PASTOR JIM'S CHRISTIAN LIVING COLUMN

The Cross: The Wisdom and Power of God June 2025

"For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God." 1 Cor. 1:18 (NIV) Have you ever noticed that God often works in ways that don't make sense to the world? That's exactly what the Apostle Paul is talking about in 1 Corinthians 1:18. To many people, the idea that Jesus died on a cross to save us doesn't seem wise or powerful—it seems foolish or weak. But Paul says that for those who believe, the cross is the Wisdom and Power of God.

So, what is the message of the cross?

It's this: Jesus Christ, the Son of God, came to earth, lived a sinless life, and chose to die on a cross to take the punishment for our sins. Then He rose from the dead, defeating sin and death forever. Through His sacrifice, anyone who puts their trust in Him, as the Son of God, who died for our sins, is forgiven and made right with God. That's the Good News of the cross and the Gospel.

To the world, this might not make sense. It doesn't follow human logic or power. Why would God save people by dying? Why would love look like a sacrifice? But this is how God works—through grace, not force—through humility, not pride.

For new believers, this message may be new or surprising. For longtime Christians, it's easy to take it for granted. But whether you're just starting to follow Jesus or have walked with Him for years, we all need to remember the power of the cross. It changes lives. It gives us hope. It shows us the heart of God.

So don't be ashamed of your faith. Don't worry if others don't understand. Keep trusting Jesus. Keep learning. And keep living out the message of the cross—with love, humility, and joy. Because in Christ, we see what real power and wisdom look like. Perhaps Romans 1:16 may help you verbalize your faith.

"I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God for the salvation of everyone who believes."

As you reflect on this, let me ask you, what does the message of the cross mean to you personally, and how can you live out that message in your daily life?





Shirley Daddario, President // Cindy Hoover, Vice-President Paulette Bryan, Secretary // Sharon Nesbitt, Treasurer




The United Methodist Men hold a monthly breakfast at the church. There is time for scripture, sharing, some speakers and lots of fellowship.
