MEMORIAL DAY CRAFT: CUPCAKE LINER POPPY

Materials needed: 4 miniature red cupcake liners (per craft), one straw or craft stick (stem of the poppy), glue sticks, one yellow button (per craft) and a black permanent marker.

Invite the children to create by placing all the supplies out on a tray or table. Demonstrate how to flatten each of the 4 cupcake liners for the children. Have the children flatten and arrange the cupcake liners into two rows of 2 (see photo above). The children can slightly overlap the cupcake liners and glue together to resemble a poppy. For the stem, have the children glue a craft stick or staple a straw to the back of their poppy craft. The children can add the yellow button and use a black marker for the poppy's center if desired (see photo).

The poppies are an easy craft to accompany a basic introduction of Memorial Day for children. While young children may not yet comprehend the significance of Memorial Day, as parents and teachers we are "planting tiny seeds" of knowledge that will grow as they do!

MEMORIAL DAY US FLAG OPTICAL ILLUSION

Stare at a star on the flag above without moving your eyes for about 20 seconds, then look away (best look toward a blank white wall). You'll briefly see an image of the normal flag. How this bizarre illusion works. The secret here has to do with a phenomenon called an afterimage.

Afterimages are produced when you look at an object without moving your eyes for about 20 seconds or more. During this time, the receptor cells in your eyes responsible for converting light into an electrical signal (which goes to your brain) gradually become desensitized, because they run out of the photopigments needed to conduct that signal. Your brain compensates by adapting to their decreasing signal level and interpreting it as normal. Once the image is taken away, the least-depleted receptor cells — which had been looking at the darkest part of the image, taking in the least amount of light — jump into action at full strength. Your visual system is overwhelmed by their input, and briefly interprets it as a negative of the original image, even when it's not there.

This works to produce negative afterimages of black-and-white objects, but it can also produce inverted color afterimages because of the way our eyes perceive color. We have three different color-sensitive receptors (called cones), which perceive blue, green, and red. They work in combination to register other colors, just as we can mix these primary colors on a palette to produce any color. If your blue receptors get tired out by staring at a blue image, the afterimage will be the inverted color: orange. If you exhaust your red receptors, the afterimage will be green.

MY TENTH GRADE SCIENCE EXPERIMENT

When I was in tenth grade, I had a science experiment to do and I was running very short on time. It was due in a couple days and I had only barely started on my experiment. I decided to do an experiment involving "rust" and the rusting process, and how some elements can accelerate the rusting process while others tend to impede or decelerate it.

The relevance of this point will become clear in a couple paragraphs, so be patient.

I followed the book's instructions to a T: "Immerse the metal rods in boiled linseed oil..." The book clearly said to immerse the metal rods in "boiled linseed oil." Now here is a handy tip for future reference: Read the instructions on the can of linseed oil before you begin to boil it.

And here is the funny thing, I didn't know it at the time, but linseed oil actually comes boiled already. Imagine my surprise when after the flames erupted to a level of 6 feet I subsequently discovered that 1) not only did the can actually say that it contained "boiled linseed oil" right there on the can, but also 2) that under the instructions on the back side of the can, it says "WARNING: Highly combustible if exposed to intense heat."

Well, here is the fascinating part. It turns out this was not the worst part. Because there's one thing worse than a spiraling, spitting, flaming cauldron of uncontrolled boiling boiled linseed oil. And that would this very same element immediately AFTER you tried to put the flames out with a bucket of water. Apparently — and this is the part I did not know at that point in my educational development — different types of flames require different types of extinguishing. Did you know that not all flames take kindly to having water doused on them? Neither did I! Well, I am happy to say that the flames all went out in an instant. For full disclosure, however, I must also report that in that same instant the entire room turned into a black sea of smoke and soot. I could not see two feet in front of me. In a flash — roughly coincident with the contact of water on the boiling boiled linseed oil — the entire room, floor to ceiling was consumed by an instant cloud of thick black smoke. It was not until hours later



that I was able to actually read the rest of the warning label about “in the event of fire, do not apply water.” Oops..

