Fannie, Rita and Dottie are longtime good friends and musical performers with a long resume of performances in musicals. and are doing one more show, but not the last show, as they supportively sing and dance and provide a potpourri of humor and advice and all with involvement with the audience.

Three Old Broads Synopsis

"Three Old Broads" is a two act Musical with three attractive older and mature show business ladies during opening night of the Musical. The Three Old Broads are

Fannie and Rita and Dottie, who have been in musical theater forever. Dressed in chorus line type costumes for most of the musical and other costumes, they sing and dance a variety of songs. Many of the songs are "girl" songs celebrating performing women and show business. Also, they provide several potpourri of jokes to provide them with an identity, and to connect with and entertain the audience.

The Three Old Broad ladies are an "act" on and off the stage, and the intention is to develop an insight into their personal backgrounds. The Girls are close old friends and they demonstrate their love of performing and being on the stage together. "The "An Occasional Guy" is David who supports the story in several scenes and performs "Three Old Broads and a Guy" with the Ladies. Sam has voiceover appearances as the Lighting and Sound Director. An "occasional guy' participates and performs in several scenes.

There are 10 scenes and nine songs in Act 1; and eight scenes and nine songs in Act 2. There are only two sets: one is the Three Old Broads dressing room and the other is the full Stage with minimal props. The Musical begins with an all dialogue first scene to engage the audience and reveal who the Three Old Broads are. The musical spirit and the lyrics of the *Three Old Broads* song encapsulates the spirit and professionalism of the three old broads.

☐ Character Descriptions

Girl 1/Fannie Girl 1 is Fannie; an older and mature show biz professional who sings and dances; dresses in chorus line costumes and other costume; upbeat by her show biz presence; extroverted and smiling; demeanor of very attractive but older chorus line girl whose age is can be forties or older.

All of the girls are long time musical theater performer; and they are good friends on and off stage. Fannie is widowed, has children, and still feels the anxiety and nervousness of performing.

Girl 2/ Rita Girl 2 is Rita and basically the same show business description as Girl

1. Rita is divorced; very out spoken about her love interests, and has a very active romantic life.

Girl 3/ Dottie Girl 3 is Dottie; basically the same show business description as Girl 1.

Dottie is married and is a leveling influence among the other girls.

Girls Assignments

The cast assignments are for Girl 1, Girl 2, Girl 3, and Girls

(all three Girls) for the musical numbers and dialogue. The intention is to provide the Girls with equal thirds of the script and balanced performance opportunities. The TOB all appear in every scene.

Creative ideas and assignments can be changed for speaking, singing and dancing parts among the three Girls for the final production.

Guy/David David is the "Guy" in "Three Old Broads and a Guy." David is older than the girls.. He is dressed in a tuxedo, bow tie and top hat. David sings "Three Old Broads and a Guy" and participates in several scenes dancing and singing. David is a long time musical theater performer and kids about his having an insignificant part in the musical. Guy appears in four scenes.


□ Author Biography

Assignments of Parts for the Three Old Broads

- The Book identifies the three Ladies as Girl 1 (Fanny) and Girl 2 (Rita) 1 and Girl 3 (Dottie), and Girls (for all three girls). The girls are only identified with their actual names in Act 1 Scene 1 in the theater dressing room. Scene 1 is completely dialogue scene introducing the Girls and the musical.
- For the remainder of the Musical all references are Girl 1, Girl 2, Girl 3, and Girls (all girls)
- The music and dialogue are given to each performer for a balanced "one third" assignments across the Musical.
- In the production it will be possible to modify the assignments among Girl 1, Girl 2 and Girl3.

RITA AND DOTTIE GIRL 2 AND GIRL 3

(ENTER TOGETHER FROM STAGE RIGHT) (WEAR COATS OVER THEIR COSTUMES)

Hi Fannie! Why are you always so early?

FANNIE

Hi, dears. I'm so glad you're both here. I was worried. I'm so glad you're here Rita. (A HUG) I missed you Dottie. (A HUG)

GIRLS

(ALL HUG IN A CIRCLE)

RITA GIRL 2

You look great.

DOTTIE GIRL3

My God Fanniey--- when did you get here?

FANNIE

About three hours ago.

