- 6. Stuff a Cruiser July 9 or bring food to July 4<sup>th</sup> parade for collection
- 7. Ed P announced that this is an election year for IVBA Officers and called on any and all to volunteer (see Lynn Abraham on Nominating Committee)
- 8. There is a Climate Resiliency Committee including Westbrook, Old Saybrook and Clinton to address coastal flooding.

### **New Business:**

Treasurer proposed the new budget. Ed Potanka suggested that we add \$2000 to the Long Term Capitol Improvement Fund as has been done in the past. Members voted and agreed. Jim Delldonna anticipated this years taxes will be a bit lower.

Anticipate an increase in insurance costs with inflation.

Goodwill/Hospitality requested an increase of \$1000 to lower the ticket cost for social events. Knox Landscaping for beach and triangle care added cost of \$3000 for property management. A memorial donation was made to the Westbrook Ambulance Association in memory of Jean Marino.

Motion to accept the budget was passed.

Cindy Howard volunteered to be on the Climate Resiliency Committee.

Brian Clampett raised concern regarding the speed of drivers traveling through IVB streets. Suggestions were made including putting out "slow/children playing" signs on personal properties, speaking directly to drivers and especially delivery drivers and/or calling companies to report drivers, and notifying Westbrook Police to monitor the area.
