehrer reported that the webmaster Krystal Santana Buehrer had been asked to submit a proposed budge for maintaining the site. She proposed a cost of \$85 a month. He made a motion and it was passed that the Lodge undertake those expenses.

District Convention24-President Holien Buehrer reported that the District Convention Committee was back to square one with Sun Coast Hotel and Casino. New rates made the cost of holding the convention there cost-prohibitive.

St. Patrick's Day Parade-The annual event will be held in downtown Henderson March 11, 2023.

Syttende Mai-The board agreed to have the Norwegian Constitution Day on May 17, 2023. Details will be finalized at the January meeting.

- 5. Followup with members to get more involvement. Make the volunteer survey work for the Lodge.
- 6. In need of more daytime meetings.
- 7. Create a craft day like baking day.
- 8. Focus on Viking history and culture.
- 9. Get Lodge activities on various community calendars to created more attention to Lodge activities.
- 10. While the meeting location has many benefits, it could be a turnoff to encourage younger member involvement.
- 11. More social activities like the Viking Raid on the Blue Ox.