DOTTIE

You're going to be pooped before the show starts.

FANNIE

I'm so nervous. What's good for diarrhea?

DOTTIE

I just said you were going to be pooped and now you have diarrhea. I am so prophetic.

RITA

(LAUGHS)

Yes, Dottie you have this precognitive way to anticipate diarrhea.

DOTTIE

Particularly because your name is Fannie. (HESITATES) Yes, if the show goes into the crapper, we can blame Fannie.

RITA

(KIDDING SARCASTICALLY)

You really are so---UNCLEVER with your puns.

FANNIE

(SITS AT TABLE LITTLE TENSE)

I really shouldn't be nervous. We have been rehearing forever. And after all the years we've been performing in musicals you would think I was over getting nervous.

RITA

(PUTS ARM AROUND FANNIE)

Speaking of all those years, I think that show we did for Abraham Lincoln went very well. Until John Wilkes Booth showed up. He really killed the show.

DOTTIE

That's why we never played that theater again. (HESITATES) Darling, there's always a lot of tension before a performance. We've been there before so many times. Hell, we were doing Cole Porter and Irving Berlin and Richard Rodgers musicals when they were all alive. Well, not quite but it sounds good.

FANNIE

My favorite part was in "Sound of Music" when I played the Mother Superior. I was hiding behind the nun's habit and nobody could see me. It made me feel safe.

RITA

I tried out for that part one time. They said I was too busty and had to tape these suckers down---(GRABS BOSSOM) with duct tape if I wanted the part. I'm not putting duct tape on these bazookas. Nuns have boobs, but they just don't use them. I got them and I'm going to use them.

DOTTIE

(TAKES OFF COAT, SHOWS HER CHORUS LINE COSTUME)

There is no hiding behind these sexy slinky chorus line outfits.

(WEARS BRIGHT COLORFUL SNEAKERS,

SHOWS OFF SNEAKERS AND JUMPS AROUND)

Can I do the show in my sneakers? I'm not going to put my dancing shoes on until the very last minute. My feet hurt.

FANNIE

My goodness, you both dressed at home.

RITA

It's so much easier.

(TAKES OFF COAT, WEARS CHORUS LINE COSTUME)

RITA, FANNIE, DOTTIE

(DURING REMAINDER OF SCENE COMPLETE DRESSING & DOING MAKE UP, SITTING OR STANDING AT DRESING TABLES)

RITA

I stopped at Larry's store and took off my coat so he could see me. I just love Larry's body. I was hoping he would stick his tongue in my ear.

DOTTIE

That's disgusting.

RITA

(GRABS HER HEAD AND SHAKES IT)

Have I ever told you about the hot dreams I have about him?

DOTTIE

Please don't---it may bring on one of my hot flashes.

FANNIE

Larry must be more than fifteen years younger than you. You almost could be his mother.

RITA

Yes you're so right---- and I would love to breast feed him.

(SNAPS BOTH ARMS AROUND HER BREASTS,

SHOVES AND PUMPS ONE ARM IN THE AIR)

Yes!

DOTTIE

(LOOKS IN MIRROR AT HER FACE)

My God, just look at those wrinkles. I'm not going to put makeup on---I'm going to lather it on with a trowel.

RITA

Just be thankful that wrinkles don't hurt. If they did we would all be in agony.

(LOOKS IN THE MIRROR, MAKES FACES)

Sometimes I hate that lady in the mirror.

DOTTIE

Imagine how it was in the days of BBS.

RITA

What the hell is BBS?

DOTTIE

Before Botox shots.

RITA

You never told me you had Botox treatments.

DOTTIE

Darling, they have a room set aside at the clinic with my name on a gold plaque. I go there so much I get frequent flyer mileage.

FANNIE

How do you think our final dress rehearsal went?

DOTTIE

I think we are all great. You know---there is such a thing as over rehearsing and you get stale before the first performance.

FANNIE

I had to rest yesterday. I tried doing nothing.

RITA

Larry slept over last night and I told him that there is no sex the night before an opening night performance. (HESITATES). Then I made an exception. (HESITATES) Two times!

DOTTIE

You sound like someone training for the Olympics. So what did Larry do?

