"Do not call me Naomi (pleasant); call me Mara (bitter), for the Almighty has dealt very bitterly with me." Ruth 1:20

When grief hits hard and wounds us deeply, we find ourselves wondering again and again: Why did this happen? Was it to reveal God's glory? To remind us of the fragility of life? Or perhaps to deepen the faith of those who must carry on?

Do you know why we suffer and grieve? Calamities and troubles are like the flu — uninvited, unwelcome guests who arrive without notice. When they visit us, we cannot avoid them. We must endure them, suffer through them, and wait to be healed.

How do you deal with your calamities?

We may also wonder: Why did God include the story of Ruth, a Moabite woman, in the story of David and ultimately, the story of Jesus? What was the author trying to tell us?

Scholars believe the Book of Ruth was written for the Jewish people after the Babylonian Exile, during Ezra's time, when there was a strong effort to restore Jewish identity and rebuild the nation of Israel. Yet the story of Ruth seems to stand in bold contrast to Ezra's policies — a direct confrontation to a spirit of exclusion.

We wonder how God allows His people to suffer and struggle. Yet as we walk through Ruth's story, we may find answers to our own suffering and pain. We may discover hope for today's world of polarization and rampant egoism. We may learn how to turn our mourning into dancing. I pray that as we journey through Ruth's story, we will encounter the love of God and find hope even in the midst of despair and pain.


PASTOR JIM'S CHRISTIAN LIVING COLUMN

A HEART OF HELP May 2025

As we approach Mother's Day, the word "help" keeps rising in my spirit. It's a small word with a big heart. We hear it in a toddler's cry, we see it in a mother's hands, and we read it throughout Scripture as a promise from God.

The psalmist says, "My help comes from the Lord, the Maker of heaven and earth" (Psalm 121:2). God is our ultimate helper—He is present, patient, and strong. And isn't that a beautiful description of many of the mothers we know and love?

Mothers help in ways both seen and unseen. They wipe our butts when we are young. They pack lunches, bind scraped knees, whisper prayers over sleeping children, and stand in the gap when times are hard. Their help mirrors the helping heart of God—steadfast and overflowing with grace.



We can see the helping heart of God in Scripture.

Isaiah 41:10 – God Helps Us Overcome Fear. "So do not fear, for I am with you... I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand." This promise speaks directly to those feeling weak, afraid, or overwhelmed.

Psalm 46:1 – God is Our Refuge and Strength. "God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble." This verse anchors us when the world feels unstable—God is always available, always helping.

Matthew 11:28-30 – Jesus Offers Help for the Weary. "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest... For my yoke is easy and my burden is light." Jesus, God in the flesh, offers help through rest and renewal for those who are carrying too much. **John 14:16-17** – **The Holy Spirit as Helper.** "And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Helper, to be with you forever—the Spirit of truth..." God sends the Holy Spirit as a constant helper, comforter, advocate, and guide.

This Mother's Day, we give thanks for those who have helped shape us with love, lifted us with prayer, and walked beside us with strength. Whether it was your mother, a grandmother, an aunt, a foster parent, or a spiritual mentor—give thanks for the gift of their help.

And to all the mothers in our community, we see you. We honor your helping hands and your helping hearts. May God, our ever-present help, renew your strength and bless you richly.


