Groundhog Day is a popular North American tradition on February 2nd, where a groundhog emerges from its burrow to predict the arrival of spring; if it sees its shadow (sunny day), it signals six more weeks of winter, but if it doesn't (cloudy day), spring comes early. Originating from German folklore and linked to Candlemas, the most famous event features Punxsutawney Phil in Pennsylvania, though its accuracy is low (around 39% historically)

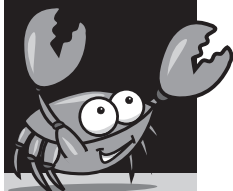

CRAB DOG DAY

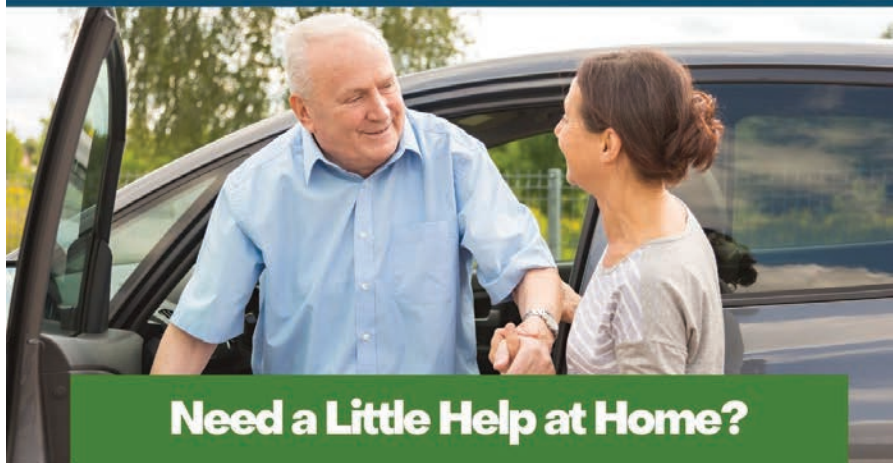

Sore throat, especially with fever or swollen glands in the neck

Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing

New loss of taste or smell

THE PELVIC FLOOR: THE MUSCLE GROUP EVERYONE DEPENDS ON



When we think about strength and longevity, we usually picture arms, legs, or visible core muscles. Yet one critical group works quietly behind the scenes: the pelvic floor. These muscles support bladder and bowel control, posture, breathing, sexual function, and overall stability—and are essential for long-term independence in both women and men.

The pelvic floor is a network of muscles and connective tissues spanning the bottom of the pelvis, forming a “hammock” for the bladder, bowel, and, depending on anatomy, the uterus or prostate. It works with the diaphragm and deep abdominal muscles to manage pressure, maintain posture, and enable efficient movement.

Like other muscles, the pelvic floor weakens with age, hormonal changes, inactivity, and sarcopenia. Midlife women and men may notice urinary leakage, urgency, chronic low back or hip discomfort, reduced movement confidence, or sexual dysfunction. These symptoms are common—but not inevitable or untreatable. Clinical guidelines recommend pelvic muscle training as a first-line intervention.

Pelvic health is not solely a women’s issue. Men rely on these muscles for bladder control, sexual function, and core stability. Yet stigma keeps these conversations out of daily life, even though dysfunction affects balance, strength, and independence—key determinants of healthy aging.

Normalizing pelvic health means recognizing these muscles as trainable and essential. Addressing pelvic floor function is as important as building visible muscle, supporting mobility, confidence, and quality of life.

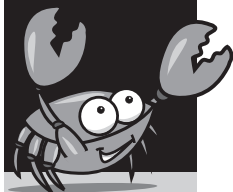

EDIBLE FAKE SNOW



This recipe is perfect for toddlers who may still stick their fingers in their mouths while they play. It's made with flour and water, so it's taste-safe, but not tasty. You don't want your child to eat it, of course, but if they do happen to put a pinch in their mouths, they'll be fine. Note: All flour packages state raw flour is not ready to eat and must be cooked thoroughly before eating.

How to make the edible fake snow:

- 10 cups of flour (we used ½ of a 5lb bag)
- 6oz of oil (vegetable, baby oil or coconut oil all work well)

Combine the flour and the oil until a crumbly mixture is formed. If you want a thicker consistency, add more oil, for a fluffier (and messier) texture add more flour. How to play with the Winter sensory bin: Place the edible fake snow mixture in a sensory bin. Add fun winter themed items your kids will have fun playing with. We have made a Christmas Sensory Bin with Ornaments and Fake Snow and a Winter Farm Fake Snow Sensory Bin as well, you could do either of these themes with the edible fake snow as well! Engaging in sensory play is wonderful for children and helps them make connections with materials. Driving in snow and ice

Safety on snowy, icy roads

- Decrease your speed and leave yourself plenty of room to stop.
- You should allow at least three times more space than usual between you and the car in front of you.
- Brake gently to avoid skidding. If your wheels start to lock up, ease off the brake.
- Turn on your lights to increase your visibility to other motorists.
- Use low gears to keep traction, especially on hills.
- Don't use cruise control or overdrive on icy roads.

