





PING PONG BALL PLANETS

by Debbie Chapman



These ping pong ball planets are out of this world! This fun and colourful art project is the perfect way to bring the solar system to life. Kids can make vibrant designs to represent real planets, or let their imaginations run wild by creating their very own glowing planets. Materials: Ping pong ball(s); Acrylic paint (multiple colors); Battery operated tealight candle

Equipment: Round cake pan; Tin foil; Craft knife; Glue gun Instructions: Step 1: Find what you need. Step 2: Add paint to a covered cake pan. Cover a cake pan or baking dish with aluminum foil. You want to use something with tall enough edges to contain the ping pong ball as it moves around. Choose your first color and add dots of acrylic paint around the foil. Repeat with 2 to 3 more colors. We recommend using white as one of your "colors" – it helps to create a marbled look and lightens the shades of your colours in certain areas. Step 3: Roll the ping pong ball around. Set a ping pong ball down into the paint. Pick up the cake pan and tilt it back and forth, coating the ping pong ball in the paint Continue until the ball is completely covered and you're happy with the look. Step 4: Allow to dry and add to a tealight candle. Repeat with different colours of paint to make another planet or two, if you'd like. Allow the ping pong balls to dry on a parchment lined tray. (Keep reading below for more paint drying tips.). Use a craft knife to cut a hole in one side of the ping pong ball. It should be large enough to fit the "flame" of the battery operated tealight candle. Apply a thin line of hot glue around the opening you just made on the ping pong ball. Insert the tealight into the ping pong ball and press them together. Your ping pong ball planet is complete! Then watch the planets glow and light up the room once you turn the tealight candles on!

Helpful Tips: If you'd like to speed up the drying process, once the top of the planet is dry you can create a little "cradle" of tinfoil. This will stop the ball from rolling. Place the ping pong ball in this cradle with the wet paint facing up. Test your flameless tealight before gluing it onto the ping pong ball to make sure that it works. We recommend buying enough supplies so everyone can make at least a few ping pong planets. It's so fun to try different color combinations!

BOTTLE CAP FISHING LURES




They are the perfect gift for those men who love to fish or drink beer...or do a little bit of both...at the same time. Of course you don't have to use beer caps. You could use soda caps as well. These are super easy and cheap to make. You just need some bottle caps, treble hooks, swivel snap connectors and some round slip jump rings. I purchased all of my items from Amazon. Start off by pinching the caps together with your fingers. Now you will want to drill the ends of the caps right in the pinched crease. Measure with the split rings to see where you should drill. You may need to flatten the pinched end of the cap just a tiny bit to get the drill in there easier. Plus it makes getting the split rings in easier too. Just use a screwdriver or any small blunt item to flatten them. Drill the other side. Now insert the split rings into the drilled holes. Next attach the hook and swivel to the split rings. And that is it.

"When I was 6, I wanted to be a writer. I wrote stories of all sorts and poems seem to float off my tongue onto paper like nothing. I remember starting my first book at around 12. My grandmother gave me her old typewriter to use. The keys would stick together if I started typing too fast, but it didn't bother me, I was writing. In 4th grade I discovered reading comprehension. It was like a whole new world. I found myself walking to the library once a week. I was fascinated with reading. The movies going on inside my head enticed me to read more. Of course, somewhere in there I dreamed of becoming a mother. I wanted 6 kids. A large family to love. To give them something I felt I didn't have much of growing up. It's my most proud accomplished dream of all. Almost 50 years later what do I have to show for it? Lots of memories. Whether good or bad. The good ones of course are cherished, like the birth of all four of my kids, or the day I married my best friend. The bad, or perhaps just hard life experiences, and lessons learned, fade into a future story or poem, usually. Quite frankly, I would not be the person I am today without it. Mistakes make us wiser; stronger. Mistakes are the building blocks of our foundations core. The day my grandmother died, I stopped writing. I aced my English classes in college despite having dyslexia and ADHD. When one loves something, things seem to just fall naturally into place and yet I didn't pursue my writing. When my oldest daughter was about 12 years old and about 4 years after my beloved grandmother's death, I took to the pen again. My daughter became my new inspiration to a story. The idea and plot were there. My heart was in the right place. I wanted to write a book that my daughter could relate to. Reading was important during this time, (anytime really, reading is always important) she needed to get past her (what I now know to be dyslexia) anxiety. Watching my children not pursue their dreams, no matter how much it pays or doesn't pay the bills, literally breaks my heart. I see the discouragement in their eyes and pray that they never give up on their dreams. Life is a journey and there will bumps in the road. The lesson: it's not how long it takes to get there, but that you get there. Besides, I truly believe if it's your God given gift or talent, then pursue it. It will make you happy and may even pay your bills. My heart is telling me that God is steering me down a new path — rather, an old path that has always been there, but the weeds are now gone, and the way is clear. I know now, the difference between writing, and making it a reality... is a pen." - Emmy R Bennett.