RITA

He said, I'm glad I didn't stay home with my wife.

FANNY

Oh Rita dear. One of these days you're going to get in trouble.

RITA

When the sexual revolution is over, I will still have plenty of ammunition.

DOTTIE

Can we go over that step in "We're Not Getting Old?"

RITA, DOTTIE, FANNIE

(GO TO CENTER STAGE,

PRACTICE THE STEP AS THEY SING LYRICS TO "WE'RE NOT GETTING OLD WE'RE GETTNG BETTER," WITH NO MUSIC)

We're not getting old we're getting better

And being too young is really uncouth

Because getting old is really a pleasure

There are too many dreams just wasted on youth

FANNIE

Just moving around relaxes me.

RITA

I feel the same way with sex.

DOTTIE

Sex, sex, sex is all you talk about. I am so lucky to have Jack. Sex with love is really great.

RITA

However Dottie... sex without love isn't bad either.

SAM (VOICE OVER)

Good evening, Ladies. Or should I say Three Old Broads. You realize I can see everything and hear everything in this theater. So if you intend to strip down let me know.

DOTTIE

Sam, you are a dirty lecherous disgusting obnoxious voyeur.

SAM (VOICE OVER)

It's so good to be known for what you are good at and at the same time loved anyhow.

RITA

(STARTS TO PUT CIGARETTE IN HER MOUTH)

DOTTIE

Rita, you really shouldn't be smoking.

RITA

Baby, I'm not even going to light it. It just relaxes me.

DOTTIE

Do you light up after sex?

RITA

No darling--- (HESITATES AND VERY SEXY)- I just kind of sizzle.

(LAUGHS)

They did a study and found out Olympic athletes that have sex the night before their events performs as good or better than those that do not have sex.

DOTTIE

Darling, we are not athletes.

RITA

That's not what Larry tells me.

DOTTIE

(LAUGHS)

Why the hell did I go there?

FANNY

Dottie, do you think your husband Jack will come back to see us before the show starts?

DOTTIE

I told him not to. I have my own show business superstitions, and I think visitors before the show are bad luck.

RITA

I have my own superstitions. For instance I will not change my underwear after we have a great rehearsal. One good rehearsal and the underwear stay.

DOTTIE

And exactly when did we have what you consider a great rehearsal?

RITA

The one we had about one weeks ago.

FANNIE

Are those the same underwear you wore when you had sex with Larry?

RITA

Darling, I don't wear underwear when I'm having sex.

(HESITATES)

Besides it was only a quickie.

DOTTIE

So it was a quickie, You did it all in one breath.

RITA

Well---(LONG PAUSE)--- it was actually a quickie for Jack.

(LAUGH AND HESITATES)

I took my time. In fact he was sleeping when the train arrived.

FANNIE

(GIVES RITA A HUG)

I love you Rita (GIVES RITUA A HUG) Since I lost my husband, Jim, I live a quiet life. It takes all the energy I have when I'm doing theater.

RITA

Fannie, you really should come out with me some time. Really, you need a release.

FANNIE

Well, I have the kids and I have the theater, and I have you gals. I'm happy. You know---I've been doing theater all my life and I don't know how I would have survived without it. Seriously.

RITA

I originally did it because I thought it was a way to pick up guys. (PAUSE) Then my first husband found out what I was doing. I was promiscuous before I could spell the word. (LAUGHS) It was a bad marriage anyhow. I remember playing one of the girls in West Side Story. It seems like yesterday or not too many yesterday's ago. And here we are---

(STRETCHES OUT ARMS) --- in "Three Old Broads.' And I couldn't be happier than to be with you two old broads.

FANNIE

I went to church Sunday and prayed we would have a great performance. I lit a candle for all of us.

(FANNIE, RITA, AND DOTTIE

HUDDLE AND HOLD HANDS)

RITA

Would it be inappropriate to throw in something about our sex lives in the prayer?

DOTTIE

If God is a "she," you may have a chance.

(GIVES FANNIE A HUG)

I know, Sweetie, it will, bring us good luck.

DAVID (GUY)

(ENTERS FROM STAGE RIGHT,

DRESSED IN TUXEDO, BOW TIE, TOP HAT)

I'm here! Good evening ladies. I have a dozen new ideas and some changes, and we have fifteen minutes to work it out.

