


"BIG RIG TRUCK" LIGHTED CRUISE




A CHRISTMAS CAROL ON THE CHINESE SOUTH END

But Santa always did seem to find the South End on Christmas ... which didn't help to explain the half empty stockings and the paucity of presents under the tree every year at our house. We kids just figured Santa had checked his stupid list, probably twice, and we were blacklisted on the NAUGHTY side once again. PINECONE TREE CRAFT

Supplies needed to make a pinecone Christmas tree: Pinecones, Wood slices, Wooden stars, Acrylic Paint (Green, White, Red, Yellow, Blue), Paintbrushes, Hot Glue Gun

The first step is to paint your pinecone solid green. I used green acrylic paint and a fairly small paintbrush. Definitely try to make sure to get in all the little crevices. This may take one or two coats of paint to make sure everything is covered and there is no pinecone showing through. Alternatively, you could leave a bit of pinecone showing through on purpose. This would make for a more rustic looking Christmas Tree. Once the pinecone is completely dry it is time to move onto some snow! Using a small paintbrush and white acrylic paint, create some snow covered branches by painting the tips of the pinecone. Next, go in with another small paintbrush and add tiny little Christmas lights. I picked up these small wooden stars from my local craft supply store. Again using acrylic paint, I covered both sides of this wooden star a bright vellow paint. Using a few dabs of hot glue, I attached the painted Christmas Tree to the wood slice. For the final touch, I again used hot glue to stick the wooden star to the top of the pinecone. Since it's a smaller, thinner area than the base of the pinecone, I would recommend holding the star in place for a few seconds while you let the glue fully dry.

CARAMEL PECAN CINNAMON ROLLS

A Christmas morning tradition in our family, this recipe lovingly known as "Sticky Buns," has been passed down 6 generations! Merry Christmas from our family to yours!



CINNAMON ROLLS: 3 pkg. dry active yeast; 1/2 c. warm water; 2 c. milk; 1/2 c. butter, softened, plus 1/2 c. for kneading & spreading over dough; 1/2 c. granulated sugar; 2 tsp. salt; 2 eggs, lightly beaten; 6 c. all-purpose flour

CINNAMON SUGAR: 1 c. granulated sugar; 3 T. cinnamon

CARAMEL PECAN TOPPING: 1/2 c. butter, melted, divided; 1 1/3 c. brown sugar, divided; 1 c. light corn syrup, divided; 2 c. pecans, chopped, divided

DIRECTIONS: 1. CINNAMON ROLLS: Preheat oven to 400 degrees. In a small bowl dissolve yeast in warm water and set aside. In a large saucepan, over low heat, combine milk, 1/2 cup butter, sugar, and salt. Heat until butter has melted, stirring occasionally; do not bring to a boil. Remove from heat, pour into a large mixing bowl, beat in eggs, and yeast mixture. Gradually add 3 cups of flour, until combined. Slowly add 3 more cups of flour, mix well. Turn dough onto a buttered surface. Knead dough with buttered hands, do NOT use more flour, butter hands frequently. Place dough into a large, buttered bowl, cover with a dish towel, let rise until dough has doubled in size. 2. CINNAMON SUGAR: In a small bowl stir together sugar and cinnamon, set aside. 3. CARAMEL PECAN TOPPING: Prepare in two 9x13-inch glass baking dishes. Place 1/4 cup butter in each baking dish. Heat in the oven until melted, watch closely, making sure not to burn the butter, remove from oven. Stir in 2/3 cup brown sugar and 1/2 cup corn syrup in each baking dish, spread evenly to cover the bottom of the baking dishes. Sprinkle 1 cup chopped pecans over each dish, set aside. 4. When dough has risen, butter a large flat surface and roll out dough 1/4 - 1/2-inch thick. Butter dough and sprinkle with cinnamon sugar, roll into a log and slice into 24 1-inch pieces. Arrange 12 rolls in each dish over caramel and pecans, cover with a towel again and let rise. 5. Bake for 15 to 20 minutes. Remove from oven, let stand 3-5 minutes, then carefully invert dish onto a sheet of foil. Let cool, then cover with foil. Yields 24 rolls
