A word from your Minister General ...

Recently I was blessed with a retreat experience ~ such a gift! As we know, some are called to the *mountains* to perhaps climb new heights ... some are drawn to the trails of *wooded areas* to perhaps walk in new directions ... some thirst for the vast openness of the *ocean* to perhaps experience the refreshment of living waters! The awesomeness of the ocean accentuates our continued need to *put out into the deep*!



Our <u>Spring Regional Meetings</u> in May, as facilitated by *Sr. Lynn Jarrell, osu*, provided for us a *reality check* for our 'now moment'. The <u>State of the Community Report</u>, which I shared with you on July 9th, allowed an opportunity to literally *check in* on that reality! It is within that context that I found myself on retreat at the ocean seeking the gift of refreshment.

Reflecting on these recent three months it seems our prevalent experience has been one of delving ever more *into the deep*. The Leadership Team has truly invested <u>much</u> time, dialogue, discernment, and thought in order to make decisions that really have surfaced *from the deep*! As we face the actual reality of our present census at 99 Professed Sisters with a median age of 82, along with five Sisters in our formation programs, we recognize our need to 'think outside the box' as we move forward to fill certain roles of importance!

In early June we implemented a new paradigm at our *Lurana Health Care Residence* with our first lay person as Administrator. Certainly *Janice Selfridge* is not a new face to us, but we now entrust this important role to Janice as we transition components of the Medical Finance Office to staff from Brenner, McDonagh & Tortolani Financial Advisory firm.

In late June the Leadership Team was at our mission in Edmonton, Alberta, Canada for meetings. At our *Lurana Shelter* where we provide a safe haven to women and children fleeing domestic violence we have phenomenal staff, volunteers and Board Members; we welcome *Sarah Cornett* to the Executive Director role at the Shelter!

We are extremely cognizant of the blessing of all of our staff who minister with us at our various ministerial programs and within our Graymoor departments. Within this newsletter

you will see some photos and tidbits of information about some of the staff who are partners with us in these diverse areas. We are ever grateful for the gift of these amazing women as they journey with us in ministry!

The Sister Jubilarians and their guests enjoyed a meal in the Motherhouse dining room following the Mass. Later in the afternoon, the Jubilarians had time for sharing with their relatives and friends in designated locations within the Motherhouse. God blessed us with a beautiful blue-skies day! All were safe and well.






Community Regional Meetings: May 10-13 & May 14-17, 2018 ~



Farewell to the Archdiocese of Boston, and a tribute to Sisters

Esther & Laurie

"Perhaps one of the greatest gifts ever given to us by the Anglican Church was the Franciscan Sisters of the Atonement. Their religious order was founded in 1898 as an Anglican Communion. In 1909, they were corporately received into the Roman Catholic Church and received definitive approval as a congregation of Pontifical right on June 13, 1935. That notwithstanding, it should be noted that the Franciscan Sisters of the Atonement are a, "Missionary Congregation of Women Religious," following in the footsteps of that great Saint of humility, none other than Francis of Assisi himself. These women are so subtly impactful that they even influenced a Jesuit priest, Cardinal Jorge Mario Bergoglio, to take the name 'Francis' as he was elected Pope on March 13, 2013. However, the charism of the Atonement Sisters is defined by the following words of St. Francis:

"Lord, make me an instrument of your peace: where there is hatred, let me sow love; where there is injury, pardon; where there is doubt, faith; where there is despair, hope; where there is darkness, light; where there is sadness, joy. O divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek to be consoled, as to console, to be understood, as to understand, to be loved, as to love. For it is in giving that we receive, it is in pardoning that we are pardoned, and it is in dying that we are born to eternal life.

"As missionaries, Atonement Sisters go where they are sent. Since coming to Boston in 1987, it's hard for me to remember a time when my life has not been affected by the Sisters. It seems as though I have known them all my life. Their legacy of leadership, prayer and service stands as a model for us all as we carry their work into the future. Like your predecessors and contemporaries, you, Sister Esther & Sister Laurie, have followed the lead of your founders, Mother Lurana & Father Paul. Service to the poor has been and will continue to be your life's vocation. Again, as missionaries, the Sisters obediently go where they are sent with humility. We may be sad at their departure, but fear not, their spirit will remain.

"Sister Esther, Sister Laurie, we, your Boston Family, salute you & wish you well as you embark on this next phase of your Franciscan journey. May your work both fulfill and further the mission of Jesus' prayer, "that all may be one ... that the world may believe that you have sent me." We have witnessed your commitment and have benefitted from your service. Thank you for all that you have done and will continue to do in your next assignments." ~ written by Meyer Chambers, Campus Minister, Boston College

News from Cavite, Philippines!

Receiving Medical, Dental & Optical Care

On June 24, 2018, a medical mission was held at Mother Lurana Ministries & Community Development Center in Pingtong Gubat, Cavite, Philippines.

To locate patients, staff members surveyed the local households in the Paliparan area to determine which people would best be served by the Medical Mission. The dentists, optometrist, pediatricians, family doctors, and nurses, members of the Indian Filipino Doctors Association, seek to provide medical and dental treatment to men, women and children who cannot afford or have little access to medical care. Approximately 500 people received medical and/or dental treatment.

Before the medical personnel arrived, the Sisters and staff were busy preparing the building as a clinic. Areas designated for registration, clinic, pharmacy & waiting areas were prepared. Along with other volunteers, Sr. Yna registered the patients, while Sr. Rosa was present to take blood pressures for the dental patients. Sr. Virginia acted as traffic director, comforter and supporter throughout the day.

The dentists were the busiest. Due to the lack of preventative dental care, many people needed extractions. The optometrist provided eye exams and single vision glasses. The pediatrician examined each child and prescribed medication if needed. The family doctor was busy caring for the adults. The pharmacy not only provided medication, but also

vitamins and dental hygiene kits as well.



Sr. Helen, Sr. Rosa, Sr. Cynthia, and Martha (our Postulant), rose early to make 800 sandwiches. Mary Grace, Jade, and Vicky also joined the sandwich making project. The sandwiches & juice pouches were shared with the people as they left. Sandwiches and juice were also given to those who arrived early and had not eaten breakfast. Sr. Cynthia, Martha & Sr. Helen had the rewarding duty of distributing the food and hearing many words of gratitude.



The medical and dental mission was a success, especially due to the many dedicated volunteers and staff. A second mission is being planned for October 4th ~ which will coincide with the second anniversary of foundation of the Mother Lurana Ministries and Community Development Center in Cavite, Philippines!

Greetings from the Parish of St. John Bosco, Port Chester, NY!


The summer days are upon us and everyone has been quite busy with all the activities in the new parish of St. John Bosco in Port Chester, New York.

We look forward to Santa's next visit!




