












DID YOU KNOW?





NEW YEAR NOISE MAKER



Supply List: 4 inch paper plates; Paint pens or markers; Curling ribbon; Paper straws or Jumbo popsicle sticks; Craft pom poms; Beans – any small, dry variety; Hot glue gun & glue sticks; Additional themed craft items, if desired

Assembly: Decorate the backside of two paper plates in any desired theme or design. I like to coordinate the designs since one plate will be used for the front of the noisemaker and one for the back. Glue the straw or popsicle stick to the inside of the backside plate. fusing a straw, flatten the portion that will be glued to the plate to make final assembly easier. Also be sure to attach about halfway into the plate for stability. Place a small amount of beans in the plate, just above where the handle is glued. Hot glue an even bead of glue all the way around the outside ring of the plate and carefully place the front plate on top and slightly press down until set. Add curling ribbon and additional décor where the plate and handle meet to finish the look.

TOMATO BASIL SOUP WITH GRILLED CHEESE CROUTONS

This is one of my all-time favorite soups! It's easy to make and always a hit with family and friends. I promise you will NEVER eat tomato soup from a can again!



INGREDIENTS: 1 T. extra virgin olive oil; 1 med. yellow onion diced; 4 cloves garlic pressed; 1 1/2 tsp. kosher salt; 1 tsp. black pepper; 1/4 tsp. red pepper flakes optional; 4 c. chicken broth; 2 (15 oz.) cans diced tomatoes with liquid; 1 (10 oz.) can tomato sauce; 1 Parmesan rind; 3/4 c. chopped fresh basil divided; 3 T. unsalted butter; 1/4 c. all-purpose flour; 1 c. heavy cream

GRILLED CHEESE CROUTONS: 2 T. unsalted butter; 4 soft white bread slices; 4 slices sharp cheddar cheese

INSTRUCTIONS: TOMATO BASIL SOUP: In a large Dutch oven, heat olive oil over medium-high heat. Add the onions, garlic, salt, black pepper, and red pepper flakes; cook until softened, about 1 to 2 minutes. Add the broth, diced tomatoes with liquid, tomato sauce, Parmesan rind, and 1/4 cup of the basil and cook, stirring occasionally, for about 30 minutes. Remove the Parmesan rind and puree the soup with an immersion blender until smooth. In a small saucepan, melt 3 tablespoons of the butter. Whisk in the flour and continue to cook. whisking, until the mixture is lightly browned, 1 to 2 minutes. Add the cream and cook, stirring, until thickened. Add the cream mixture to the soup and cook over medium-low heat, stirring occasionally, until the soup has thickened about 10 minutes. GRILLED CHEESE CROUTONS: Meanwhile, melt 2 tablespoons of butter in a medium skillet over medium heat. Place 2 of the bread slices in the skillet; top each bread slice with 2 cheese slices, 2 tablespoons chopped basil, and another bread slice. Cook until the bread is golden brown and the cheese is melted, about 3 minutes per side. Cut each sandwich into 9 pieces (croutons). Serve soup topped with grilled cheese croutons and remaining chopped basil.
