Each phone session delivers a safe, secure personal support platform for a caller to share and engage in a healthy and positive strictly platonic (NON-SEXUAL CONTENT) conversation with trained Human Behaviorist & Harm Prevention / Risk Reduction expert advisors like "Remedy Max" founder of RemedyBlox.

It is our goal that by calling the BUDDY LINE each caller will feel valued and most importantly feal "heard" and understood by someone trained and experienced on the frailty of the human condition and able to offer professional life coaching tips and tools as well as advisory support.