(GIVES ALL THE GIRLS A HUG)

You know I'm kidding.

FANNIE

Our most illustrious Director!

DOTTIE

Our wonderful choreographer!

RITA

Our marvelous singer and dancer!

DAVID

It is shameful they way you praise me. Well, you all know I was lucky to get the part.

RITA

(LAUGH)

Yes, you picked yourself.

DAVID

I am old and a Renaissance Man. A modern day Leonardo da Vinci.

DAVID

(PATS RITA ON THE ASS)

Has your ass dropped a little. It seems a little less firm.

RITA

Considering that's probably as close as you have come to having a sexual experience in

the last two months---don't complain.

DAVID

Rita, you know me so well. Where do you find this much talent preserved in a well in a fifty year old man? And with a lifetime supply of Viagra, life will always be good.

Did you hear that Viagra makes your nails fall off.?

DAVID

(HOLDS HANDS OUT WITH FINGERS FOLDED IN)

I didn't think you would notice. Remember Rita, I told you that if you would sleep with me, I would give you some of the best songs.

RITA

Darling, if I slept with you, I would hate myself in the morning.

DAVID

Darling, we would both hate ourselves in the morning.

(APPROACHES FANNIE)

That footwork you have been working on is fine, Fannie. You'll do great.

I love you all and it's going to be in a great show. You gals put the work and sweat into it.

FANNIE

I know we can do it.

DAVID

Darling, when you love the theater all things are possible. Maybe we should say a prayer together.

DOTTIE

My God! A guy that hasn't been to church since the Spanish Inquisition and now he wants us to pray.

DAVID

Ok, how about a rabbit's foot? That has a kind of religious connotation.

(LOOKS UP AT CEILING)

Hey Sam, are you all set for the big show.

(STAGE GOES BLACK FOR LONG MOMENT,

LIGHTS GO ON)

SAM (VOICE OVER)

Sorry David but I must have hit the wrong switch. I'll try to do better during the show. Just keep in mind David, I have a lot of power and influence from where I sit.

DAVID

Yes, I understand. but let's get things going.

SAM (VOICE OVER)

David, you didn't say please.

DAVID

I'm the director. I don't have to say please.

SAM (VOICE OVER)

(STAGE GOES BLACKAGAIN, HESITATION, I'm waiting,---David.

DAVID

Please.

SAM (VOICE OVER) You have to say pretty please.

DAVID
Cut the crap, Sam. (HESITATES) OK! Pretty please!

SAM (VOICE OVER)

Now that we have established the pecking order I think we will have a great evening.

DAVID I have a broom closet down the hall for a dressing room. I turned around and bruised my nose. Hey, that's show business.

David, can I remind you that you don't appear almost the end of the first Act.

DAVID
Yes, it is a pity and a real burden on the audience.

FANNIE
David, I don't understand why after all of these years I still get nervous.

DAVID

DOTTIE

(VERY DRAMATICALLY)

Just imagine there's an audience out there. It's opening night. You can feel the excitement You can smell the excitement. Every seat is taken. The air is electric. And all of us show biz people know.

(SINGS WITH NO MUSIC)
There's no business like show business
Like no business I know
Everything about it is appealing
Everything that traffic will allow

FANNIE

But it's hard to imagine the audience You can't see them you, you can't hear them.

DAVID

There's an audience out there. Sam put the lights on the audience.

(NO LIGHTS GO ON)

Sam, pretty! Please put the damn audience lights on.

LIGHTING

(LIGHTS UP AUDIENCE)

DAVID

Just imagine there is a real audience out there. Just imagine that at the snap of a finger we can make them applaud before we even do anything.

GIRL 3 I quit when I found out there were no speaking parts.
GIRL 2 You know show business has improved my sex life.
GIRL 3 Really!
GIRL 2 Yes, now I have sex four times a week.
GIRL 1 That's wonderful.
GIRL 2 I think it is too. I just hope my husband doesn't find out about it.
GIRL 2 The director really likes me. He asked me if I would be the mother of his children.
GIRL 2 What did you say?
GIRL 3 I asked him how many children does he have.
GIRL 1 Is it true the director got fresh with you during rehearsal?
GIRL 3 Let's put it this way. His hands should have had a search warrant.
GIRL 1 I just got a part in a play. I play the part of a lady who is a millionaire.
GIRL 2 How did you prepare for the part?

