Hello Neighbors! October 2023

This year we were privileged to be able to work with Michelle Volpini, a local ceramics artist who created one of a kind, beautiful pieces that bear the Kitchen Cupboard (Newfield Food Pantry) logo. These items are remarkable-inherently strong but potentially fragile. Isn't this the perfect summation of the human spirit?

Kintsukuroi is the centuries-old Japanese art of fixing broken pottery. Rather than rejoin ceramic pieces with a camouflaged adhesive, the kintsugi technique employs a special tree sap lacquer dusted with powdered gold, silver, or platinum. Once completed,



beautiful seams of gold glint in the conspicuous cracks of ceramic wares, giving a one-of-a-kind appearance to each "repaired" piece.

Finances. Relationships. Friendships. Employment Barriers. Physical and Mental Health: We may be whole in one area but broken in another. We may have been broken but are slowly mending. We may be in a place of wholeness that brings contentment.

If you feel broken, we are here. If you feel mended, we are here. If you feel whole, we are here.

This year we are asking for your financial support to address a specific allocation of our funding: The Kitchen Cupboard. A common misconception is that all the food the kitchen cupboard provides is free. While a few items are obtained at no cost from the Food Bank of the Southern Tier, the majority of the food and personal care items are purchased from the FBST and local stores. We receive some grant funding, however these funds do not come close to covering the total cost of the food that we distribute.

Without the generous monetary contributions to CGNF, the food pantry would not be able to provide needed assistance to our community.

The attached financial report will explain how we utilize our funds and will illustrate that we would not be able to meet the needs of others without your contributions. You will see that the largest of our expenditures are tied into the Kitchen Cupboard/Food Pantry. Along with payments to the Food Bank of the Southern Tier and supplemental items that are shopped for by our dedicated volunteers, we request your financial support to keep this program, as well as our other assistance opportunities going.
