## SHAMROCK PAPER CHAIN



What you Will Need: Scissors, Stapler, double sided sticky tape or glue, Green and white A4 sheets of lightweight card

How You Make Your Shamrock Paper Chain: 1. First you need to cut your strips of paper. I used a guillotine for this, but if you are good with a pair of scissors and can cut in a straight line then you can do it without. I cut strips lengthways from the A4 sheets, approximately 1.5cm wide. 2. Then cut each card strip in half, then fold into a V-shape. These little V-shapes are the building blocks of your paper chain. 3. Attach 4 card V-shapes together at the base of each, either using a stapler like I did, or use a little double sided sticky tape or glue (just make sure you leave enough time to dry before proceeding). 4. Make one of the V-shaped pieces of card into a heart shape as shown in the photo, and again secure with either a staple or piece of double sided sticky tape. Do this to only 3 of the V-shped strips, leaving one open. 5. Once you have turned them all into nearly finished shamrocks you are ready to connect them together by securing the last open V-shape but thread it through the shamrock before as shown in the picture. 6. You can then carry on the process to make your Shamrock Paper Chain as long as you want it! Source: https://blissfuldomestication.com.

## TOTAL LUNAR ECLIPSE BRINGS A BLOOD MOON THIS MONTH



Skywatchers across North America will be treated to a stunning total lunar eclipse. The lunar eclipse will happen overnight between March 13 and March 14 and will be the first total lunar eclipse visible anvwhere in the world since November 2022. A total lunar eclipse occurs when the Earth moves directly between the sun and the full moon, casting its shadow across the lunar surface. During totality — the peak phase of the eclipse — the moon will turn a deep reddish-orange hue, earning it the nickname "Blood Moon." This effect happens because Earth's atmosphere scatters shorter wavelengths of light from the sun while allowing longer wavelengths of red and orange hues to be refracted into Earth's umbra (the darkest part of Earth's shadow). When these longer wavelengths strike the moon, they can make it appear red, similar to how the sky appears red during sunrise and sunset. The key times for totality across North America are: Pacific Time (PT): 11:26 p.m. (March 13) — 12:31 a.m. (March 14). Unlike solar eclipses, lunar eclipses are completely safe to view with the naked eye. No special equipment is needed, but binoculars or a telescope will enhance the experience by revealing details on the moon's surface as it changes color. The key to a great view is a dark location away from city lights and clear skies.



## SNO-ISLE READS TOGETHER



An annual program that encourages all adults in Snohomish and Island Counties to read the same book, inviting exploration of new ideas and providing opportunities to experience the joy of discovery. The book is Accordion Eulogies by Noé Álvarez. Searching, propulsive, and deeply spiritual, Accordion Eulogies is an odyssey to repair a severed family lineage, told through the surprising history of a musical instrument. Growing up in Yakima, WA, Noé Álvarez never knew his grandfather. Stories swirled around this mythologized, largerthan-life figure: that he had abandoned his family, and had possibly done something awful that put a curse on his descendants. About his grandfather, young Noé was sure of only one thing; that he had played the accordion. Now an adult, reckoning with the legacy of silence surrounding his family's migration from Mexico, Álvarez resolves both to take up the instrument and to journey into Mexico to discover the grandfather he never knew. Álvarez travels across the US with his accordion, meeting makers and players in cities that range from San Antonio to Boston. He uncovers the story of an instrument central to classic American genres that also played a critical role in indigenous Mexican history. Like the accordion itself, Álvarez feels trapped between his roots in Mexico and the U.S. As he tries to make sense of his place in the world—as a father, a son, a musician—he gets closer to uncovering the mystery of his origins.

