### MINI CHRISTMAS TREE GARLAND



Materials: cardboard, twigs, evergreen clippings, felt balls, leaf "confetti" or sequins, elmer's glue, jeweled stars, twine, hot glue, anything else you want to use for decorations!

Prep: 1. Flatten your cardboard boxes and draw the outline of a Christmas tree. We used a variety of sizes and shapes! Make as many or as few trees as you'd like depending on how long you want the garland to be. 2. Cut out your Christmas trees. (If you have young kids, do step 1-2 before involving them.). 3. Head outside with your kids and have them help trim some cedar, gather small twigs, and collect colorful leaves. 4. Make your leaf confetti by cutting out several small circles with a hole punch. (If you don't have access to any colorful leaves, sequins can be substituted!). 5. Bring everything inside and lay out all the decorating supplies on your workspace. Decorate your trees: 1. Cover the cardboard trees with a squiggle of glue and layer with cedar. 2. Next, trim your twigs to fit the tree stump and glue them on. 3. Put random dots of glue on top of the cedar and decorate with the pom balls, stars, and confetti, then let dry completely. 4. Once the trees are dry, glue them to a strand of twine with a dab of hot glue on the back. 5. Hang up your Christmas tree garland and enjoy!

They are each individual artists working in both two and three dimensions, but they also have collaborated for 36 years on mixed media paintings and ceramics, some of which are in local hospitals, courthouses, and museums. They are longtime members of the Camano Artists Association and also several ceramics groups. Stanwood House, their gallery and teaching center, will be one of three venues for an open studios event scheduled for Friday, November 28 through Sunday the 31st from 10 – 5 pm. The other two venues are Windy Ridge Clay and Erika Posey Ceramics, all three hosting nine different ceramic artists. Also, the Gateway Gallery is featuring ceramics as well as small paintings Yonnah studied ceramics with a Japanese Zen master at the Corcoran Gallery in Washington, D.C., and received a Masters from U W in sculpture. She has been a lifelong artist and teacher for 60 years. Many of her students and former students have gone on to professional careers or second careers. ### STANWOOD POLICE DEPARTMENT BUILDS BRIDGES WITH FIRST-EVER COMMUNITY ACADEMY



The Stanwood Police Department proudly celebrated the graduation of its first-ever Community Academy on Tuesday, November 18, marking the City's ongoing commitment to public safety, transparency, and community engagement. Held over several weeks, Community Academy offered participants a rare, behind-the-scenes look at local law enforcement. Through interactive classroom sessions, hands-on activities, and live demonstrations, community members learned what it's like to serve and protect in the City of Stanwood. "It was a great first Community Academy and another meaningful way for Stanwood Police to build bridges and connect with our community," said Police Chief Jason Toner. Approximately 22 residents took part in the inaugural program. Seven graduates have already signed up to join Stanwood Police's Citizens Patrol and will act as an extra set of "eyes and ears" for officers to help keep the community safe. Two additional Community Academy participants have since expressed interest in pursuing careers in law enforcement. Attendees represented a broad section of the community with about half residing in Stanwood and half from Camano Island. Each graduate received a challenge coin as a token of appreciation. Attendees also heard from Snohomish County Sheriff Susanna Johnson, along with other Snohomish County law enforcement leaders as part of the Academy's closing ceremony. Stanwood Police hopes to organize its next Community Academy in 2027. In the meantime, Chief Toner encourages community members to stay connected, get involved, and consider volunteering. "We are always seeking Citizens Patrol volunteers and are eager to partner with our community," he said. The Snohomish County Sheriff's Office—who the City of Stanwood contracts police services with—also offers a countywide Community Academy, with the next course planned for 2026. ## The Band-Aid Bulletin

