Instructions: Cut out the circle (center for the flower) and rectangle (stem) and 8 flower petals on colored construction paper of your choice. 3. Write "I Love You Because" or "I Love My Mom Because" in the middle of the circle with a black marker. Have your child come up with 8 reasons why he or she loves his or her mom. Write each reason on the flower petals so that there is one reason per petal. Turn the circle over and apply glue to the outer ring of the circle. Glue the top, bottom, left, and right petals on the circle. 6. Glue the rest of the petals in between the petals that are already glued on the circle. COFFEE FILTER FLOWERS



Materials: coffee filters (2 per flower); washable markers; glue; straws or pipe cleaners (1 per flower); scissors; spray bottle with water; paper towels

Directions: Step 1: Use washable markers to create designs on the coffee filters. Be creative! You'll need 2 filters per flower. Step 2: Spray each coffee filter with a little bit of water, just enough to dampen the whole thing. I like to do this over paper towels to absorb the excess water. Let the coffee filters dry completely. Step 3: Take two filters (layered together) and fold them in half. Then fold them in half three more times. Step 4: Cut the edge into a semi circle. Then, twist the bottom end a few times. Step 5: Holding the twisted end, carefully open the layers to create the flower's petals. Step 6: If you're using a straw: Put a drop of glue in one end of the straw, then insert the bottom of the flower into it. Let the glue dry. If you're using pipe cleaners: Twist the pipe cleaner around the bottom part of the flower to secure it. Step 7: Add the flowers to a vase, or simply tie a ribbon around them to create a bouquet.



MONETIZING ART

I guess I've been working in art for about 45 years. Some of it I've been doing okay at, even made a so-called Living at, and most of it, well, I'm not the poster child for Starving Artist, but maybe Anorexic Artist. We artists have a tough row to hoe in corporate America, that's the truth, and so we try all sorts of strategies ranging from art fair booths to just giving up and getting a job, a real job. But probably too late for one that pays well or offers benefits and pensions. The money belongs to the Job Creators. Us creators, well, good luck.

I went up into the mountains this past weekend with a box of the Skeeter Daddle Blues, hoping to do a book reading and maybe sell a few copies. Ever since my old outlets for book sales dried up, I've been headscratching how to market these babies, get them out of my basement and into the hands of folks hungry for great literature. Tyee Store closed up and so did the Copy This Mail That office supply store that sold the first book Skeeter Daddle Diaries so well I ordered a second printing. The South End String Band CD's sold like hotcakes too at those places, but when they closed shop, the only show in town was the Snow Goose Bookstore. And now they've shuttered their doors too. We probably sold two to three thousand CD's before that. I sold maybe 1000 books. Not bad for a backwash.

This past year I haven't sold more than ten books and the band is giving CD's away at concerts for 'the price we finally figured they were worth'. For free. One concert alone we handed out 150 CD's.

A high tech, fast charging friend convinced me to try Amazon. Against my better judgement I signed on, figuring I'd be sending them a box of hot sellers they could pass out faster than candy on Halloween. But no, they wanted me to send one book at a time, priority mail, to their warehouse in Maryland or someplace far far away. I spent about \$5 per book for mailing envelope and postage, losing a couple of bucks on each one. This went on for a couple of months, never enough sales apparently, to justify shipping them a full box. I might have continued this brilliant sales strategy right into bankruptcy but one day I noticed Amazon, love these guyz, had used copies of the Skeeter Diaries listed at 1.99 plus shipping. This was great. Me competing against me and the only winner was Amazon. It took me awhile to get out of this crummy cycle, the company not really responsive to any inquiries. In fact, they had no way to make inquiries.

I finally just kept sending them messages on the sales requests that the book was Out of Print. Which, finally, it was. Sadly, I buy my own book back from them occasionally just to have a few copies around. Cheaper than reprints by far. Bookstores competing against Bezos, like I mentioned at the last Snow Goose reading before they closed shop, are like Godzilla vs Bambi, it won't be long before they're toejam. Now I see where they'd like to be my printer too, print on demand. Probably ship them to me, then have me ship them back each sale. Lose even more money on every point of sale.