If your rear wheels skid...

- Take your foot off the accelerator.
- Steer in the direction you want the front wheels to go. If your rear wheels are sliding left, steer left. If they're sliding right, steer right.
- If your rear wheels start sliding the other way as you recover, ease the steering wheel toward that side. You might have to steer left and right a few times to get your vehicle completely under control.
- If you have standard brakes, pump them gently.
- If you have anti-lock brakes (ABS), do not pump the brakes. Apply steady pressure to the brakes. You will feel the brakes pulse — this is normal.

If your front wheels skid...

- Take your foot off the gas and shift to neutral, but don't try to steer immediately.
- As the wheels skid sideways, they will slow the vehicle and traction will return. As it does, steer in the direction you want to go. Then put the transmission in "drive" or release the clutch, and accelerate gently.

If you get stuck...

- Do not spin your wheels. This will only dig you in deeper.
- Turn your wheels from side to side a few times to push snow out of the way.
- Use a light touch on the gas, to ease your car out.
- Pour sand, kitty litter, gravel or salt in the path of the wheels, to help get traction.
- Try rocking the vehicle. (Check your owner's manual first — it can damage the transmission on some vehicles.) Shift from forward to reverse, and back again.

If you become stranded...

- Do not leave your car unless you know exactly where you are, how far it is to possible help, and are certain you will improve your situation.
- To attract attention, light two flares and place one at each end of the car a safe distance away.
- Hang a brightly colored cloth from your antenna.
- If you are sure the car's exhaust pipe is not blocked, run the engine and heater for about 10 minutes every hour or so depending upon the amount of gas in the tank.
- Keep at least one window open slightly. Heavy snow and ice can seal a car shut.
- Eat a hard candy to keep your mouth moist.

Necessary equipment

An emergency situation on the road can arise at any time and you must be prepared. In addition to making sure you have a tune-up, a full tank of gas, and fresh anti-freeze, you should carry the following items in your trunk and replenish after use:



Bag of salt or cat litter

Rock salt

Shovel

Tow and tire chains

Tool kit

Non-perishable, high-energy foods like unsalted canned nuts, dried fruits, and hard candy

Reflective triangles

Brightly colored cloth

Ice scraper and snow brush

Scissors and string/cord

First aid kit

Wooden matches in a waterproof container

Windshield cleaner

Flashlight and extra batteries

Properly inflated spare tire, wheel wrench and tripod-type jack

Jumper cables

Shovel

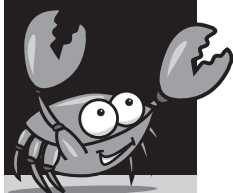

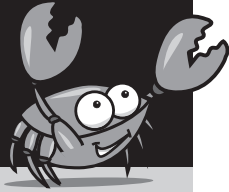

SET YOUR WATER HEATER AT A SAFE TEMPERATURE



State law advises that residential water heaters should be set no higher than 120 degrees. This temperature setting reduces the risk of accidental scalding, especially to children and the elderly. It also saves energy and helps reduce your utility bill. To set the temperature, turn the water heater off at the circuit breaker panel or fuse box, remove the face plates on the tank that cover each element, and use a screwdriver to turn the temperature control dial to "120." If you feel you can't handle this task safely, contact an electrician. Sometimes 120 degrees isn't hot enough to activate detergents or dissolve greasy food in automatic dishwashers. Manufacturers recommend using a liquid dishwashing detergent. Many newer models also have a water heating option that boosts the temperature in the appliance. Source: Snohomish County PUD

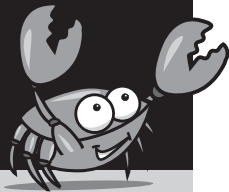

CROQUE MONSIEUR CASSEROLE

A classic French bistro sandwich made into a divine casserole featuring ham and Gruyere cheese baked in a rich and creamy custard. Serve with a side with of raspberry jam and a dusting of confectioners' sugar or drizzle with maple syrup, Enjoy!



INGREDIENTS: Butter for greasing the baking dish; 14 oz. Gruyere or Swiss cheese divided; 13 (4 1/2-inch) day old mini croissants split; 8 oz. deli-sliced ham I use maple ham; 6 lg. eggs; 2 c. half & half; 1 T. Dijon mustard; 1 1/2 tsp. kosher salt; 1 T. fresh chopped thyme; 1 T. thinly sliced chives for garnish; Freshly ground black pepper for garnish; Raspberry jam for serving, optional; Pure maple syrup for serving, optional; Confectioners' sugar for dusting, optional

