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Introduction to Phlegraean Islands

It consists of the islands of Ischia, Procida, Vivara, and Nisida. They are part of the Campanian volcanic arc and Campanian Archipelago (Neapolitan Archipelago), off the coast of Naples in the Tyrrhenian Sea. The archipelago is within the Metropolitan City of Naples. The island of Capri is usually excluded, as it does not belong to the same geologic formations. In the classical epoch, some Phlegraean Islands were called Pithecussae, the Greek Pithekousai (Πιθηκοῦσαι, 'islands of monkeys'). A Greek myth tells of two brigands, the Cercopes of Ephesus, who played pranks on Zeus, who then punished them by turning them into monkeys and exiling them to the islands of Aenaria (Ischia) and Prochyta (Procida). Legend had the monster Typhon buried under Ischia, and the Giant Mimas buried under Procida, Such stories might be significant as a clue to how the ancient Greeks attempted to account for the volcanism of the whole area. The resulting changes in the topography of the islands were due to the frequent intervention of deities.

Destinations

Day #1 (11 miles from Naples Airport)

Board on our sailboat in Pozzuoli at 6:00 p.m. You try the Margherita as Naples is the birthplace of pizza.

Day #2: Destination #1 (19.2 nm 3 hours)

Head to Marina di Stabia after breakfast, tour in the ruins of Pompeii and Mount Vesuvius all day. Docking overnight.

Day #3: Destination #2 (6.9 nm 1 hour)

Make for Sorrento, tour in Town of Sorrento. Docking overnight.

Day #4: Destination #3 (19.4 nm 3 hours)

Set Sail to Positano and Amalfi. To visit in Positano in the morning and Amalfi in the afternoon. Docking overnight.

Day #5: Destination #4 (17.3 nm 3 hours)

After breakfast, make for Capri, visit the town of Capri, Villa Jovis, and tour in Blue Grotto. Anchoring overnight if weather permits.

Day #6: Destination #5 (23 nm 4 hours)

Set sail to Porto d'Ischia for shopping, restaurants and tour at Castle of Ischia. Docking overnight.


Day #7: Destination #6 (9 nm 1.5 hours)

Sail to Procida after breakfast, all day tour in the town and return to Pozzuoli before 5:00 p.m. Docking overnight.

Day #8

After breakfast onboard, take group pictures, wave farewell and disembark before 9:00 a.m.

POZZUOLI

- ★ The old name of Pozzuoli was Puteoli. It was a harbor city located on the north side of the Gulf of Naples, about five miles west of Naples. Pozzuoli is a city and the part of the Metropolitan Naples, in the Italian region of Campania. It is the main city of the Phlegrean Peninsula.
- After the death of Jesus Christ, the Apostle Paul landed in Pozzuoli and he spent seven days there (Holy Bible: Acts 28:13, 14). Paul began his journey with his companions on the Appian Way to Rome.
- Rione Terra is a historic quarter in Pozzuoli, in the west of Naples. The ancient fortress originally served as the acropolis for the Greek colony of Dicearkia before being occupied by Romans as the Roman port city of Puteoli. Today, Pozzuoli is a popular tourist attraction for boating.







MARINA DI STABIA

(POMPEII)

- The port of Marina di Stabia is known as the one of the largest tourist ports in Europe. It is located near the ruins of Pompeii and Mount Vesuvius and in the center of the Gulf of Naples. The city of Stabia has been called by the locals, "The city of two ports".
- The ancient Roman city of Pompeii was destroyed by super heat ashes erupting from the volcano of Mount Vesuvius in the summer of 79 AD. About 2,000 Pompeiians died in the city, but the eruption in total killed up to 16,000 people in Pompeii, Herculaneum and other towns.
- ★ Everything from the ancient Roman life, you will see displaying in Pompeii is preserved very well for 2,000 years. The archaeological park of Pompeii is open to the public.






SORRENTO

- Sorrento is a coastal town in southwestern Italy, facing the Bay of Naples on the Sorrentine Peninsula. Perched atop cliffs that separate the town from its busy marinas, it's known for sweeping water views and Piazza Tasso, a cafe-lined square.
- ★ Walk through Piazza Sant' Antonino, where you will find his statue. Make your way onto Corso Italia Street. This is the main shopping street in Sorrento. You can find everything from food, pharmacies, and clothing stores.
- ★ On either side, you will see orange trees and charming street-lights giving you all the feels of Italy! Also located on this street is Duomo di Sorrento with a beautiful bell tower and Gelateria Primavera for some delicious Gelato!

