"The younger of them said to his father, 'Father, give me the share of property that is coming to me.' And he divided his property between them. Not many days later, the younger son gathered all he had and took a journey into a far country, and there he squandered his property in reckless living." Luke 15:12-13

We are thrown into this universe without a clue. We must journey all the way to the death that awaits us someday. We come from nothing and return to nothing—from eternity and return to eternity—

And yet, we Christians claim to know: why we came, who sent us, where we came from, and where we are going. **Do you know?**

Jesus answered the deep questions of our hearts through many parables. One of the most powerful is the story of the prodigal son's return— a profound image of grace, repentance, and homecoming.

Henri Nouwen wrote a deeply moving book after meditating on Rembrandt's painting The Return of the Prodigal Son. As he reflected on both the story and the painting, he found parallels between Rembrandt's own life and the journey of the prodigal son. Through this, Nouwen offered a compelling vision of what salvation truly means. We must leave in order to return.

This book has become a foundational guidepost in my own life, and I would like to share it with you through a new sermon series.

Over the next few weeks, we will explore the parable of the prodigal son by looking through the eyes of its three central figures: the Father, the Elder Son, and the Younger Son. Each represents a different spiritual posture, and each offers us a distinct invitation from God.

May this series be a time of deep reflection for all of us: **Which of these three am I? Where am I on my journey? And how is God calling me home?** I pray this series will offer you fresh insight, healing, and a renewed vision for your life.

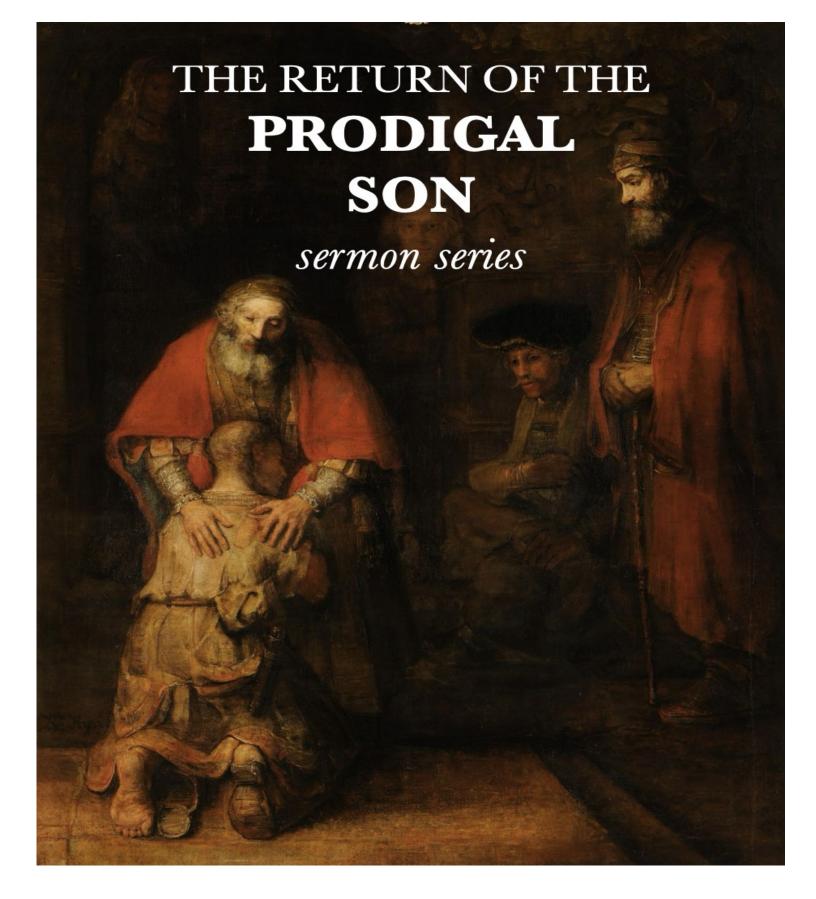

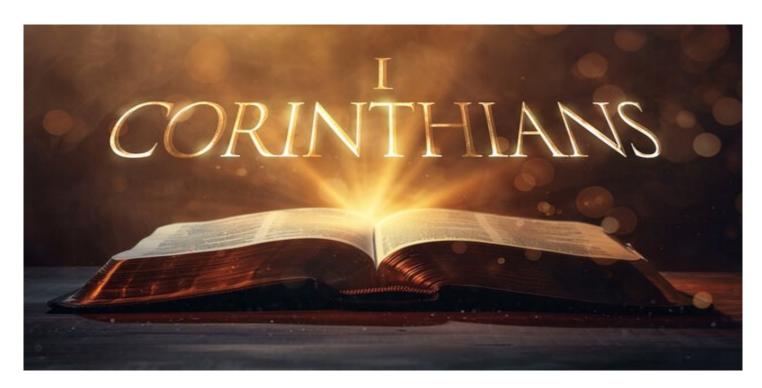
Applying Scripture to Your Daily Life August 2025

