



Audubon's Christmas Bird Count, or CBC for short, began on Christmas Day in 1900 as an alternative to the tradition at the time: a Christmas bird hunt. Instead of shooting them, enthusiasts began trying to count as many birds as possible. Fast forward 124 years later, we have an incredible dataset that scientists use to assess the health and trends of bird populations, and the nation's longest running community science project. And here's the best part: you can help us! Participating in the CBC is an excellent way for you to make a real contribution to bird conservation right where you live. CAMANO FIRE'S HOLIDAY FOOD & GIFT CARD DRIVE

Deliver Amazon gift cards or cash/check donations to our Administrative office, 811 N. Sunrise Road. If we're closed, you can leave them in the locked drop-box outside the entrance. You can also mail gift cards if that's more convenient. Give donations to Santa and his elves during the annual Santa Run in December. Every year your donations of nonperishable food, pet food, and personal hygiene products benefit the Stanwood-Camano Food Bank. Amazon gift card donations benefit the Holiday House (formerly Christmas House). The food bank is requesting Amazon gift cards this year to help simplify the gift card distribution process for teens at Holiday House. Amazon cards are the most versatile for teens and easier to use regardless of where they live or what transportation is available to them. Considering a donation? The Food Bank shared a few helpful recommendations: Hearty Soups and Stews (Progresso or Campbell's Chunky type) – this is a great option for all of our clients, but especially those experiencing homelessness. Pasta and Pasta Sauce – always a helpful staple to keep on hand for families. Gift cards (Amazon only please) – Amounts of \$25 are preferred since gift cards go to teens at Holiday House.

MUSEUM QUALITY FINE ART MARKS JUROR'S SELECTION OF WINNERS




Northwest Watercolor Society's (NWWS) 84th International Open Exhibition, at Matzke Gallery on Camano Island, attracted hundreds of top watermedia artists from around the globe to enter the prestigious show. Juror Vladislav Yeliseyev presented the 75 accepted paintings he chose at the artists' award reception on October 25, 2024. In an entertaining and educational 90 minutes, he reviewed each painting and why he chose it. Overall, the artwork in the show is "very, very good quality work," he said, and mentioned many of the pieces as being fine art or museum quality art. The public is invited to view the exhibition any time online at www.nwws.org/annual-international-open until December 29, 2024. And it's free! The criteria Yeliseyev used was 'Does it move me?' 'Does it have something definite that I can relate to?' and 'Does it come with technical proficiency?'The top three winners receiving cash awards who fit his criteria and more are: Zhengxin Xi was awarded \$2,000 first place for "Fishing Boats at Rockland Harbor." "This is museum quality fine art," he said. "Each time I saw Xi's art I said 'wow' or 'whoa.' I was constantly impressed with the skill of the water reflections – which are hard to paint. The attention to detail. This painting talks to me. It conveys light. I can smell the fish. I love it!" Second place of \$1,300 was presented to Jorge Luis Corpuna for "Sacred Valley of the Incas." Yeliseyev was impressed with the incredible depth of composition of this painting. He counted out the five visual planes that are "manipulated into a seamless breathtaking view without any struggle. I see no mistakes. The composition and technique are second to none." Chris Krupinski received third place of \$1,000 for "Bittersweet." "The light; the sense of focus on the grapes, strong vertical lines, the white on the grapes. The darks have life. This is skillful transparency painted perfectly." Yeliseyev had over 600 entries to review before selecting the final 75. He said he did his best to remove his own preferences and personal opinions as much as possible when judging, to pick different styles and subject matters. 



SWEET POTATO PIE

My Mama's heirloom Sweet Potato Pie has been loved for generations. Enjoy!



INGREDIENTS: 1 (9-inch) unbaked pie shell (homemade or storebought); 1/2 c. butter softened; 1 c. brown sugar (light or dark); 1 c. mashed sweet potatoes (baked or boiled, then cooled); 2 lg. eggs slightly beaten; 3/4 c. evaporated milk; 1/4 c. light corn syrup; 3 T. all-purpose flour; 1/4 tsp. ground cinnamon; 1 pinch ground nutmeg; 1 pinch salt

DIRECTIONS: 1. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Line a rimmed baking sheet with foil. Place a pie plate lined with an unbaked pie shell in the middle of the prepared baking sheet; set aside. 2. In a large bowl, cream together the softened butter and brown sugar. Add the sweet potato mash, eggs, milk, and corn syrup; beat until smooth. Add flour, cinnamon, nutmeg, and salt; beat until well combined. Pour into the unbaked pie shell. 3. Bake for 55-60 minutes until set. Place the pie on a wire rack to cool completely. Serve at room temperature topped with whipped cream. Store leftovers in the refrigerator. Serves 8.

What I wanted to say as an Honest Response: Let me get this straight. You want to inflict pain and suffering on me over several hours, only to "reward" me with a dish so disgusting that it would make my cat vomit? How long have you secretly harbored a death wish for me?"