After about 25 minutes most of the smoke had dispersed, providing me a very clear view of the blackened walls, floor, and best of all, the ten foot ceiling, appearing as if someone had painted the room “Midnight Black” with one wave of a magic wand. Now please refer back to the part about my father’s unusually early surprise return home that day. That happened right about now.

My father previously had flipped out on a prior occasion when I had returned a tape dispenser to the wrong drawer (true!) so perhaps you can use that reaction as an approximate benchmark to project his level of response in this somewhat more catastrophic situation. I vaguely recall something about him screaming that I would be “cleaning up every square inch of this room with a toothbrush” and being grounded until the next visit of Halley’s Comet.

So there are several important things to take from this experience: 1) Linseed oil comes pre-boiled; 2) when you choose to ignore lesson #1 and boil the boiled linseed oil anyway, never use water to put out the flames and 3) if you choose to ignore lessons 1 and 2 above, at least be sure you have a father who really has a strong appreciation for black as an interior decorating color for walls and ceiling.

But there is one lesson that to this day I never was able to find out: whether boiled linseed oil was in fact a rust inhibitor or rust accelerator. I guess there are some mysteries in life that we will simply have to accept we will never know the answers to, and for me, this is one of them.






ART SHOW AND WARTIME EXPERIENCE OF FRED PILKINGTON

As a platoon sergeant, Fred Pilkington was taken prisoner during the Battle of the Bulge in 1944 spending four months in captivity. He wrote an account of his time as a soldier during wartime combat and what life was like in those German Prison camps. After the war, Fred stayed in the Army Reserves and at the time of his death, had achieved the rank of Colonel. In 2014, he was buried in Arlington National Cemetery with the highest honors the Army bestows. When he got out of active service, Fred returned to Hartwick College and graduated cum laude with a BA degree and qualified to teach Art and English. In 1946, he began teaching high school art and coaching football. After taking courses at night in New York City, he received his Master's Degree in Art Education from New York University. After a successful career as a high school art teacher, head of the art department and Assistant Principal, he retired from education in 1979. He moved to Camano Island in 1987 and began pursuing his art on a full-time basis, exhibiting in shows, winning awards, and being represented by Karla Matzke in her Fine Art Gallery and Sculpture Park. He was a long-time member of the Camano Arts Association, creating and printing his art until the end of his life. Fred's mediums included painting, sculpture, serigraphy, ceramics, leather, pen and ink, pastel and watercolor; however, his true love was printmaking: creating and printing block prints and etchings.

On May 31st, we will show examples of his art on the main floor of the Floyd Norgaard Cultural Center, curated by his widow and fellow artist, Mary Pilkington. There will also be an exhibit of his wartime combat experience. Did You Know?



The Stanwood Area Historical Society asks, "Did You Know?"

Excerpts taken from the "Stanwood Story", written for the Stanwood News by Alice Essex.

"A case of Peas in Every Pantry" streamed across the page ads announcing the drive. Special prices were offered on case lots and prizes of canned peas were given away at the NEWS, the Ideal Theater, Hartney's and other stores. Says the record, "Despite disagreeable weather, 190 cases were sold." While this was a mere drop in the surplus bucket, it kicked-off the promotion which continued into March and was given a boost by two big pea sales at IGA stores.

Soon the Snohomish County Chamber of Commerce swung into action with an endorsement of the campaign and \$150,000 was anted up by processors about the country for a marketing splurge. How much was accomplished for local plants is a matter of conjecture, but they weathered the storm and Pea Day went down in the annals as a unique and united effort for the good of the community.