So I wish I had a tried and true strategy for you prospective artists out there looking for ways to sell your wares, I really do. It was always dog eat dog, but now we got Godzilla too. My only advice is to be like the little furry creatures during the Dinosaur Era, stay low, keep a close eye out, maybe move at night. I know, not much help, but the trick is to survive.

SAVE CAMA BEACH CABINS UPDATE AS OF APRIL 22



We have had some success with getting funding for Cama Beach. As a result of hard work by our Legislators, Rep. Shavers and Rep. Paul along with the Chair of the House Capital Budget Committee Rep. Tharinger there is \$600,000.00 appropriated for Cama Beach. The money is to be used to study and plan for the protection of the cabins and the resort buildings from the threats of geological processes including sea level rise. This is good news. However, it didn't go quite far enough. We have asked that the budget language be amended to allow part of the funding to be for the necessary infrastructure repairs for reopening the cabins for public use. We still need people to continue to call and support the planning funds and the funds to reopen the cabins. The regular session ended April 27th. Right now, the Legislature is working on reconciling the Senate Budget and the House Budget along with the Governor's Budget. Most people believe that finalizing the budget will require a special session with discussions continuing into May and June. The State has to have a budget in place by the beginning of July. We need to ensure our legislators are aware of the importance of supporting both the planning funds AND the funds to reopen the cabins as soon as possible. As before, with one simple call to the Legislative Hotline, 1-800-562-6000, you can send the same message to your State Senator and to both State Representatives, as well as Governor Ferguson. The Hotline is open Monday-Friday, 8 AM to 7 PM Suggested wording for the messages: For callers OUTSIDE the 10th Legislative District which includes Camano Island: "We appreciate the funds in the House Capital Budget for planning the long term protection for the cabins at Cama Beach State Park. "Please ALSO support an amendment to use part of those funds to reopen the cabins as soon as possible, during the planning process." For those IN the 10th Legislative District (the message to Rep. Clyde Shavers and Rep. Dave Paul): "Thank you so much for your work to get the funds in the House Capital Budget for planning long term protection for the cabins at Cama Beach. "We'd very much appreciate your ALSO working for the amendment to use part of those funds to reopen the cabins as soon as possible, during the planning process." 

CROQUE MONSIEUR CASSEROLE

A classic French bistro sandwich made into a divine casserole featuring ham and Gruyere cheese baked in a rich and creamy custard. Serve with a side with of raspberry jam and a dusting of confectioners' sugar or drizzle with maple syrup, Enjoy! Happy Mother's Day!



INGREDIENTS: Butter for greasing the baking dish; 14 oz. Gruyere or Swiss cheese, divided; 13 (4 1/2-inch) day old mini croissants, split; 8 oz. deli-sliced ham (I use maple ham); 6 lg. eggs; 2 c. half & half; 1 T. Dijon mustard; 1 1/2 tsp. kosher salt; 1 T. fresh chopped thyme; 1 T. thinly sliced chives for garnish; Freshly ground black pepper for garnish; Raspberry jam for serving, optional; Pure maple syrup for serving, optional; Confectioners' sugar for dusting, optional

DIRECTIONS: 1. Butter an 8x12-inch baking dish and set aside. 2. Shred 10 ounces of the cheese and cube the remaining 4 ounces into 1/2-inch pieces. Cover and refrigerate until ready to use. 3. Using a serrated knife, slice the croissants in half lengthwise leaving a small hinge. 4. Tear the ham in half and roll or drape each half on the bottom halves of the croissants. Top with about 2 tablespoons shredded cheese. Reserve the remaining shredded cheese (about 2/3 cup) for the top of the casserole. Fold the top half of the croissants over the cheese pressing down to make the croissant sandwiches. Slice each sandwich in half crosswise and place into the prepared casserole dish, alternating cut-sides up and pointed-ends up. 5. In a medium bowl, whisk together the eggs. Add half and half, Dijon mustard, salt, and thyme, whisking until well combined. Slowly pour the custard mixture over the croissant sandwiches. Cover with aluminum foil and let sit a room temperature for 1 hour. (Alternatively, cover and refrigerate for at least 8 hours or overnight. Let sit at room temperature for 30 minutes before proceeding.. 6. When ready to bake, preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Place the cubed cheese randomly between soaked croissants and sprinkle evenly with the remaining shredded cheese. 7. Bake the casserole, covered, for 40 minutes: uncover and bake until golden brown, about 10-15 minutes more. Remove from the oven and let rest for 10 minutes. Top with chives and fresh cracked black pepper if desired. Serve with a side with of raspberry jam and a dusting of confectioners' sugar or drizzle with