SKEETER'S ADVICE COLUMN



COMMUNITY INVITED TO Q&A SESSIONS ON EMS LEVY RENEWAL

Measure will appear on Aug. 5 primary election ballot. Camano Island Fire & Rescue will ask voters to consider renewing its emergency medical services (EMS) levy during the Aug. 5 primary election. The measure would restore the levy rate to \$0.50 per \$1,000 of assessed property value—the same amount approved by voters in 2021—and provide essential funding for emergency personnel, a new ambulance, and critical medical equipment and supplies. To help residents learn more, the district will host two public Q&A sessions with Chief Jason Allen: Wednesday, July 16, 6:30-7:30 p.m. at the Mabana Station (3651 South Camano Dr.); Wednesday, July 23, 6:30-7:30 p.m. at the Terry's Corner Station (525 E. North Camano Dr.). EMS accounts for 68% of all calls to the Camano Fire. As demand increases, so do the costs for staffing, vehicles, and medical equipment—all of which have seen steep increases since 2020. Although the EMS levy was set at \$0.50 when approved in 2021, it has decreased to \$0.37 due to the state's 1% cap on annual property tax revenue growth. This reduced rate no longer keeps pace with the rising costs of providing service. Renewing the levy would allow the district to hire additional personnel to improve response times, replace aging emergency vehicles, and invest in life-saving tools such as cardiac monitors, defibrillators, and automated CPR machines. "Providing fast, reliable medical care when it matters most is our top priority," Chief Allen said. "Renewing this levy means we can continue delivering the high-level EMS service our community depends on." If approved, the levy would cost the owner of a property assessed at \$650,000 an additional \$7.04 more per month—or \$84.50 annually. 

DUNGENESS CRAB CAKES

Serve our delicious crab cakes on toasted buns with lettuce, tomato, and spicy mayo OR as an appetizer with lemon wedges and Sriracha mayonnaise for dipping, Enjoy!



CRAB CAKES: 1 lb. fresh Dungeness crab meat; 1 lg. egg beaten; 1/2 c. mayonnaise; 1 1/2 tsp. Dijon mustard; 1 tsp. Old Bay seasoning; 1 tsp. lemon juice; 1/2 tsp. Worcestershire sauce; 1/4 tsp. kosher salt; 1 c. breadcrumbs; 1 T. fresh flat-leaf parsley chopped; 1 T. unsalted butter; 1 T. olive oil; Lemon wedges for serving

SRIRACHA MAYONNAISE: 1 c. mayonnaise; 1 T. Sriracha sauce DIRECTIONS: 1. Pick through the crab meat, removing all shells. 2. In a large bowl, beat the egg slightly, whisk in 1/2 cup mayonnaise, mustard, Old Bay, lemon juice, Worcestershire sauce, and salt. Stir in breadcrumbs and parsley. Add the crab meat; toss gently until combined. 3. Shape the crab mixture into 8 cakes about 1-inch thick for appetizers or 4-6 cakes for sandwiches. Cover with plastic and refrigerate for 1 hour. 4. In a nonstick skillet, heat butter with olive oil over medium heat. Fry the crab cakes 4 minutes per side until golden brown and cooked through (internal temperature of 165 degrees). Repeat with remaining crab cakes, adding more oil if needed. 5. Serve on toasted buns with lettuce and tomato and Sriracha mayonnaise OR serve smaller crab cakes as appetizers with lemon wedges and Sriracha mayonnaise or your favorite dipping sauce. 6. SRIRACHA MAYONNAISE: In a small bowl, stir together 1 cup of mayonnaise and Sriracha sauce. Cover and refrigerate until ready to use.




