## Nominations Committee

Changes to this policy can only be made by the Chapter Board of Officers, as defined in the Chapter Bylaws.

## PURPOSE

This policy outlines the structure and responsibilities of the Nominations Committee to ensure a fair and transparent process for the nomination of candidates for leadership positions.

## POLICY

## Section 1 - Establishment of Nominations Committee

1.1 The Nominations Committee is established to oversee and facilitate the nomination and election process for leadership positions within North Carolina APCO.
1.2 The Nominations Committee shall be chaired by the Immediate Past President.

## Section 2 - Committee Composition

2.1 The Nominations Committee shall consist of a minimum of four members, with the Immediate Past President serving as the Chair to include three members who have previously served on the North Carolina APCO Board of Officers.
2.2 Any additional members shall be selected by the Immediate Past President in consultation with the current Chapter President.
2.3 The Immediate Past President may consider factors such as diversity of experience, technical expertise, and representation from various regions within the state when selecting additional committee members.

## Section 3 - Responsibilities of the Nominations Committee

3.1 The Nominations Committee is responsible for ensuring that all candidates meet the eligibility criteria as defined by the Chapter Bylaws.
3.2 The Committee shall actively seek input from the membership to identify qualified candidates for leadership positions through a transparent and inclusive process.
3.3 The Committee will administer the nominations process, including the collection of nominations from the membership, verification of candidate eligibility, and the creation of the final list of candidates.
3.4 The Committee shall maintain open and clear communication with the Chapter membership throughout the process, providing regular updates on timelines, procedures, and opportunities for member input.
3.5 Committee members must disclose and recuse themselves from discussions or decisions related to any potential conflicts of interest regarding all nominees.