DIRECTIONS: Butter an 8x12-inch baking dish and set aside. Shred 10 ounces of the cheese and cube the remaining 4 ounces into 1/2-inch pieces. Cover and refrigerate until ready to use. Using a serrated knife, slice the croissants in half lengthwise leaving a small hinge. Tear the ham in half and roll or drape each half on the bottom halves of the croissants. Top with about 2 tablespoons shredded cheese. Reserve the remaining shredded cheese (about 2/3 cup) for the top of the casserole. Fold the top half of the croissants over the cheese pressing down to make the croissant sandwiches. Slice each sandwich in half crosswise and place into the prepared casserole dish, alternating cut-sides up and pointed-ends up. In a medium bowl, whisk together the eggs. Add half and half, Dijon mustard, salt, and thyme, whisking until well combined. Slowly pour the custard mixture over the croissant sandwiches. Cover with aluminum foil and let sit at room temperature for 1 hour. (Alternatively, cover and refrigerate for at least 8 hours or overnight. Let sit at room temperature for 30 minutes before proceeding.) When ready to bake, preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Place the cubed cheese randomly between soaked croissants and sprinkle evenly with the remaining shredded cheese. Bake the casserole, covered, for 40 minutes: uncover and bake until golden brown, about 10-15 minutes more. Remove from the oven and let rest for 10 minutes. Top with chives and fresh cracked black pepper if desired. Serve with a side with of raspberry jam and a dusting of confectioners' sugar or drizzle with maple syrup and enjoy!

MY SLIDING DOORS MOMENT

A Sliding Doors moment refers to a situation in which seemingly inconsequential moments nonetheless alter the trajectory of future events and a person's destiny. The term entered our lexicon thanks to the 1998 movie, *Sliding Doors*, in which the film alternates between two storylines, showing two very different paths the central character's life will take depending on whether she catches a train or just barely misses it (as the doors slide closed in front of her, hence the title).

My greatest Sliding Doors moment happened in December 1982. I was living in Columbus, having just recently completed my graduate MBA program at Ohio State. I had no job prospects lined up. I flew to Albany, NY, my hometown, for the holidays to visit my mom and sister. While there, I stopped by my father's law office to see some friends (my dad had passed away several years prior, but one of his partners continued the practice).

Just as I was leaving, heading for the elevator, a well-dressed older man was about to enter the office next doors. One of the people in my father's law office named Hazel introduced me to this man. She casually shared that I was a recent MBA graduate and was looking for work. I exchanged banal pleasantries with this stranger, shook hands, and moments later, I got on the elevator, never giving our fleeting visit a second thought.

I flew home to Columbus to resume my flailing job search. The next day, I received a call from Hazel. "Tim, you're never going to believe it, but remember that man I introduced you to in the hallway as you were waiting for the elevator? He wants to interview you for a job!"

What? Seriously? We had barely spent sixty seconds together in the hallway. That random stranger turned out to be the president of Knight Ridder Broadcasting, one of the largest chains of radio and TV stations in the country. But why would he want to interview me for a job? I was unemployed and had no relevant work experience.

It turns out that he was looking to hire a full-time advertising sales rep for the local Albany Knight Ridder television station. He had no idea that I was not living in Albany. But I was not about to tell him that and blow this opportunity. So, I flew back to Albany two days later for the interview.

During our interview, he had to take a phone call from one of his managers. The man on the other end of the line turned out to be someone named Al Gillen. After the call was over, the man explained that this was the same Al Gillen who had been a client of my father's many years ago when Al Gillen had been the president of a TV station in Flint, Michigan. (My father as an attorney represented several TV and radio stations.)

By now, in December 1982, Mr. Gillen was the president of Viewtron, a Knight Ridder subsidiary which was on the cusp of becoming the bleeding-edge forerunner to America Online (AOL) and a pioneer in online information technology that would eventually pave the way

for the Internet.

I turned down the Executive's job offer to sell advertising for his Albany-based TV station. But I sent a letter to Al Gillen, asking for an interview for a position – heck, ANY position at Viewtron.

Mr. Gillen passed my resume on to one of his frontline managers. I flew down to Miami Beach, where Viewtron was headquartered. I had the interview and two weeks later, I received a job offer as an account executive. Two months later I drove to Miami, with my pet rabbit Boose and my parakeet Bob in the back seat. An exhausting (not to mention smelly) 18-hour, 1,200 mile journey.

A week or so into my new job, I was sitting in the lunchroom. Across the table was an attractive redheaded woman with a vaguely foreign accent. I could not place it. She turned out to be from Canada. Little did I know at that moment that three years later I would ask this person to be my wife.

On that December afternoon in 1982 in Albany, had I left that office just 30 seconds sooner or just 30 seconds later, I never would have crossed paths with that executive in the hallway. I would never have been sitting in his office at the precise moment he received that call from the president of Viewtron. And I never would have found myself sitting across the table in that Miami Beach lunchroom from my future wife.

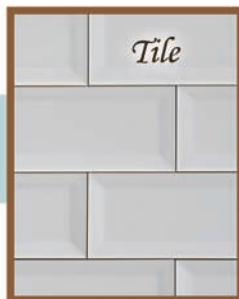