 $\mbox{GIRL}\ 1$ The director gave me a hundred dollars in cash to carry around during rehearsals to get a feel for the part.

Oh, it's one of those June and December affairs.

GIRL 3

Yes, darling, and he is DEFINITELY Christmas.

GIRL 1

Speaking of rich people, I told my best girlfriend about my rich old uncle.

GIRL 3

That was nice of you.

GIRL 1

Yes, now she's my rich young aunt. (HESITATES) Think about it!

GIRL 2

I recently performed in the theater and I really MOVED the audience.

GIRL 3

Yes, I heard about it, they all left after the first act

GIRL 1

My agent told me he would call me when a part for an older woman's came up. I reminded him I AM A YOUNG WOMAN. He said, don't worry. By the time he found a part for me I would be an OLD woman.

GIRL 2

To get a part in a play I once had to sleep with the producer, the director and the stage manager. After rehearsals started they all said that I was so bad in every part that they had to let me go.

So they fired you?

GIRL 2

Well it wasn't that easy. It's the same old story. Before they would let me go; I had to sleep with all of them again. They wanted a second chance to be certain they made the right decision.

GIRL 3

Well, I was in a play and on opening night that audience started booing and heckling me every time I was on stage. So I just stepped forward on the stage and told them: "What the hell are you mad at me for, I didn't write this crap."

GIRL 2

I was looking at the beautiful bald guy back there

(POINTS TO A MAN, VERY DRAMATIC)

I just think that bald men are so hot. They give me goose bumps.

You can imagine what a bald man can do with his head that would---

Oh my goodness (HESITATE) if I say it I will get me in jail.

GIRL 2

What do you call lice on a bald man's head?

(HESITATES AND NO RESPONSE)

Homeless.

(HESITATES AND TO THE AUDIENCE) Think about it.

GIRL 3

What do you call a bunch of rabbits hopping backwards?

(HESITATES)

You call it a--- receding hare line.

(HESITATES)

Think about it, Folks. The jokes aren't going to get any better. A receding HARE line. (TO The AUDIENCE) It's HARE like in rabbit. I'm not going to explain every joke.

GIRL 1

You have to remember it is an older audience.

GIRL 2

One of the best things about being bald is that when you are through having sex---

(HESITATES, PUTS HAND THROUGH HER HAIR)

you don't have to spend all of that time straightening out your hair. Oh, you lucky guys.

GIRL 3

What did the bald man say when he got a comb for his birthday?

(HESITATES)

Thank you so much. I will never PART with it. (VERY AFTER LAST LINE) it. Another one that you really have to listen and think about it.

GIRL 2

Now that's a bad joke.

A man asked his doctor for a cure for baldness. The doctor suggested he spread pig manure all over his head. "Will that cure my baldness," the man asked. "Hell no, but nobody will be near enough to notice you are bald.)

Come on now. The jokes all can't be great.

A man goes to the barber with a beautiful crop of hair and says "I will give you ten thousand dollars if you make my hair look like yours."

(WALKS UP TO THE AUDIENCE)

If you are thinking about the double meaning of that ----don't go there. Dirty dirty dirty minds! Shame on all of you. Particularly the ladies.

GIRL 2

Yes those bald guys are really hot. Plus they don't have to worry about their scalp turning gray.

GIRL 3

You can see all of the ladies laughing. But deep down the ladies are thinking, as the men get THIN on the TOP, the ladies are getting FAT on the BOTTOM.

GIRL 2

Oh that's going to win you a lot of new friends in the audience.

GIRL 3

I don't want to ruin my reputation as a bitch.

GIRL 1

To all you lovely bald men in the audience, we love you.

And thank you for letting us find the humor in our lives.



I don't know if you know, but putting me into this show was an afterthought. I get no respect. Please pick up your program. Please take a minute. I've got time so look at your program. Look closely. Have you noticed on the title page of the program that it says in (RAISES VOICE) very large print-THREE OLD BROADS IN LARGE PRINT!

