

DIY SIDEWALK FOAM PAINT

Supplies: Two 4 oz. bottles of WASHABLE school glue; 1 cup white flour; 4-5 cups plain white shaving foam; food coloring drops; 1 gallon plastic zipper bag; sandwich-sized plastic zipper bags – 1 per food coloring; scissors; Optional: plastic squirt bottles (such as used for tie dyeing)

Directions: 1. In a gallon-size plastic zipper bag add 1 cup of flour. 2. Pour both bottles of washable school glue on top of the flour. Make sure it's washable for easy clean up! 3. Spray about 4-5 cups of shaving foam into the bag. At first I attempted to measure it in a measuring cup, but it was ridiculous trying to get it out of the measuring cup. So, after the first cup, I just eyeballed it. 4. Close the bag and knead it for a few minutes until everything is totally mixed. 5. Snip one corner of the big bag and squirt into sandwich-sized plastic zipper bags to divide it up per color. I went with four neon food coloring bottles, so I divided it up into 4 smaller bags. One each of blue, purple, pink, and green. 6. Add 10 drops of one food coloring to each bag. 7. Knead each smaller bag until color is throughout all the bag. 8. Snip off the edge and squirt it into plastic squirt bottles. Or you can be frugal and just paint with the zipper bags. If you keep it in the bags, just snip off a tiny corner, so it doens't come out too heavy.



Here's another perk with a small airport: we back out onto the tarmac, rev up the engines and skip the 20 plane taxi. We're always going to be the first in line on the jetway.



They lose interest in things that they previously, loved, like toys. Pet Cockatoos have no role model, except us. We feel it is so important to provide Cockatoos with a better life, a bigger life. That is the motivation to take a path away from the traditional 'warehouse' style of rescue. We have to start somewhere and I started like the others, working out of my home with individual cages. I did a couple of adoptions in 1992 when I started. I was not good at it. I failed both adoptions and blamed myself. For me, it was overwhelming trying to give all of the birds individual attention, clean, feed and repeat. I had a time table and any change in my schedule, meant some of the birds would have to wait until the next day, for their one on one time. I felt so guilty! I didn't have many birds back then and it just wasn't working. I started looking for options. I heard about a Cockatoo breeder in our state, he kept his birds outside and utilized colonies for the "single birds" to meet. I saw the enclosures and immediately knew it would be a solution for the individual cage dilemma and his Cockatoos looked so happy and healthy. From that moment my imagination went wild with possibilities. "Once in a while, we come to a cross road in life, where we can take an unexpected turn. This was mine. "

The Cockatoo Rescue and Sanctuary does not adopt, foster, trade, sell, breed, exhibit or display our birds. Our primary function is to provide a safe, secure, peaceful environment both physically and mentally for all of the birds in our care. This is a closed facility. CAMANO FIRE ENDING COVID VACCINE CLINIC IN JUNE

After four and a half months, and more than 12,000 doses of vaccines given, Camano Island Fire & Rescue will end its local vaccine clinic in June. "Taking care of our community means more than just responding to 911 calls," Chief Levon Yengoyan said. "We stepped up to lead this effort, knowing that access to the vaccine would be difficult, especially for our older residents, and especially with such high demand." Thanks to the partnership of the Camano Center, Island County Public Health and hundreds of volunteers, Camano Fire was able to vaccinate adult-home patients in late January, and open its first public clinic at the beginning of February. The clinic transitioned to a pop-up model at locations around the island in late April and May. Even though no new pop-up vaccine clinics are planned, Camano Fire crews will ensure that people who got first doses of Pfizer are able to get their second doses in late May and June. The Stanwood Area Historical Society asks, "Did You Know?"

Excerpts taken from the "Stanwood Story", written for the Stanwood News by Alice Essex. A few weeks after the cooking school, came the Spring Flower Show and Silver Tea given by the Stillaguamish Garden Club. It also was a capacity crowd affair, which clocked over 1,000 visitors during its weekend showing at the city hall. The Seattle judges were honored at a luncheon and visiting VIPs from the State Federation of Garden Clubs, pronounced it one of the best shows ever held in the Chuckanut District.

While women of the Twin Cities were learning how to pinch a budget penny and add beauty to their gardens, men of the town were keeping a watchful eye on the Stillaguamish River and flood control projects.

A new federal grant in late 1938, had allocated \$200,548 to Snohomish County for improvement and control of the Stilly. Work began at Cook and Thompson sloughs, proceeded downstream to the Forks and, as of Mau 1939, had begun west of Hatt Slough Bridge. Dredging of the channel, which had been urgently pushed for some time, was hoped for.