What part of your day does scripture play in your life? Is daily Bible reading a part of your day? Or does your Bible collect dust as it sits on your end table? As Christians, God has given us His Holy Word, which we are to live by and bring glory to God. As I was growing up as a young boy, the church I attended had a wonderful Sunday School. They helped build a foundation of scripture in my life. They instilled in me the habit of memorizing scripture, for which I am so thankful. So, I have a challenge that will be coming your way beginning in September. It is a weekly verse(s) of scripture intended for you to memorize, meditate on, and study during the week as it reveals God's nature and love for you.

Why Memorize Scripture? When it comes to memorizing Scripture, you're not only changing your brain, but dwelling on truth that will change your life. Here are four reasons that will benefit you.

- 1. <u>Be Rooted in Faith.</u> Memorizing Scripture, especially verses that reveal God's character, will deepen your relationship with Him and strengthen your faith. As you transition from reading the Bible to committing God's Word to memory and understanding, these truths will reinforce your faith.
- **2. Resist Temptation**. In Matthew 4:1-11, Jesus faced various temptations by Satan.. He tried to get Him to listen to His appetites rather than God. Jesus faced these temptations with scripture. Scripture memory enables these truths to remain at the forefront of your mind and heart, allowing you to grasp them when you need them most.
- **3. Renew Your Mind.** Scripture memory is a key component of renewing your mind. By rehearsing God's truth consistently and intentionally, you are more aware of thoughts that don't align with God's Word.
- **4.** <u>Make Wise Decisions.</u> The Bible is intended to provide insight into who God is, who you are, and the sacredness of life. Scripture memory makes this wisdom accessible to your mind and heart as you seek to follow Christ.

If memorizing is hard, you can reflect on these verses instead. Starting in September, a weekly scripture verse will appear in the bulletin and on Constant Contact, allowing you to memorize or study, and consider its message.

Aren't the flowers beautiful?

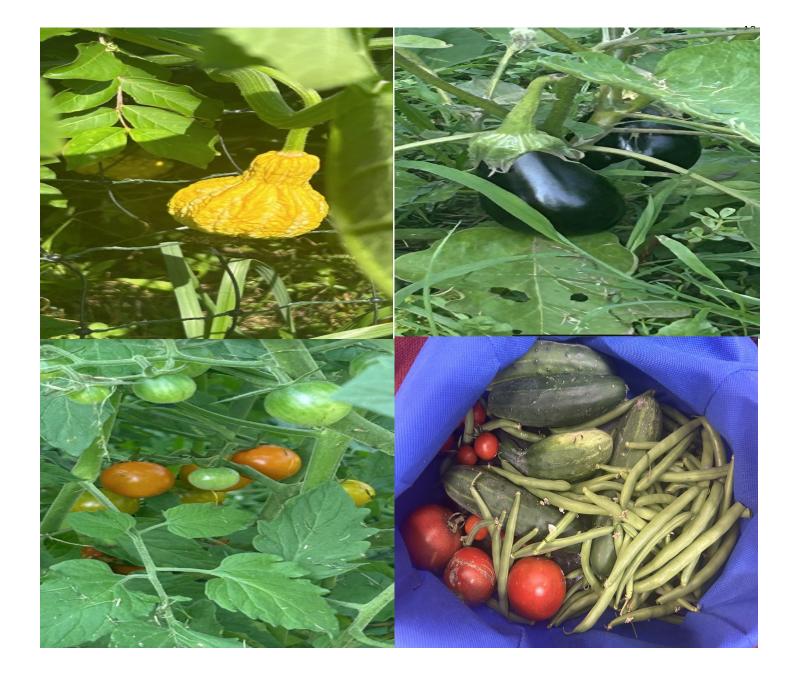
Have you noticed the array of colorful flowers as you pull up to WGUMC? We could use your help in helping them thrive for the remaining summer months.

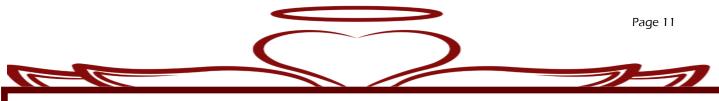


The community garden is growing!

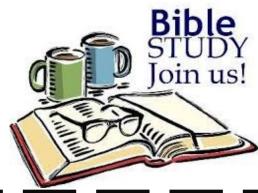