(DEPICTS WITH HIS FINGERS)

Then in tiny tiny print it says---

(WHISPERS)

"And An Occasional Guy." Which is about the size of a flea's butt. That's me. I am the occasional guy. Doesn't it kind of cheapen my appearance for the one big number I have-

--there is a mess up on my scene. It mocks me. And I despise being mocked.

GUY

(QUESTIONS THE AUDIENCE,

ENCOURAGES A RESPONSE)

Can you honestly say that I look like an occasional guy? Do I look like I'm easy? Remember what you're mothers told you: If you have nothing nice to say, then say nothing.

(LOOKS UP AT THE BOOTH)

Hey, Darth Vader there is no intermission. I'm going on. Really! I am going to do the whole scene. The act I am going to do started out as a brief intermission for a costume change for the Three Old Broads—(HESITATION). Who am I to be bitching about those----

(LOOKING AROUND)

Three Old Broad.

(LEANS OVER TO THE AUDIENCE)

Can you keep a secret? Well, can you?

(PROMPTING FOR SOME APPLAUCE)

The Three Old Broads all are really special---but a little spoiled. Let me tell you a little about them. Can they hear me?

For the Three Broads, their idea of cooking dinner is calling for reservations at a restaurant.

One of them, I can't tell you which one---thinks she's a nymphomaniac---because she has sex every other month. Please don't tell them you heard it from me.

The last time one of them cleaned house she found her high school graduation picture. It was on the kitchen table.

One of them called me the other night and asked me to come over to her house because nobody was home. I went there and she was right---there was nobody was home.

You know the difference between having sex with one of them and a boiled egg. At least for the boiled egg--- it takes three minutes.

One of them called me over the other night and said her bedroom had mirrors on the walls and mirrors on the ceiling and mirrors on the floors. She said bring a bottle and come over. So I went over and bought a BOTTLE of Windex and I did all the mirrors.

One of them called me the other night and said she just finished dinner and asked if I wanted to come over. I said sure, I guess for a little romancing. She said no--- just to do

the dishes and a load of wash.

I asked where the bathroom was for my dressing room, and I was told to go out of my dressing room door and make a right and walk five minutes.

(HESITATION)

I walked two blocks to the nearest Seven Eleven store for a bathroom.

I asked one of the ladies what acts my number would be in. She said the third act. I said, there are only two acts in the musical. She said, all you do is BITCH BITCH.

(LOOKS UP TO THE BOOTH)

Hey, Sam --give me a little vamp music.

SAM (VOICE OVER)

Here it comes.

MUSIC

(VAMP FOR "THREE OLD BROADS AND A GUY")

GUY

A little louder. Now that is the way I want the vamp when I come on stage. .

MUSIC (LOWERS)

GUY

(LOOKS UP AT THE BOOTH)

Hey, Sam what's with the lights?

SAM (VOICE OVER)

What do you need?

GUY

When I come out--- how about lighting that backstage area.

LIGHTS

(BACKSTAGE AREA IS LIGHTED)

GUY

Give me some spotlights and lighting on the side stage

LIGHTS

(SPOTLIGHTS AND SIDE LIGHTING)

GUY

Great! Now give me some fog. It adds a little mystique to the entrance.

PROP MAN

(PERSON FROM THE WINGS WALKS OUT, BLOWS PUFF OF SMOKE IN HIS FACE FROM A CIGARETTE AND EXITS) **GUY**

I hope you're not inhaling when you do that. Sam, that's not much fog.

SAM (VOICE OVER)

You do your shtick and I'll do my shtick. We're operating on a tight budget.

GUY

OK, enough with the lights and the fog and the music.

(TALKS TO THE AUDIENCE)

Look! I'm going to go backstage and make an entrance. The vamp music is going to start. The backstage will light up and the spotlights will go on. Then I'll make my grand entrance.

Now I hate to beg for attention and adulation----but I will if I have to. It would be great if as I enter the stage, the audience would SPONTANEOUSLY AND ENTHUSIASTICALLY AND SINCERELY GIVE ME A STANDING OVATION. It will bring tears to my eyes and from the bottom of my heart I will thank you.

It will give those Three Old Broads the idea that I'm important instead of that old ME ME ME stuff they give me.