POSITANO & AMALFI

- Positano and Amalfi are two towns in the province of Salerno, in the region of Campania, Italy, on the Gulf of Salerno. The stretch of the coastline is named after Town of Amalfi.
- ★ The Amalfi Coast is a popular attraction for the upper-class Europeans since the 18th century. It was listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1997.
- ★ The natural beauty and the breathtaking scenic landscapes of the Amalfi Coast have made it one of the most popular destinations of the world's jet set, earning it the nickname of "Divine Coast" (Divina costiera).
- ★ The Amalfi Coast was filmed for some scenes of Federico Fellini's 1972 movie called, "Roma" and for the 2017 American marvel comic movie called "Wonder Woman". In this film, the Amalfi Coast was depicted as the Amazon island of Themyscira.







CAPRI

- ★ Villa Jovis, the ancient Roman palace, was built by the second Roman emperor Tiberius. It was completed in 27 AD. Tiberius left Rome for Capri. He feared for his life from possible assassination. At his heavy guarded palace, Tiberius ruled a whole Roman Empire from the island of Capri for 10 years until his death.
- ★ The name of Capri is so famous for the Capri pants. The scenes of the rocky island of Capri and Gulf of Naples are breathtaking. There are many fancy villas found on the stretch of the rocky coastline. This popular island is known place for the celebrities and jet-setters. You can find many attractions that appeal to every kind of traveler.
- ★ Blue Grotto is a major tourist attraction. At the port of Capri, there are plenty of boats available for hire. You can ride on the rowing boat inside the blue grotto cave or group boat through the big rock in the sea.







ISCHIA

- ★ Isola d'Ischia is the largest of the islands in Gulf of Naples. It has many craters and ancient lava flows. They are hard to spot because they are now covered by thick semi-tropical vegetation.
- In the 5th century BC, there were many earth-quakes and volcanic eruptions causing the Greek colony to evacuate it. The last eruption was reported in AD 1301. There are many hot water springs, many of them with bathing establishments showing that there is still subterranean activity.
- \bigstar Mount Epomeo on island of Ischia is very tall (788m / 2,586 ft. high).
- ★ Isola d'Ischia has many marine restrictions therefore the authorization is required before visiting. It is very popular island with many tourists visiting and growing permanent foreign population.







PROCIDA

- ★ Isola di Procida is a small low-lying island (115 m/377 ft. high). It is close to northwestern end of Gulf of Naples.
- The island has a less tourism than other tourist-crowded islands such as Ischia and Capri. It retains a noisy and colorful Procidan character.
- ★ The small town of Procida on the Northern coast has an oriental air about it: flatroofed cubic houses in white, pink and cream rising to the Castello on the hill.
- ★ During Neolithic Period, this island was inhabited and used by the Romans as a hunting reserve. Later it was raided by Turks and Barbarossa in 1544.
- This island is peaceful and quiet without being complicated from the outside the island. It has less tourism and it is very beautiful island.









BOAT SPECIFICATIONS

- Our boat selection will be Dufour 530. Its hull type is monohull. This has LOA of 53 ft. long and its beam of 16 ft. wide. The draft is 6.4 feet deep.
- It can carry up to 12 persons as max limit. but it is recommended up to 10 persons for more space and comfortable. There are 12 lifejackets stored on this sailboat.
- There are 6 double-bed cabins and 1 single-bed cabin plus 3 heads with hot showers units. This boat has Roller Main Sail and Roller Genoa.



- We urge you to share your information with us if you have any food allergies. For your safety, we (including our guests) must know immediately. Please bring your extra Epi-pen if possible.






THE WEATHER IN SOUTH OF ITALY

Climate in Italy in June

If May was warm, then June is hot; and if May was hot, June will be a scorcher. Average temperatures range from 12°C to 28°C (54°F to 82°F) and it climbs into the low 30s (90°F) at the coasts and inland sometimes. The sea is as hot as May was and at 23°C (73°F) in the summer sun, a fresh breeze is always welcome at the beach. Summer at the coast can be wet, but nowhere near as wet as winter and there are light infrequent showers at worse; unfortunately, this often means high levels of humidity. There have been heat waves in northern Italy in recent years and, when this happens, the south is scorching, so be prepared for some near unbearably hot days.



WHAT TO PACK FOR A HOLIDAY IN ITALY IN JUNE?

It's best to travel light in June because lugging heavy bags down cobbled streets in the heat isn't holiday fun. It might be trendy to don a three-piece suit in Milan, but it sure won't be ideal for the near 30°C heat (86°F). So, blend in with the sharp Italian style and take some loose long-sleeved shirts, T-shirts, comfortable and decent shorts, one or two light tops for the evenings and a light raincoat, especially for the south. Swim shorts, speedos and bikinis are great for beaches, but its best to bring a sarong or light covering for sun protection. Sunhats, sunglasses and, especially, sunscreen is essential.
