Dear West Grove Church Family,

There are moments in life when pain feels unbearable and injustice seems to prevail. We pray, but heaven feels silent. The world around us appears unfair, and God seems distant. The prophet Habakkuk lived in such a time. In the final days of Judah, surrounded by violence and corruption, he cried out, "Lord, how long shall I call for help, and You will not listen?"

Yet, through that silence, Habakkuk discovered the faithfulness of God. He began with lament, stood firm in faith, and ended with praise. His journey teaches us how to live faithfully in uncertain and troubling times.

In the coming weeks, we will journey together through a sermon series titled "Habakkuk: Trusting God in Troubled Times." Through this message series, we will rediscover the God who still works in our suffering, the faith that trusts even when answers are delayed, and the praise that rises even when circumstances do not change.

I warmly invite you to join this sacred journey of faith — where our lament turns into prayer, our prayer into confidence, and our confidence into songs of praise.

PASTOR JIM'S CHRISTIAN LIVING COLUMN

When speaking to those new in the faith, they would ask where I should start to read the Bible and learn about Jesus. My advice is to start in the Gospel of John. It gives you the relationship of Jesus to God, His Father, and His life calling us to salvation. Below is a summary of the Gospel of John—written especially for the new Christians—highlighting what the book says, why it matters, and how you can use it to grow in faith.

1. What John is about:

The Gospel of John presents Jesus Christ as the eternal Word who became flesh: "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God."

John's purpose is made explicit in John 20:30-31: "These are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his

While the other Gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke) tell many of the same stories, John has a unique tone: deeper theological reflection, and a focus on who Jesus is (his identity) and what believing in him means.

2. How the book is laid out John can broadly be divided into these major sections:

A. Prologue (1:1–18): Introduces Jesus as the Word, the Light, the Life.
B. Signs of Jesus / His Ministry (1:19–12:50): Miracles and teaching that show who Jesus is.
C. Farewell, Passion, Resurrection (13:1–20:31): intimate teaching with the disciples, Jesus' death,

D. Epilogue (21:1–25): Further appearance of the risen Jesus and the commission of believers.

3. Key themes for a new believer:

A. Jesus' identity and relationship with the Father

Jesus is not merely a moral teacher, but the Son of God, one with the Father. The "I Am" statements: e.g., "I am the bread of life" (6:35); "I am the way, the truth and the life" (14:6).

B. Belief and eternal life

Believing in Jesus is central—John uses the verb "believe" many times.

Through belief one moves from death to life, from darkness to light.

C. Light vs. darkness, Spirit vs. flesh

Dualities: world vs children of God; light vs darkness; spirit vs flesh. These help show the difference Jesus makes.

D. Mission and relationship

Jesus not only sends his disciples but invites them into relationship: abiding (John 15:1-5), loving one another (13:34-35).

The Gospel calls you not just to know about Jesus but to live with Jesus and let him live through you.

4. Why this is helpful for you as a new Christian

Clarity of the gospel: John gives a clear statement of who Jesus is and what believing means—very helpful in the early stages of faith.

Depth for growth: John also offers rich theology—it rewards repeated readings and meditation.

Personal relationship: It emphasizes a living, personal relationship with Jesus.

5. How to use John for your spiritual growth

Begin by reading John in one or two sitting to get the overall flow.
Then go back, chapter at a time asking: Who is Jesus saying he is here? What does he ask of me?
Focus especially on the "I Am" statements and His miracles ("signs").
Meditate on John 20:30-31: ask yourself, "Do I truly believe that Jesus is the Christ, and am I living in his name?"

Let the themes sink in: light/darkness, life/death, belief/unbelief. Where am I in those?

John 17 is His prayer for Himself, His disciples and for those who the Father has given to Him. Do you see yourself in this prayer? For this truly is the Lord's Prayer.

new core values: Biblically Oriented, Relationally Connected, Prayerfully Centered, and Ministry Focused. We currently offer an adult Sunday School class and three weekday Community Groups for empowering our faith.

ENGAGE (Fellowship) Several new ministries were added last year, expanding our ways to serve and connect with others: Meals from Angels with Love, Community Garden, Midweek Ministry, Victory Sunday etc.

Our budget for this year was \$287,488. Through your generous and sacrificial giving, we have been able to move from a long-standing deficit to a surplus—a testimony to God's faithfulness and your commitment. As we look to the coming year, we invite you to make a commitment of faith and generosity—not only to sustain the ministries we share, but to help us realize our vision more fully. Every prayer offered, every act of service, and every gift given moves us closer to becoming a community, the Kingdom of God.


WGUMC United Women in Faith (formerly UMW) has established a weekly yoga routine which ensures that you can experience these benefits.

Food Pantry Update

Each November, we give our families the fixin's for a Thanksgiving meal. The Chester County Food Bank provides 2 chickens per family, stuffing, gravy, green beans, corn, cranberry sauce and fresh produce. We will have our Thanksgiving distributions Wednesday Nov. 20th from 5:00-6:00 pm. and Thursday, Nov. 21st from 1:00-2:00 pm. We will not have food distributions the week of Thanksgiving. Donated items are always appreciated. Some of the most requested items are tortillas (corn or flour), canned corn, cooking oil, rice and flour (corn or wheat). There is a black bin in the church lobby where you can place your donations.

Every month, we emphasize one item for donations. In the month of November, we will be collecting cat and dog food. Cans or bags are fine. If we receive a large bag of dog food we will

open it and bag it into smaller quantities. Place your donations in the black bin provided in the narthex.


The United Methodist Men hold a monthly breakfast at the church. There is time for scripture, sharing, some speakers and lots of fellowship.