No official okay, or even encouragement came until November, when District Engineer Lt. Col. L.E. Aitkins announced a public hearing at the city hall. Purpose for the session, said his communique, was to determine whether or not improvement of the Stillaguamish was needed and in the interests of navigation.

Farmers and townspeople were eager and more than 100 turned out. Clyde Brokaw, speaking for the river committee, spelled out the facts, emphasizing that river shipping had increased from 300 tons in 1928 to 9,700 in 1939 and would continue to increase if the channel was cleared. Nine others made pleas for dredging. Among them Mr. Anna Grissom of Skagit River Navigation Co., who gave a vivid account of channel conditions and the hazards to navigation.

Dredging arguments seemed convincing; how they would be evaluated by the Committee on Rivers and Harbors in Washington, D.C. was another matter, so again the community could only wait... hopefully.

The visit of royalty is news anytime and anywhere. In Stanwood on May 27, 1939, it was extra special news because it was the occasion of an extra special ceremony...the dedication of the Toftezen Memorial erected in honor of Washington's first Norwegian settlers.

The town was in full dress on that historic day, when Crown Prince Olaf and Crown Princess Martha of Norway arrived shortly after 11 o'clock in answer to a dedication request from the Sons of Norway and the Stillaguamish Historical Society.

Flags of the two nations lined the streets and waved from the masts of the two city halls. A banner across Main Street expressed greetings in its inscription which read "Olaf and Martha, Welcome to America's Playground, May 1939." Underneath the banner, the shields of the two nations further symbolized the bond between the countries.

The music of the 75-piece Bothell Band and a chorus of 50 male voices heralded the arrival of the royal party as crowds cheered and witnessed the introductions of Norwegian Vice Consul Bjorke of Vancouver, B.C. and Consul Einar Beyer of Seattle, both of whom brought greetings from friends of the Crown Prince and Princess. Dedication speaker, Rev. S.N.J. Ylivsaker, G.B. Joergensen, chairman of the memorial committee, Edwin Johansen, representing the Sons of Norway and others were then introduced by C.J. Gunderson, during the royal visit.

The Quasar 3C 309.1 would without doubt be it. Quasars are "quasi stellar" objects where matter is falling into a super massive black hole usually found at the center of galaxies. They are insanely bright. One guasar will easily outshine its entire host galaxy. That's rather like one light bulb outshining the Sun. How far is it? To answer that we need a bigger yardstick. Our usual mile/kilometers simply won't work here, we need something bigger. Let's take the speed of light, 186,000 miles per second. Still not big enough. Let's take as one unit the distance light would travel in an entire year or about 5.88 trillion miles. The Andromeda galaxy is a wopping 2.5 million light years away. 3C 309.1 is 8 BILLION light years away. Billion with a "B". Because light took 8 billion years to reach us we are seeing it as it was 8 billion years ago. By now it is probably long gone, or put another way, the light left there 3.5 billion years before the Earth was formed.

CHEESEBURGER LETTUCE WRAPS

Low-carb cheeseburgers topped with tomatoes, onions, and pickles, drizzled with spicy Sriracha mayonnaise, and wrapped in lettuce leaves, Enjoy!

SRIRACHA SAUCE: 1/2 c. mayonnaise; 1 T. Sriracha chili sauce CHEESEBUGERS: 1 lb. lean ground beef, chicken, or turkey, divided into 8 small patties; Kosher salt and black pepper to taste TOPPINGS: 4 slices Colby Jack or sharp cheddar cheese, cut to fit burgers; 2 heads Boston lettuce, rinsed & dried; Dill or Bread and Butter pickle slices; 2 tomatoes, thinly sliced; 1 sm. red onion thinly sliced or pickled onions for serving

DIRECTIONS: Prep all ingredients before you begin. SRIRACHA SAUCE: In a small bowl, whisk together mayonnaise and sriracha sauce until combined. Cover and refrigerate until ready to serve. Heat an outdoor grill OR indoor skillet over on medium heat. CHEESEBURGERS: Form 8 evenly sized very thin patties. Season patties on both sides with salt and pepper. Place patties onto the grill OR in the skillet and cook for approximately 2-3 minutes on each side or until cooked to your liking. (If using a skillet, cook 4 patties at a time to avoid over-crowding or use two skillets.) Place a slice of cheese on each cooked burger. TO ASSEMBLE: Lay 2 lettuce leaves on top of each other, followed by 2 pickles, 2 slices of tomato, 2 small patties with melted cheese, red onions, then drizzle with Sriracha sauce. Tightly wrap the lettuce up and over the toppings and Enjoy! Serves 4.


