### PASTOR JIM'S CHRISTIAN LIVING COLUMN

#### LIFE IS ABOUT OUR JOURNEY OF GRACE - MARCH 2025

John Wesley, the founder of Methodism, spoke about three main types of grace in his teachings. These graces describe different stages in a person's spiritual journey and relationship with God. Together, these three types of grace illustrate Wesley's belief in God's continuous work in a person's life, from awakening them to their need for salvation to forgiving them and helping them grow in holiness.

He saw grace as God's active presence in human life, not merely a one-time gift but a continual process drawing people closer to God. Wesley's three graces:

#### 1. PREVENIENT GRACE: THE GRACE THAT GOES BEFORE

1. PREVENIENT GRACE: THE GRACE THAT GUES BEFORE
Prevenient Grace is the first movement of God in our lives—His divine love and work before we are even aware of it. Wesley believed that prevenient grace is given to all people, not just Christians. It stirs within us a desire for God, even before we know Him personally. Though prevenient grace does not save a person, it enables them to respond to God and seek salvation
$\hfill\square$ Romans 5:8 – "But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us."
$\ \square$ Philippians 2:13 – "For it is God who works in you to will and to act in order to fulfill his good purpose."
2. JUSTIFYING GRACE: THE GRACE THAT SAVES
Justifying grace is God's grace that brings about our salvation. It is when a person, recognizing their sin, repents and trusts in Christ. This grace is received when we turn away from sin and trust in Jesus. Through Christ, we are no longer guilty before God. Wesley emphasized that believers could have assurance of their salvation, knowing they are truly forgiven.
$\square$ Ephesians 2:8-9 – "For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God—not by works, so that no one can boast."
$\square$ Romans 5:1 – "Therefore, since we have been justified through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ."
$\ \square$ Titus 3:5 – "He saved us, not because of righteous things we had done, but because of his mercy."
3. SANCTIFYING GRACE: THE GRACE THAT TRANSFORMS
Sanctifying grace is the ongoing work of the Holy Spirit in the believer's life, helping them grow in love, holiness, and Christlikeness. Wesley believed that salvation is not just about forgiveness but transformation. Wesley called this process "going on to perfection" (Christian perfection), meaning a deepening love for God and others. The Holy Spirit empowers believers to overcome sin and live in obedience. Sanctification is not instant but an ongoing process, it is a Lifelong Journey
$\square$ Philippians 1:6 – "Being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus."
$\ \square$ 1 Thessalonians 4:3 – "It is God's will that you should be sanctified."
$\square$ 2 Corinthians 3:18 – "And we all, who with unveiled faces contemplate the Lord's glory, are being transformed into his image with ever-increasing glory."

Wesley's view of grace paints a beautiful picture of God's ongoing work in our lives, which underscores the



## **Updates from Trustees:**

The memorial sign has been installed on the pavilion, honoring six WGUMC church families. Once the weather warms up, trustees will be installing a ceiling to minimize birds and bees from building nests underneath the roof. We can't wait to see this lovely space used as a new gathering spot for church groups in the coming years.

Just like items in your home that only last so long, the same applies to things at our church. Over the next few months, you may notice a few updates to our systems.

The AED machine is being replaced. (Automated external defibrillator, used to treat sudden cardiac arrest. It analyzes the heart's rhythm and delivers an electric shock to help restore a normal heartbeat.) In case you are not aware, the AED is in the narthex coat closet.

Once the weather warms up, we will be replacing the HVAC unit in the admin wing. And finally, trustees are in the process of obtaining estimates to replace the Fire Alarm System, which has served us well for the past 26 years, but is in need of updating.

## **Food Pantry Update**

Item of the Month <u>"Shampoo"</u> – Thank you for your generous donations of dish detergent in the <u>month of February</u>. We collected over 40 bottles of detergent.

For the month of March, we are collecting bottles of shampoo. Please put your donations in the labeled back bin in the church lobby. Let's see if we can collect at least 50 bottles of shampoo! Our families really appreciate the household items like dish detergent and shampoo, as they are not items we are able to get from the Chester County Food Bank to distribute to the families who visit our pantry.

Speaking of the **Food Bank**, we want to highlight some of the amazing support we receive from them in order to be able to help meet the needs of our neighbors.

Over 95% of the food we distribute is provided free to us from the **Chester County Food Bank**. The **Food Bank** is loaning us a double glass door refrigerator and a double glass door freezer to use as long as we continue to partner with them.

The Food Bank has helped us secure metal shelving units to store and display our food.

The Food Bank gave the church 4 tables to use in our produce distribution room.

Every Wednesday, the **Food Bank** delivers the food we have ordered. They bring a refrigerated truck, from their location in Exton, filled with four pallets of fresh produce, eggs, cheese, frozen meat and shelf stable food products.

The **Food Bank** employs a Spanish speaking woman to be at our distributions each week, to help with registering the families who speak Spanish, as well as providing additional help during and after the distributions, as we clean-up.

**The Chester County Food Bank** has about 40 other partner agencies, like our pantry, throughout Chester County. They provide the same resources and help to these agencies as they do with us.

The **Food Bank** hosts quarterly meetings that a representative from each partner agency attends, to learn more about all the resources available to both our pantries and the families we serve.