THE STORY OF YONG LI



She was found on a busy street corner in in a city of over four million people. She was only a few days old – abandoned, lost, completely unknown. No identification on her to indicate whose family she belonged to. An orphan, a tiny baby whose first meaningful life experience was to be abandoned by her parents for no other reason than the misfortune of having been born a girl. Such was the fate of hundreds of thousands of baby girls in China between 1979 and 2015.

The orphanage where she was taken gave her the name Yong Li, which meant "Forever Beautiful." Despite her tumultuous beginning, in less than five months, little Yong Li would be matched to a childless couple in America and headed to her new forever home in the States.

Nervous about entering Kindergarten, she overcame her anxieties and in time settled into school life. A relatively shy child, some of Yong Li's favorite times were the quiet moments she would play chess with her dad. As a young child she didn't have many friends. But she discovered the joy of the wizarding world of Harry Potter and would read one Harry Potter book after the next.

As she reached her early teen years, she excelled at sports, especially soccer. She was a fierce competitor, playing defense. Soccer became her passion. Unfortunately, Yong Li's fearless, overly aggressive style of play came at a steep price. She suffered a series of minor concussions playing the sport she loved.

Finally, a soccer collision in the spring of her high school junior year school was so severe that Yong Li was forced to take a three-month medical withdrawal from school. This would be the last soccer game she would ever play. It crushed her spirit. Doctors told her she could never play any contact sport ever again. The risk to her long-term mental and physical health was just too great.

Despite the upsetting setback, Yong Li would go on to university. But in the spring of her sophomore year, she slipped and banged her head on a wall pipe in her dorm. The brain injury was so serious that for a second time in three years, she was forced to take a medical withdrawal. Somehow, thanks to her stubborn determination, Yong Li overcame this latest misfortune and completed her nursing school

Yong Li began her career as a cardiology nurse. She then decided to pursue a DNP (Doctor of Nursing Practice) program to become a Nurse Practitioner. While going to graduate school part-time and working full-time, one day she was working with a difficult patient who was in such an agitated mental state she had to be strapped to her hospital bed. When the patient calmed down, Yong Li cautiously removed the straps and helped her out of the bed. Then in a flash, the patient, completely unprovoked, angrily landed a severe blow directly on Yong Li's temple. Yong Li fell hard, smashing her head forcefully into the hard linoleum floor. She briefly lost consciousness.

This time, her traumatic brain injury was so extensive Yong Li could barely speak or even open her eyes for days. When she tried to talk, her words came out so slurred she sounded drunk. She couldn't concentrate at all. She couldn't conduct even a short conversation because it burt her brain too much.

She underwent intensive therapy of all types – cognitive, speech, balance, psychological, and more – for almost three years. Her cognitive impairment was initially so profound that doctors were doubtful she would ever be able to maintain a full-time job, let alone become a nurse practitioner.

But Yong Li never gave up. She went to multiple medical appointments every week for three years, slowly, painfully regaining her ability to concentrate, communicate, and handle stress. During this grueling period, she was unable to work and had to withdraw completely from her graduate program.

Eventually, incredibly, she returned to work, albeit only part-time for the first year. But slowly, over time, she was able to increase her hours and return to full-time work. Today she is back working as a nurse and once again pursuing her dreams of becoming a DNP.

After almost three years of watching Yong Li struggle to regain her cognitive function, Yong Li's doctor told her dad that he was amazed at her progress. "She's a fighter.," he said. "Most people in her situation just give up. It's too hard, too overwhelming, and too emotionally draining, to keep going. The progress is just so slow, it becomes demoralizing. But she never gave up. She's one tough young woman."

Yes, she is. Yong Li has always been a fighter. It's one of the many things that her father always admired about her. And I should know. I'm her dad.
