Camano Islander Patricia Rhinevault knew she wanted horses. Instead of starting barn and pasture projects at their new acreage on their own, they reached out to us first. We're here to equip livestock owners with needed tools and resources. Our farm planner Michael Hipp connected with the Rhinevaults and helped them start from the ground up, literally! He conducted a soil test to reveal what was needed to grow healthy pasture grasses and used LiDAR maps to reveal which areas to avoid building structures upon or near due to soil saturation. "Getting ideas from him was really great for us, and knowing we had support was so nice." Patricia said. This has been a project five years in the making, but for the Rhinevaults, it's finally paying off. "I just want a horse," Patricia said with a smile. "This has been a very long time coming." FREE FIREARMS SAFETY TRAINING

CLESF offers FREE firearms training appropriate for first time firearms owners or those thinking about purchasing a firearm, or a good reminder for those who own a firearm and for parents who wish to discuss firearms with their children. Owning and using a firearm comes with significant responsibilities. The State of Washington enacted legislation requiring certain buyers of firearms to complete a firearms safety training program prior to purchasing a firearm. The training offered by CLESF meets the requirements of the legislation. Equally important, suicide is the second most common cause of death among teen agers. The use of a firearm is a common means of teenage suicide. The training is a useful discussion guide for parents in talking with their children. This training bridges the gap between no training and in-person training, which is encouraged. The training satisfies the Washington State RCW 9.41.090 requirements from I-1639. There is no cost for this firearms training. If you wish to participate in the free online training, contact SCSOTRAINING@Spokane-Sheriff.org by email including your full name and email address. In about five business days, you will receive registration information for the training. Please follow the instructions to register for the training. The class will take about thirty minutes to complete. Following the class, you will be asked to take an exam to test what you learned. You must pass with 100% to complete the course and print your certificate of completion. CLESF recommends complementary firearms safety training at https://washington-safeinsight.talentlms.com/index. Safe Insight provides a series of FREE video training covering the safe use of firearms, the proper selection of ammunition and more.

The Tiny Free Gallery features small original works that artists and crafters want to share with the community. "The Tiny Free Gallery is about bringing joy into people's lives through the gift of art," said Patricia Resseguie, who manages the gallery. "The Madrona neighborhood attracts many walkers and Island visitors. I see them stop daily to look at the gallery and occasionally to take an artwork. It starts conversations and brings smiles to faces. This is all for the love of artists and art and the people who love art." Contributors to the gallery have brought small prints, drawings and paintings, jewelry, as well as ceramics, mixed media, and fabric and glass pieces. In addition, some of those who have contributed to the gallery have brought small works from their art collections that they want to rehome. Patricia curates the gallery regularly to keep the exhibitions Interesting. There is also a free box of simple art supplies for kids, who might be inspired by what they see. Kid's art is welcome for display in the gallery. The Tiny Free Gallery was designed and built by Camano artist Greg Cannistraci. The Stanwood Area Historical Society asks, "Did You Know?"

Excerpts taken from the "Stanwood Story", written for the Stanwood News by Alice Essex. Before the beginning of the 1938 term, the stately old North Street Grade School, that was the pride of the town when it was built in 1893 had been razed. In September, elementary school youngsters moved into the 1914 vacated, brick building on North Street, that had been Stanwood's first high school.

Spring 1938 had brought another attempt towards consolidating the Stanwood and East Stanwood districts, but to no avail. The proposition went down ignominious defeat with a vote of 577 "against", 154 "for". The eastside district, comprised of Cedarhome, Victoria, Pleasant Hill, Woodland and East Stanwood, had received a \$27,000 government grant and passed a 30-mill special levy for construction of a two-story addition to Lincoln and chose to carry on without consolidation.

Work proceeded on schedule and dedicatory ceremonies at Lincoln were held May 4, 1938 amid much fanfare. Peter Henning presided; Gov. Clarence Martin and former Superintendent A.A. Mykland, were among the dignitaries present. So it was that Lincoln acquired three new classrooms, offices and a gym with a 48 x 80 foot playing floor.

Dedication of the consolidated Stanwood High School was pushed ahead to Nov. 11, 1939 awaiting completion of the athletic field, grounds, landscaping, tennis and handball courts, for which an additional grant had come from WPA.

