SUBJECT: Failure to Correct Sanitary Survey Significant Deficiency

Dear Mayor DeLong:

This letter is notification that the Malvern Village Public Water System (PWS) has not complied with the requirements issued on March 18, 2022. The Malvern Village PWS was notified in correspondence dated March 18, 2022, of the requirement to respond in writing within 30 days, with a schedule to complete corrective actions within 120 days or as issued by the director. The Malvern Village PWS has failed to comply with this requirement to make corrections in its operation.

The Malvern Village PWS is in violation of treatment technique requirements for a significant deficiency by the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC), Rule 3745-81-60, as noted in the letter dated March 18, 2022. The Malvern Village PWS did not provide a schedule for or correct the significant deficiency identified which was the failure to develop and implement a valve exercising program.

IMMEDIATE ACTION REQUIRED:

- 1. Consult with Ohio EPA within 24 hours regarding the items listed below.
 - <u>Management and Operation: Valve Exercise Program</u> In accordance with OAC Chapter 3745-83-01(H)(1-2), "The owner and operator shall ensure that all facilities and equipment necessary for the treatment and distribution of water shall be maintained, at a minimum so as to function as intended. In the event that the treatment facilities or

During the 2022 sanitary survey, no written documentation of the valve exercise program was available. In addition, it was discussed that a significant number of valves are inoperable condition. Exercising of valves helps ensure the valves are functional and reliable during times of need, which generally occurs during emergency situations. Critical valves must be exercised annually in order to ensure they function as intended.

- 2. Notify the people served by this water system. Within 30 days, issue the enclosed public notice in accordance with OAC, Rule 3745-81-32 by the following method(s) to reach all persons served.
 - Mail or other direct delivery to each customer;
 - If necessary to reach all persons regularly served, use other notification methods also, such as newspaper publication, public posting or Internet posting;
 - Posted notices must remain in place for as long as the violation exists, but in no case for less than seven days (even if the violation is resolved). The language in the italics on the enclosed public notice is mandatory and must be included, as written. Do not make changes to the public notice without consulting the Ohio EPA beforehand.

NOTE: Issuance of a Public Notice must be repeated every three (3) months for as long as the violation exists, unless directed otherwise by the District Office. A verification form and a copy of the public notice, stating the corrective measures completed to date, must be submitted to the Ohio EPA.

- 3. Complete the enclosed verification form, within 10 days of issuing the Public Notice and mail it to Ohio EPA, Northeast District Office, Division of Drinking and Ground Waters, 2110 East Aurora Rd, Twinsburg, Ohio 44087. Include a copy of each notice distributed, published or posted.
- 4. Contact Ohio EPA A responsible official of the public water supply shall contact the Northeast District Office in writing by 14 DAYS FROM DATE OF LETTER, or December 31, 2025, to address the Malvern Village PWS actions required by your significant deficiency requirements stated in the Sanitary Survey Letter dated March 18, 2022. Failure to respond may result in enforcement action than can result in fines up to \$25,000 dollars per day.

5. The following statement describing the significant deficiency information must be included in the CCR every year until it has been corrected.

We were informed by the Ohio EPA that a significant deficiency for failure to maintain a valve exercising program had been identified on March 18, 2022. We were directed to correct the deficiency, but we failed to do so. We {are implementing/have completed} the corrective action plan which is developing and implementing a valve exercising program by {deadline} as prescribed by the Ohio EPA.
