COFFEE FILTER SPIDER WEBS

Turn coffee filters into spider webs the same way you make paper snowflakes. For larger webs, use garbage bags.



MATERIALS: White basket-style coffee filters; Scissors; Black felt or construction paper for the spiders; Glue stick

INSTRUCTIONS: 1.Fold your coffee filter Before you start cutting, fold up your coffee filter in half, and then in half again, and continue until you have a skinny triangle. 2. Make your cuts The easiest of all: just make a series of "V" cuts down one or both sides of the folded coffee filter. The next easiest: cutting rectangles along one or both sides of the folded coffee filter. You can also cut the top of the filter into a curved line, or cut the center out, to make it look even more like a spiderweb. Glue your coffee filter spiderwebs to the window with a few strategic dabs from a glue stick (it washes off easily when it's time to take them down). Add spiders! Cut out a few tiny spiders from black felt (or black construction paper) and glue them to your webs! Source: www.artfulparent.com



CITY-BRED FARMER



Diary of a City-Bred Farmer on Puget Sound. The City-bred Farmer chronicles the real life experience of the author, Clarence Dirks, as he navigated moving from the city to start a farm with his family. These articles were collected by his son, "baby Michael", so they could be enjoyed all together. "Our grandfather Clarence Dirks was many things ship caulker, UW Husky football captain, lay minister, commercial fisherman, radio broadcaster, sports writer, magazine article author and, of all things, a farmer. Between 1946 and 1958 he wrote a popular column for the Seattle Post-Intelligencer about his experiences as a somewhat newby farmer on Camano Island. Written in diary-style fashion (today he would be a blogger), grandpa covered not only his day-to-day farming life, but his family life, interesting happenings on the island, its people and the many adventures he had. This includes the founding days of Camano Chapel, taking his prize bull to "Cow Palace" in San Francisco by rail car, the one-day construction of Camano Island State Park (which he wanted to call Mark Clark Park), meetings at the Camano City School House and Fire Hall and much more. These columns, especially in the early years, often featured my dad Marty and his little brother Michael. His columns always ended with his daily egg count. Uncle Mike has scanned and, with the help of his son Bill, posted some 1200 of grandpa's 'City-Bred Farmer' columns in chronological order on a website at: citybredfarmer.com." - posted on Facebook by local Brian Dirks.

STRETCHING AND YOUR HEALTH

I got out of the car after a 90 minute trip in traffic from Seattle and was I sore. Sore in my hips, my neck, my back; ugh...oh and irritable on top of it! I began to stretch and took some deep breaths that I teach in my classes, and within 10 minutes I felt better, more balanced. It was amazing, given how crappy I was earlier. What is it about stretching that is so important for us, especially as we age? From the Mayo Clinic: "Stretching improves range of motion of your joints. Good range of motion keeps you in better balance, which will help keep you mobile and less prone to falls — and the related injuries — especially as you age. Stretching improves circulation. Stretching increases blood flow to your muscles. Improved circulation can speed recovery after muscle injuries. Stretching can relieve stress. Stretching relaxes the tense muscles that often accompany stress." Shortened muscles are bad news because they become fragile and weak if taken beyond their short range of movement. This can lead to muscle damage. Short muscles can also add unnecessary pressure to the tendons in our bodies by constantly pulling on them. Pressure on the tendons in our bodies can pull our bones out of their natural alignment causing bad posture and potentially leading to the spine being put under excess pressure. This can result in back pain and related injuries. Failing to stretch for long periods will put a lot of strain on our bodies and line us up for a whole range of injuries, which can only get worse the longer we leave it. Muscles don't just shorten due to constant contraction from exercise; they also shorten if they are kept in a contracted position for long periods. The most common example of this is sitting, which a lot of us do for hours on end whether it be work, driving and even relaxing - we are all guilty. Of course the cure is to stretch and move. It will help keep muscles at their correct lengths, reducing pressure on your body and keeping injuries and pain at bay. A new monthly message from the Stanwood Camano School District Health Services Department



SCHOOL NURSES

Our school nurses are essential to keeping students safe, healthy, and ready to learn. They are often the first healthcare provider a child sees regularly and play a crucial role in both public health and education.

10 important things school nurses do! A school nurse is a licensed healthcare professional who works within a school setting to support the physical, mental, and emotional health of students. Their job goes beyond just putting on band-aids or checking for fevers — they play a key role in student health, safety, and academic success.

1. Provide First Aid and Emergency Care - Treat minor injuries (cuts, bruises, nosebleeds, etc.); Manage sudden illnesses (fevers, vomiting, asthma attacks, allergic reactions); Handle medical emergencies until help arrives.

2. Manage Chronic Health Conditions - Assist students with conditions like diabetes, asthma, epilepsy, and allergies; Administer medications or treatments during the school day; Create and follow care plans for students with ongoing health needs.

3. Administer Medications - Give prescribed medications to students (in accordance with school policies and parental permission); Monitor for side effects or problems with medication.

4. Health Screenings - Conduct vision, hearing, scoliosis, and other routine screenings; Refer students for further evaluation when needed 5. Monitor Infectious Disease - Track illnesses like flu, strep throat, or lice outbreaks; Communicate with parents and health departments if needed; Enforce exclusion policies to prevent the spread of disease

6. Promote Health Education - Teach students and staff about hygiene, nutrition, puberty, mental health, and more; Provide resources for healthy lifestyle choices

7. Support Mental Healt - Offer emotional support to students who are anxious, stressed, or in crisis; Refer students to counselors or other mental health professionals when needed

8. Maintain Health Records - Keep accurate records of immunizations, medications, treatments, and health screening; Ensure compliance with state and district health regulations

9. Support Special Education - Participate in IEP (Individualized Education Plan) or 504 Plan meetings for students with medical needs; Ensure accommodations are made to support student health and learning

10. Communicate with Families and Staff - Collaborate with parents, teachers, counselors, and administrators to support student well-being; Provide updates on health concerns or outbreaks


APPLE SALAD

A fresh mix of spring greens, crisp apples, candied walnuts, creamy goat cheese, and red onions, tossed in a tangy homemade apple cider vinaigrette. The ultimate Fall salad, enjoy!



DRESSING: 1/2 c. good quality olive oil; 3 T. apple cider vinegar; 2 T. honey; 1 T. Dijon mustard; 3 cloves garlic, minced; 1/4 tsp. onion powder; 1/4 tsp. sea salt; 1/4 tsp. fresh ground black pepper SALAD: 3 Honeycrisp, Gala, or Fuji apples, divided; 1/4 c. lemon juice; 1 c. cold water; 10 oz. spring lettuce mix; 1/4 red onion sliced; 4 oz. goat cheese; 2 c. candied walnuts

DIRECTIONS: 1. DRESSING: In a pint jar with lid or small bowl, shake or whisk the olive oil, apple cider vinegar, honey, Dijon mustard, garlic, onion powder, salt, and pepper until well combined. Chill while you prepare the salad. 2. SALAD: Dice two of the apples into 1/4-inch cubes. Cut the remaining apple into thin slices for the garnish. 3. Pour the lemon juice and water into a medium bowl. Add the sliced and diced apples to the bowl. Allow to sit while you prepare the rest of the salad. When ready to assemble, drain the apples in a colander. 4. In a large serving bowl, add the spring mix, diced apples, red onions, goat cheese and walnuts (reserving about 2 tablespoons each of cheese, red onions, and candied walnuts for garnish). 5. Add the dressing, toss to coat (alternatively, you can serve the salad with the dressing on the side). Garnish the salad with the sliced apples and reserved cheese, onions, and candied walnuts, serve immediately.


