granting them permanent status. Since then, women have broken barrier after barrier — serving in combat roles, rising through the ranks, and making history at every level of leadership. Today, women make up 17.5% of active-duty personnel, representing every branch of service.


Despite these milestones, women remain underrepresented in military leadership. Since the beginning of the Trump administration, many of the military's top-ranking female officers have been removed from their positions, including Adm. Linda Fagan, the first woman to lead the U.S. Coast Guard. Officials cited an "excessive focus on diversity programs," undermining decades of progress and limiting role models for the next generation.

Today on Veterans Day, let us honor women veterans not only by recognizing their historic service but by standing up for equality and leadership opportunities in the military." *