November in the Northwest brings dark mornings, early sunsets, and plenty of reasons to cozy up indoors. Families gather after long days at work and school to unwind with kids, pets, and often, screens. In some ways, that end-of-day routine looks the same as it did generations ago — but in others, it's completely transformed by the presence of mobile devices and constant connectivity. In the 1980s, a newsletter like this would have been printed on paper and sent home in a backpack. Now, like so much else, it's read on a screen Students today spending more time in front of devices has prompted growing research into the effects of screen time on learning, attention, sleep, and mental health. The findings suggest that too much time on screens can take a toll — but the encouraging news is that balance can be restored. Health professionals are reminding families that it's never too late to rethink how technology fits into daily life. The goal isn't to banish screens but to use them intentionally — for learning, connecting, and creating — while keeping space for life offline. That means getting back to basics: spending more time outside in the daylight, playing, riding bikes, being silly, reading together, drawing, painting, making or listening to music, or even just gazing out the window and daydreaming. These simple, screen-free moments are powerful. They help build sharper minds, stronger relationships, and the kinds of memories that stick.

Stanwood-Camano families now have free access to Qustodio, a digital safety and wellness tool that helps parents set screen time limits, pause internet access, schedule device "bedtimes," and view daily reports. It also adds after-hours filtering on district Chromebooks to support safe and balanced tech use at home. Qustodio is private, COPPA-compliant, and fully supported by Qustodio — not managed by the district.

### RASPBERRY ALMOND TARTS

Delicious almond shortbread tarts filled with sweet raspberry preserves dusted with confectioners' sugar, Enjoy!



INGREDIENTS: 1 c. all-purpose flour, 1/2 c. almond flour, 1/3 c. granulated sugar, 1/4 tsp. baking powder, 1/4 tsp. kosher salt, 1/2 c. unsalted butter, cubed, 1/2 tsp. vanilla extract, 1/4 tsp. almond extract, 1/2 c. raspberry preserves, Confectioners' sugar for dusting

DIRECTIONS: Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Line a mini muffin pan with paper liners to ensure the tarts can be removed with ease. In a medium bowl, whisk together the all-purpose flour, almond flour, sugar, baking powder, and salt. Add the flour mixture to a food processor. Add the cubed butter along with the vanilla and almond extracts. Pulse the mixture until it begins to form a dough when squeezed in your hand. Once the desired consistency has been achieved, pour the dough back into the bowl, gently knead until smooth. Using a small cookie scoop portion out the dough and roll into balls and place them into the prepared muffin liners. Use the end of a wooden spoon to create an indentation atop each dough ball, approximately 1/4-inch deep to accommodate the raspberry preserves. Fill a plastic zip-top bag with the raspberry preserves, expelling any air before sealing. Snip off a small corner of the bag and carefully pipe the preserves into the indentation in the dough. Place the tarts into the oven and bake for 13-15 minutes or until they are golden brown and fully set. Allow the tarts to cool in the pan for 20 minutes to prevent them from crumbling when removed. (To ensure they didn't crumble, I placed them in the refrigerator for 30 minutes. Once cooled, use a thin sharp paring knife to help lift the tarts out of the pan. To serve, gently remove the liners and garnish with a dusting of confectioners' sugar and more preserves if desired. Store in an airtight container for up to 5 days. Enjoy!

I typically fill in much of this free time with fun activities like appointments with my eye doctor, dermatologist, pulmonologist, urologist, and physical therapist. I now know most of their kids' names.

Best of all, I now have all the time in the world to focus on self-improvement. Like exercise, for example. I've always been an active person – until my knees decided that walking downstairs was overrated. So, instead of running marathons like I once did back in my thirties, I work out in different ways. And I usually won't wake up until at least 15 minutes later, when I need to pee.

Okay, sure, getting old has its challenges, but I try to stay optimistic. True, I spend half my day running from one doctor's appointment to the next, and yes, my knees sound like a bowl of Rice Krispies when I get up in the morning. But there's something special about this stage of life – although for the life of me, I can't seem to remember what that is at the moment. It will come to me later – when I lie awake at 3:00 a.m., deciding whether or not to pee.

But, hey, at least I'm still winning the game of What Day Is It? Or at least, I will be as soon as I take my pills and remember where I put my glasses.