A brighter note was sounded in April, when Camano Blue Point Oyster Co., which had been through troubled times, announced that its plant would re-open when repairs were completed. That work would be available for 30 to 40 people was welcome news. "Only the steam pack would be used and only oysters from the Livingston Bay beds would be processed," said Guy E. Dobson of Everett, president of the plant.

While the towns had been busy meeting the ups and downs of business, the winter playground crowd had been enjoying ups and downs on the ski slopes. Enthusiasm was growing for a local ski club, and in fall 1938 the Fjeld Ski Club was organized. John M. Eilertsen, who had been sharing jumping awards with Toney Knutsen, at the various tournaments, was elected president.

Some 40 men and women became charter members; among them were skiers from Arlington, Marysville, Mount Vernon and other towns.

A ski hut at Mt. Baker, which had been built by a group of local skiers before the club was officially formed, became the ski-slope headquarters for the newly organized club. Located a mile below the present lodge, it is thought to be the second facility at Mt. Baker. Bellingham, says the report, was first on the scene.

The big moment for the Fjeld Club came in April, when an inaugural tournament was held by the two clubs on Fjeld grounds. Reidar Anderson, world champion skier from Oslo, Norway, won the Class A competition; other winners, besides Knutsen and Eilertsen, were from Revelstoke, Vancouver and Holly, B.C. The tournament ended the first jumping season for the local club and Eilertsen was lauded for arranging a successful competition. Knutsen recalls that the Fjeld Club continued for about 10 years. The hut, eventually and unfortunately, became a lush blackberry patch and hideout for bears, and was torn down around 1960. In the spring, two special events for women made community news. First, came the Friendly Neighbor Cooking School at the Sons of Norway Hall. Standing room only during its two-day run, was proof that it captured the interest of the area's famous cooks. How to stretch the budget by cooking on electric stoves was the theme of the program, which also included cooking classes and a PTA baking contest.

Home economist, Mrs. Edith Rauch, shared her know-how on kitchen management, valuable prizes were awarded and the event was declared a big success to the pleasure of its sponsors, the Puget Sound Power and Light Co. and the Twin City News. The paper, incidentally, had changed ownership the preceding September; Harry Dence and Raymond Horn had become its editors and publishers.





TERIYAKI CHICKEN KEBABS

Marinated teriyaki chicken, colorful bell peppers, sweet pineapple, and red onions cooked over an outdoor grill. This dish SCREAMS summer!

INGREDIENTS: 1 1/2 lbs boneless skinless chicken breast, cut into 1-inch cubes; 1 lg. red bell pepper, seeded & cut into 1-inch pieces; 1 lg. green bell pepper, seeded & cut into 1-inch piece; 1 lg. yellow bell pepper, seeded & cut into 1-inch pieces; 1 lg. red onion, peeled & cut into 1-inch pieces; 1 whole pineapple, peeled, cored, & cut into 1-inch chunks; 1 1/2 c. Yoshidas teriyaki sauce, for glaze; 2 green onions, thinly sliced for garnish; Hot cooked jasmine rice for serving, optional; 8 (10 to 12-inch) metal skewers

DIRECTIONS: 1. Cut chicken into 1-inch cubes. Cut peppers, onion & pineapple into 1-inch pieces; set aside. 2. Assemble kebabs by alternating chicken and veggies until each skewer is full. 3. **TERIYAKI GLAZE:** Pour teriyaki sauce into a saucepan over medium-high heat, stirring occasionally. Once the sauce comes to a boil, reduce the heat and simmer until it has reduced and thickened a bit, about 10-15 minutes. 4. Meanwhile, preheat an outdoor grill to 350 degrees. 5. Place kebabs on the grill. Cook turning occasionally, until the chicken is completely cooked through, reaching an internal temperature of 165 degrees about 10-12 minutes. 6. Brush on teriyaki glaze and cook another 3-5 minutes. Remove kebabs from heat, brush with more glaze and garnish with green onions. Serve immediately over jasmine rice with remaining glaze, if desired. Yields 8 kebabs.
