North Carolina APCO Spotlight

North Carolina is the ninth largest state in the nation with a population of over 10.7 million. There are 100 counties in the state and more than 500 municipalities. And, in 2020, there were 7.1 million 9-1-1 calls placed within the state that were processed by one of 115 Primary PSAPs and nearly 3,000 telecommunicators in the state.

Our Chapter currently has over 1,500 members, representing professionals who are actively involved in many different roles in the public safety communications industry.

The North Carolina Chapter of APCO held their first Chapter Meeting on November 14, 1961 in Greensboro, NC, and on November 19, 2021, will gather again in Greensboro for our bi-monthly Chapter Meeting to celebrate the 60th anniversary of this first meeting.

Throughout the years, North Carolina APCO has proudly served as a leader throughout the state in promoting and improving the public safety communications industry. As part of this commitment to the industry, North Carolina

Introduction

The Missouri Chapter of APCO represents over 570 public safety professionals, out of an estimated 1,200 Telecommunicators in the 186 centers across the 114 counties in Missouri. Missouri APCO's Totes of Hope

Missouri APCO is excited to debut its Totes of Hope program through this newsletter! Totes of Hope began as a brainstorming session between two Chapter members during the summer of 2019, and has developed into something no one could have imagined. Totes of Hope is the first of its kind, a statewide project focused on showing support, compassion and empathy towards ECCs following times of crisis and trauma. As of October 1, 2021, the program has deployed 41 totes, with no signs of stopping. Totes are deployed for a variety of reasons, ranging from: line of duty deaths to traumatic calls involving children. Totes of Hope is not intended to replace proper Critical Incident Stress Debriefing or Peer Support Programs, but instead ensures that ECCs know that the entire state of Missouri is standing with them during these tumultuous times. (Items in each tote varies, to include: snacks, candy, adult coloring books, puzzle books, stress balls, fidget items, and notebooks.) Other Initiatives

Missouri APCO is in the midst of a revitalization period. We are creating opportunities for involvement and reaching out to members who are interest in a position, or who we feel would be a great fit for a position.

We recently launched a Young Professionals Committee, which allows us to develop our younger membership for future roles within the Chapter.

The Teammates in Action initiative was developed in 2019. Since adopting this program, was have celebrated the incredible actions and accomplishments of 11 teammates and teams across the state. This year, alone, we have celebrated the quick thinking and multi-jurisdictional teamwork by Telecommunicators that led to the successful rescue of a woman and child being held against their will that involved three counties; the successful overnight water rescue where a communications team of two used their training and knowledge of their area to determine that the victim was no longer on the roadway and had washed downstream, the team of two directed field responders to the area, and talked a Deputy to the caller's location where he risked his own life to save her from the rushing water; the selflessness of a Telecommunicator who used her own vacation time and funds to purchase food for a citizen and her three children who were stranded following a domestic dispute; the hard work and quick action of two ECCs following an abduction and AMBER alert request that resulted in the successful and safe recovery of the abducted child.


The Bylaws Committee also completed a review of the South Dakota governing documents and returned them to their Chapter President with our recommendations.





One of the most challenging questions for those that are looking to start a Compassionate Care Program is: <u>What is a qualifying event?</u> Responses to this question were:


