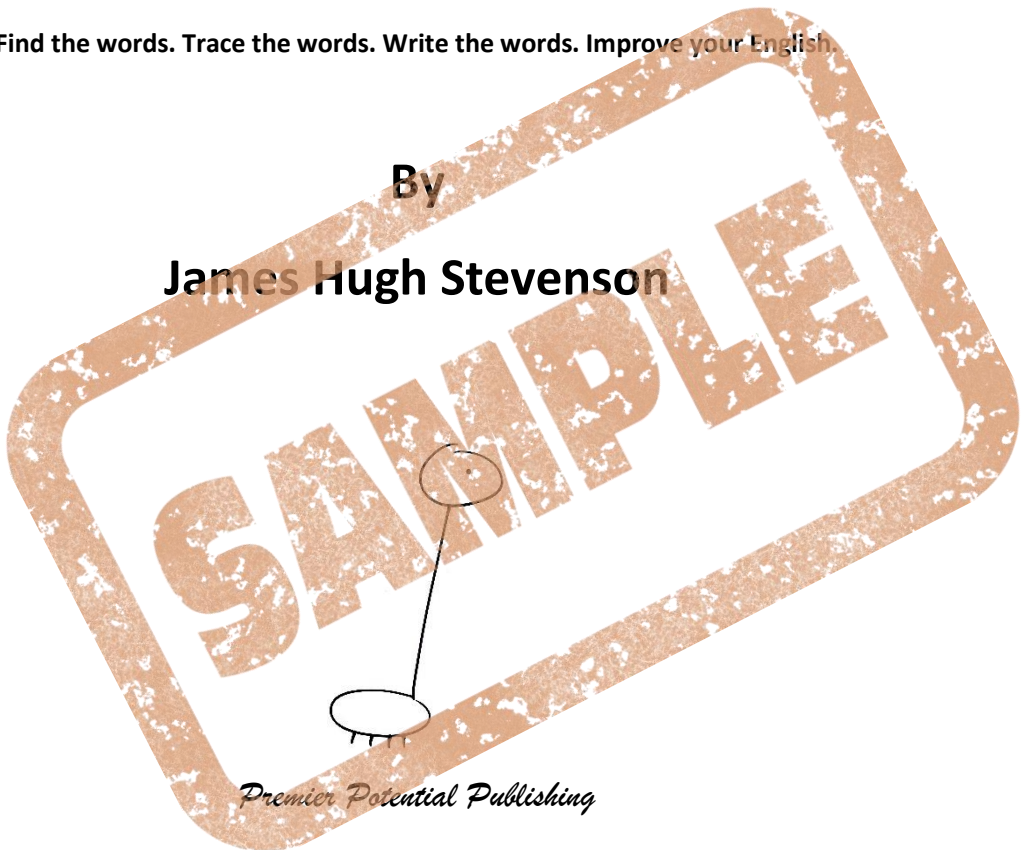

Introduction

This workbook was designed to help English language learners improve their English vocabulary for the IELTS test.

The words chosen for this textbook are suitable for IELTS band 5 and above.

In traditional wordsearches the student simply highlights or circles the words once they have found them. The wordsearches in this workbook are in a dotted font. The words are designed to be traced rather than simply highlighted. This process strengthens retention of the word. It is easier to remember new words if you write them down.

After each puzzle is completed, there are exercises to help the learner understand how to use the word in a sentence. There are ten scrambled sentences for each wordsearch. The exercises provide example sentences of how the word can be used in a sentence. By completing the exercises after each wordsearch students will be able understand how to use the words and this will help with word retention.