A parade of Boy Scouts, Legion and VFW vets, led by the Stanwood High School Band, marched from the city hall to the football field to kick off the afternoon program. During halves of the game, between the Stanwood Pirates and Lincoln Lynx, O'Conner Field was dedicated in memory of Dr. J.J. O'Conner, the school's first and much-loved football coach. Alumni and members of the first team took part in the ceremony.

Some 400 grads came for the event, which was topped off with a banquet in the city hall and concluded with the evening dedication of the building and grounds. Gov. Clarence Martin and representatives of the Works Progress Administration were among the guests of honor.

By way of comparison with current prices, total cost of the project was given as \$185,000, of which \$113,000 was for the building. Site and equipment were listed at \$4,500 each; athletic field, grounds, landscaping and courts, \$48,750; miscellaneous \$2,750; three new school buses, \$16,000.

Perseverance had won. But it would take several years yet before full consolidation of the Stanwood and East Stanwood school districts could occur. And it would only follow after some national publicity for this modest community.

The record pea crops that looked so bright in 1938, lost much of their glow as 1939 rolled around. Across the nation, warehouses were piled high with surplus packs...awaiting buyers. Prices had dropped, and in the Twin Cities, the \$7,000 per day seasonal payroll from local plants appeared to be falling out the window, temporarily at least. Acreage cuts loomed and the coming season outlook was gloomy. What to do was the question.

In February, merchants and mayors of the two towns came to the rescue. Mayor Charles Dockendorf of Stanwood and Mayor H.R. Greer of East Stanwood issued a proclamation that hopefully, would get the surplus on the move. Feb. 12, 1939, the first annual Pea Day in the Twin Cities...and the action began. More on the Pea Day next time.

SIZE OF THINGS

Take a look at the image above. Beautiful color, impressive detail. Probably taken with a rather equally impressively large telescope? The above image was actually taken with a camera lens. Imaged by Dave Weixelman at Lone Pine, CA (on the eastern edge of the Sierra Nevada Mountains), a nice astro imaging camera and his 50+ years of expertise played a large role in the quality of the outcome, but more of our sky than we imagine is filled with the surprisingly large and surprisingly colorful. Some objects can be quite small, especially as distance increases, but many span a fair percentage of sky. The Andromeda Galaxy, the many glowing clouds of hydrogen and dust, and of course The Milky Way itself, all cover large swatches of sky. If our eyes were more sensitive it is doubtful we would describe the night as black. In fact the only reason we don't see color at night is not because the color isn't there, but because our eyes are just not sensitive enough to see it. The next time you gaze at up at night remember you are surrounded by much more than stars, but also by a brilliantly colorful tapestry that extends all around us.



MEDITERRANEAN QUICHE

Serve Mom a healthy veggie quiche packed with Mediterranean flavors for brunch on Mother's Day!

INGREDIENTS: 1 (9-inch) prepared deep dish pie crust; 2 T. butter; 1 sm. yellow onion, diced; 2 cloves garlic, minced; 1 sm. red pepper, diced; 2 c. fresh spinach; 1/4 c. sliced Kalamata olives; 1 tsp. dried oregano; 1 tsp. dried parsley; 1/2 c. sundried tomatoes in olive oil & herbs, chopped; 1/3 c. crumble feta cheese; 4 lg. eggs; 1/2 c. milk; 1/2 c. heavy cream; Black pepper to taste; 1 c. shredded sharp cheddar cheese, divided

DIRECTIONS: Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Fit a 9-inch-deep pie plate with prepared pie crust. Flute the edges; set aside. In a large skillet over medium heat melt the butter. Add onion and garlic, cook until just tender about 3 minutes. Add red pepper cook an additional 3 minutes or until the pepper is just tender. Add spinach, olives, oregano, and parsley. Cook until the spinach is wilted about 2-3 minutes more. Remove from heat. Using paper towels, squeeze out as much oil from the tomatoes as possible and chop. Gently stir in tomatoes and feta cheese into the spinach mixture. Spoon the mixture evenly into the prepared pie crust; set aside. In a medium bowl, whisk together eggs, milk, heavy cream, black pepper and ½ cup of the cheddar cheese. Pour this mixture evenly over the spinach mixture in the pie crust. Sprinkle the top with remaining ½ cup cheddar cheese. Bake for 50-55 minutes or until the top is golden brown and the egg is set. Cool for 10-15 minutes before slicing and serving.