(MOVES OFF TO STAGE AND QUICKLY RETURNS)

Remember, it has to be SPONTANEOUS AND ENTHUSIASTIC---- and most of all from the heart.

(POINTS TO A MAN IN THE AUDIENCE)

If you are confused, then pleaser have you wife explain it to you.

GUY

(EXITS STAGE LEFT)

LIGHTS

(FADE TO DARK, LIGHTS UP)

MUSIC

(INTRODUCTION VAMP TO

"THREE OLD BROADS AND A GUY"

GUY

(ENTERS FROM CENTER STAGE)

PROP MAN

(ENTERS FROM WINGS, BLOWS PUFF OF SMOKE FROM A CIGARETTE IN HIS FACE AND EXITS))

AUDIENCE

(STANDS AND APPLAUDS)

GUY

(Verse 1)

All I want is to sing and dance
Won't you give me one more chance
If you do my hearts gonna fly

It would be so heavenly
To be the man I want to be
It would really have its rewards
If I try to be part of
Three Old Broads and a guy

GUY

(Verse 2)

Got my hat and I got my tux

All I need's a lot of luck

Love to dance so don't wonder why

When I hear the dancing beat
Watch my moves and watch my feet
Everyone will be overawed
Watch me try to be part of
Three Old Broads and a guy

GIRLS
(ENTER FROM CENTER STAGE,
WHILE GUY SINGS)

ALL GIRLS

(Verse 3) (SING AND DANCE VERSE 3)

He's our guy he will start a rage
Dancing singing on our stage
Hello joy those old blues goodbye

Come join us here in our show Sing and dance because we know You are so good we are overawed So please try to be part of Three Old Broads and a guy

(Verse 4)

We're so glad that's really a fact You'll sing and dance/ in our act We're so happy we really could cry

We're so glad to have a man You are a part of our plan To sing and dance on these boards

So let's fly You are part of Three old broads And a guy

GIRL 1

(SPEAKS)

You really are our Guy.

GUY

(SPEAKS)

Did you say I'm your guy? Did you say guy? Let me tell you---what I really am.

GUY (SINGS)

(Release 1)

I'm a bloke and a buddy and fellow and a chap I'm an hombre and a pal and a kid and a sap I a dowdy and a dandy and a jock and a jack I'm a bozo and a John and a hustler and a hack I'm a kid and a man and a mark and a horse Then I'm one more things of course

(Release 2)

I'm a best guy, worst guy, bad guy short guy I'm hi guy bye guy spry guy sport guy I'm a big guy fat guy dumb guy tall guy

I'm a wise guy smart guy good guy fall guy Whatever I am I'm definitely ---all guy

I'm the guy

GUY (SINGS)

(Release 3)

You are fabulous wonderful marvelous
And slightly greater than divine
You are stupendous fantastic categorically
A marvel of our time
You are extraordinary incredible amazing
And astonishingly sublime
You are astounding colossal unbelievable
And ostensibly in your prime

GUY

(CHANGE TEMPO)

For these three old broads

They don't make them like this anymore

For these three old broads They make me so happy

It makes me want to cry

For these three old broads They make me feel good Right here in my heart

GIRLS AND GUY

Yes, for these three old broads and a guy Yes for these three old broads and a guy Yes for these three old broads and a guy

GIRLS AND GUY

(SINGS "THREE OLD BROADS AND A GUY"0

Got our song and dancing shoes

Just happy days no more blues

Love to dance so don't wonder why

When we hear that dancing beat

Watch our moves and watch our feet

Everyone will be overawed

Watch us try

We're all part of Three old broads and a guy Three old broads and a guy Three old broads and a guy

GIRLS, GUY

(GUY KISSES THE HAND OF EACH GIRL)
ALL WALK TOWARDS FRONT CENTER STAGE)

(AUDIENCE APPLAUDS GIRLS AND GUY BOW)

(FADE TO DARK)

(END OF ACT 2 SCENE 5)

But, how do we know how much gas is still in the tank.

GIRL 1

I'm going to sing my last song at my funeral.

GIRL 2

Oh that is an engaging idea. And how are you going to do that.