# BOYSENBERRY, RASPBERRY, AND RHUBARB PLANTS AVAILABLE, FREE TO A GOOD GARDEN SPOT

**Boysenberry** plants are a two-year crop, that is, the canes grow one year and produce large and plentiful berries the second year then die (the canes) after the harvest. Each year a new cane grows (replacing the original) and produces the second year. These berries make excellent jam, pies, hot cake syrup, cobbler and retain their flavor after baking or cooking. Harvest is typically in mid-July and last for about two weeks. A gallon can be picked in about twenty minutes. The canes do have thorns, with the expired canes needing to be cut at the base and removed each winter after a good freeze has rendered them dead. They can run on parallel horizontal wires spaced about two feet apart and each plant (hill) wants at least eight feet to run along the wire with the wires (two parallel) up about 5 feet above the ground which provides for easy picking. A trellis may also be an idea to consider, as long as the canes can run at least 12 feet from the ground. Suggest planting no more than 6 canes per hill or three canes per horizontal wire in one direction. If plenty of room is available, the wires can be doubled in length allowing for one year's growth to run east with the next year's growth running west, thereby avoiding both years of growth along the same run. **Rhubarb** plants are healthy, producing fresh canes for making pies, Rhubarb syrup, Rhubarb cake and other yummy goods. The plants are self-fertilizing so one only wants to harvest no more than 40% of the plant's production per year, allowing for good and continued growth annually. Both items come from our organic garden, and it's a great time for transplanting. Raspberry another two-year plant that produces good berries late June to early July. The first year canes need to be pruned in winter leaving at least two shoots (nodes) to produce the berries for the following year. Items above come from our organic garden and the reason for this offer is we are downsizing due to over production for our needs today. # CONTINUING THE STORY OF BECOMING THE CAMANO ISLAND LIBRARY...

Early in 2008 the organizing meeting of the Camano Island Library Friends (CILF) was held with 8 people attending. The first public meeting of this group was held on February 28 and Becky Wietzke was elected president. In March of 2009, and against the backdrop of a flagging national economy, the CILF successfully petitioned the Sno-Isle Libraries Board of Trustees to keep the library open until the time was more conducive to put a finance measure for funding the library on the ballot for consideration and approval. In return the CILF committed to raise \$20,000 a year to offset the cost of leasing library space. On March 20, 2010, The Camano Island Library Friends sponsored a gala auction "Reading Between the Vines." This event, chaired by Connie Hall, raised over \$40,000 to fulfill that commitment to Sno-Isle for 2 years. On February 27, 2012 Sno-Isle Libraries Board of Trustees agreed to accept a proposal from the CILF that this group would support the continued operation of the library with \$5,000 per year until a bond measure was brought forward to voters or "for a period of three years from this day's date, whichever comes first."

Thousand Island dressing; 1 pinch garlic powder; 1/4 c. shredded parmesan cheese; Chopped parsley for garnish


DIRECTIONS: 1. Grease a 9x13-inch baking dish and set aside. 2. Place the cubed rye bread in the bottom of the prepared baking dish. Top with corned beef, gruyere cheese, sauerkraut, and pickles 3. In a large bowl, whisk together the eggs. Add the milk, Thousand Island dressing, and garlic powder to the eggs, whisk until well combined. Pour the custard mixture evenly over the bread. 



## AN AMERICAN TOURIST'S GUIDE TO AFRICA

I have traveled all over the world, to Europe, China, and even to Canada. So, I think I know a thing or two about how to get around in foreign cultures – with the exception of Canada. Those Canucks are a total mystery to me.

I recently returned from a three-week safari tour of southern Africa. You know, one of those "glamping" adventures, where you stay in "tents" that are nicer than my house. Alas, during the entire three weeks, the only panda I saw was on a sign at a Panda Express fast food joint at the airport.



And they would not let you walk from your tent to the lodge after dark. They had to escort you with an armed guide, in case a lion or hippo might attack. In fact a lion had killed an antelope right outside of our tent the night before we arrived. (True.) That would never have happened had we stayed at the Marriott.

One of the high points of our trip was supposed to be our helicopter



tour over Victoria Falls – probably the most popular tourist attraction in the entire African continent after the Pyramids. And seeing it from the air is something few people ever get to experience. Oh, sure the view was breathtaking. But unlike Niagara Falls, there was not a single Hard Rock Café or miniature golf course anywhere around. A missed marketing opportunity, if you ask me.

I was also unimpressed by the food. For some reason, every lodge we stayed at kept offering us African food with unpronounceable names like Nshima and Ifinkubala and Vitumbuwa. Not one lodge served pizza, let alone donuts. And don't even get me started about the fact that apparently Mountain Dew is outlawed in Africa.

So, if your idea of a fun vacation is to explore totally different cultures, try exotic foods, see amazing wild animals in their natural habitat, and immerse yourself in a totally alien world, all the while camping in luxury, then, I guess Africa is okay.

Personally, I'd rather go to Disney World and spend the afternoon on their Jungle Cruise ride. There you can navigate you through some of the world's most treacherous waters, steam past lush foliage and waterfalls, and glimpse lions, hippos and zebras up close. And then finish up your adventure with a pepperoni pizza and an ice cold Mountain Dew at the Pizzafari restaurant. Pretty much the same experience, and far less chance of being eaten by a hippo.
