Our book group holds hybrid meetings on the second Wednesday of each month at

a standoff at a private home in flagrant violation of the Immigrant Trust Directive. Our partners Resistencia are on the scene — where one has already been arrested by Trenton Police for asking the ICE agents for a warrant — as are an aide to Rep. Watson Coleman and the Mayor. Everyone is asked to email the City Council to call for this injustice to be resisted. It doesn't matter if you don't live there, this affects the whole state and how it will be threatened going forward..."

Later, I received the following: "UPDATE: ICE was eventually turned away, the one activist arrested has been released, and our email—senders got strong replies from at least two Council members, one of whom is pasted below; thanks to all who rallied on short notice to respond! —Adam"

This is not a partisan issue. It is a civil rights issue.

Dear Friends!


