"The reign of God is like a mustard seed which someone took and sowed in his field. It is the smallest seed of all, yet when full-grown it is the largest of plants. It becomes so big a shrub that the birds of the sky come and build their nests in its branches." (*Matthew* 13:31-32)

The Society of the Atonement consisted of only the Founders, with one other Friar and four Sisters when they joined the Roman Catholic Church in 1909.