They can play a recording of Me singing. And after everybody applauds I will have an encore and have them play again.

GIRL 2

I don't want to know when I sing my last song. It would be a bad premonition. I hope I'm in bed. (HESITATES) With somebody I really care about. (HESITATES) And joins me five minutes later.

GIRL 2

I think we will never have to sing our last song.

(GIRLS MOVE TO CENTER STAGE) SONG; I'LL SING MY LAST SONG

GIRLS (SING)

Chorus 1

I'll sing my last song

But not today

My dreams are still big

I need to sing one more gig

There's one final thing I'll say

I'll sing my last song

But not today

As long as I breathe

One more song's what i need

I'll sing my last song

(Verse 1)

GIRL 1

No, I don't. I just tell everyone I'm the same age as my husband

(HESITATES)

and then I lie about his age.

GIRL 2

I stopped having birthdays. In fact this year is the tenth anniversary of my last birthday.

GIRL 1

Old age is ten years from now, and ten years from now it will be ten years from then —and ten from now --- oh forget it.

GIRL 2

(INTERRUPTS)

I get it, I get it.

GIRL 3

(POINTS TO SOMEONE IN AUDIENCE))

See that guy over in the corner. He's going through his second childhood--- so he's having braces put on his dentures.

GIRL 1

Did you know---there's a girl in this town having sex every five minutes.

GIRL 2

Go find her (HEITATES) she must be exhausted.

GIRL1

Did you hear about the old guy who said he is eighty five and he can't pee anymore?

GIRL 2

That's OK. If he's eight five---he's peed enough.

GIRL 3

This is the kind of crowd that thinks an early bird dinner----is lunch.

GIRL 1

I noticed that guy in the front row has had his fingers crossed for the entire performance. I guess it's his way of hoping that we would have good luck and have a good show.

GIRL 2

No--he's got arthritis in his hands.

GIRL 3

You think we're old. There are people in the audience with dentures older than us.

GIRL 1

I was talking to a guy in the audience who is 85 years old and he's getting married next week to a 25 year old girl. I told him the sex alone could end in death. He said---the hell with her, if she dies, she dies.

GIRL 2

You have to watch for the O-U-T or OUT problem

GIRL 3

What is the OUT problem?

GIRL 1

It may be true that life begins at fifty. But have you noticed at fifty everything starts to wear OUT or fall OUT or spread OUT.

GIRL 2

There are three signs of old age. The first is your loss of memory.

(HESITATES)

GIRL 3

(INTERRUPTS)

Well what are the other two?

GIRL 1

(HESITATES)

I forget the other two.

GIRL2

You're getting old when you don't care where your husband goes--- just as long as you

don't have to be with him. (HESITATES) The ladies understand that one.

GIRL 3

Middle age is when work is a lot less fun and fun is a lot more work.

GIRL 1

Statistics show that at past the age of sixty, there are five women to every man. My God---- isn't that wonderful for a guy to get those odds?

(TALKS TO MAN IN THE AUDIENCE)

Would you men even know what to do with five women?

(HESITATES, STARES, POINTS TO A MAN)

I know, you're thinking, you're thinking--- you dirty dirty dirty dirty old man.

GIRL 3

By the time a woman is smart enough to know how to find the right man--- she's too damned old to find the right man.

GIRL 2

Well---it's been a wonderful night and the audience is still awake.

GIRL 1

How do we ever thank these lovely people ---for being here---for your applause---- for pretending they don't mind the old age jokes?

GIRL 2

For those lovely sexy hot bald guys not minding all of the bald jokes---we applaud you. And we love you.

(GIRLS APPLAUD)

(SONG: THREE OLD BROADS VAMP BEGINS)

GIRL 1

We are just three old broads who love being on this stage.

GIRL 2

We loved and enjoyed every minute for the opportunity to entertain you.

GIRL 3

We hope the music and the words and the funny stuff brought you some joy.

GIRL 1

Please add our songs and joy in entertaining----- you to the soundtrack of your life.

GIRL 2

And we thank you and we applaud you for your applause and your warmth and the love we feel from this wonderful audience.

SONG THREE OLD BROADS FINALE

(Verse 1)

We're three old broads
Still bumping and grinding it
Show biz all the way
