Pasquotank County is hosting an APCO supervisor class in October. The cost is \$126.

# Project 42 Report – Situational Awareness – Brent Lee:

Web 2.0

- Definition: A 2<sup>nd</sup> generation of web services allowing interactivity by the user (i.e. iGoogle, etc)
- Will be fully integrated with the current Association Management System (AMS)
- Will automate the listserv / egroups function
- Implementation Plan
  - Platform in Production Now
  - Start beta test in next few weeks
  - Implement by 1<sup>st</sup> of 2010

<u>911 Board Report</u> – David Dodd reported on the two biggest things going on: first, several agencies are waiting on the board to give out the grants. There were 34 grant applications received totaling around 24 million dollars. The statute says we have to move money into the grant account 90 days after the new fiscal year – so by the end of September. The statute also says that if we move more than 3 million we have to *consider* reducing the surcharge. The grant committee has met a couple of times – they had hoped to make the announcements at the August meeting but there was an issue in that there were people asking for money who had really large fund balances and they had to look at the reasons why. They had no way of knowing if perhaps

the agency already had the fund balances earmarked so the grant committee to contact the agencies and find out if the funds were encumbered somewhere. The plan right now is to make the announcements at the September  $25^{\text{th}}$  board meeting in Raleigh. The other big thing is what Barry Furey alluded to – the legislature tasked the 911 board to have a 911 study group to talk about things like how funds are going to be use, developing a state 911 plan, and a plan for the delivery of 911 services. We have five 911 "votes" on this sub-committee. Currently we are doing a lot of education.

<u>Old Business</u> – We voted on the bylaw changes that have been posted on the website. Rick Thomas made a motion to pass the bylaw changes. Kenyon Harris seconded the motion. Motion carried.

New Business - The new board, with the exception of the incoming president, was sworn in.

<u>Conference Committee</u> – Jeryl Brown reported we had a lot of people looking at the East Coast Regional booth during the Vegas conference. CVENT is up and running for the conference. We have talked to all the vendors about the conference. Donna reported that CVENT worked very well and we will continue to use this on-line service for registration. The state conference for next year will again be held here at Sea Trail.

We will have an East Coast Regional conference committee meeting immediately following the NENA meeting today. We do not adjourn this meeting. We will reconvene this meeting tonight to swear Jeryl into president.

President Jeryl Brown was sworn into office during the closing banquet. The meeting was adjourned.
