



will win approval:



A WATER SAFETY REMINDER

Hi all. The tides and currents around our island are no joke: They're strong, fast, and can zip you away from shore in the blink of an eye. That's exactly what happened to a couple of kids yesterday off Iverson Spit. What started as fun afternoon on a floaty ended up involving a Coast Guard helicopter and our marine rescue crews. The incoming tide took the kids for a bit of a wild ride. It was a scary hour for us, for the kids and for their parents, but fortunately we were able to get them safely to shore. Summer is just getting started, and this probably won't be the last "oops, the tide was stronger than I thought" call we get. Our marine rescue crews have a couple recommendations to help you stay safe out there this summer: 1. Wear. A. Life. Jacket. They're called life jackets for a reason: Because they can save your life. It's worth the extra 15 seconds to put one on if you're going to be on the water, in the water, on a floaty, in a kayak or canoe... you get the idea. Uncomfortable? Not fashionable? If that's what it takes to get you to wear one, maybe it's time you invest in one that *IS* comfortable and more ... stylish. 2. Check your tides. We get two high tides and two low tides a day. And for at least one of those high/low cycles, the tide will be moving pretty darn fast on its way in or out. Not sure where to look? Google is your friend. (There is also a 2-week tide table chart on page 46 of this Crab Cracker magazine). Have fun and be smart when you're out on the water. – Camano Island Fire & Rescue

WDFW PUGET SOUND RECREATIONAL CRAB SEASONS FOR THE SUMMER

The Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW) today announced Puget Sound summer crab-fishing seasons, which will get underway July 1 in most marine areas. Crab seasons are scheduled to open as follows: Marine Areas 4 (Neah Bay east of the Bonilla-Tatoosh line), 5 (Sekiu), 6 (East Juan de Fuca Strait), 8-1 (Deception Pass), 8-2 (Port Susan/Everett), and 9 (Port Gamble and Admiralty Inlet): Open July 1 - Sept. 6, Thursdays - Mondays. Marine Area 7 South (San Juan Islands/Bellingham): Open July 15 - Sept. 30, Thursdays-Mondays. Marine Area 7 North (Gulf of Georgia): Open Aug. 19 - Sept. 30, Thursdays – Mondays. Marine Area 10 (Seattle/Bremerton): Open July 11 - Sept. 6. Sundays/Mondays only. Marine Area 11 (Tacoma-Vashon Island): Open July 11 - August 30. Sundays/Mondays only. Marine Area 12 (Hood Canal) north of a line projected true east from Ayock Point: Open July 1 - Sept. 6, Thursdays-Mondays. The following areas are closed this season to allow weak Dungeness crab populations to increase: Marine Area 12 (Hood Canal) south of a line projected true east from Avock Point, Marine Area 13 (South Puget Sound). The daily limit throughout Puget Sound is five Dungeness crab, males only, in hard-shell condition with a minimum carapace width of 6¼ inches. Fishers may also keep six red rock crab of either sex per day in open areas, provided the crab are in hard-shell condition and measure at least 5 inches carapace width. BIG DITCH ACCESS AREA NEAR STANWOOD WILL CLOSE UNTIL OCTOBER 1

Due to significant impacts caused by unlawful activities and a need to protect public safety, the Big Ditch Access Area along Pioneer Highway near Stanwood will be closed June 9 through Oct. 1, 2021. Dike district personnel and neighboring farm owners will still have administrative access. Belinda Rotton, wildlife area manager for the Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW), said the site has seen high levels of trash dumping, vandalism, and target shooting. Area visitors and neighbors have complained about these activities and the local dike district is concerned about potential infrastructure damages. Bird watchers and waterfowl hunters use the site most often for access to the Skagit Bay Estuary during the fall and winter. "Since we're seeing most of the site challenges in the summer, we think the seasonal closure can help address issues with a relatively low recreational impact," said Rotton. The Big Ditch Access Area is within the Skagit Wildlife Area, which contains a little over 16,700 acres of wildlife habitat, including open water, island shoreline, tidal mudflats and marshes, forested uplands, and managed agricultural (diked) lands. This range of habitats provide necessary resources for aquatic and terrestrial species such as ducks, geese, swans, raptors, and shorebirds. By actively managing lands, restoring habitats, and preserving wild places, WDFW serves as stewards for Washington's natural places, protecting the state's land and water for people, fish, and wildlife. WDFW works to preserve, protect and perpetuate fish, wildlife and ecosystems while providing sustainable fish and wildlife recreational and commercial opportunities.

The Stanwood Area Historical Society asks, "Did You Know?"

Excerpts taken from the "Stanwood Story", written for the Stanwood News by Alice Essex. The 1939 dedication of the Toftezen Memorial and visit by Crown Prince Olaf and Crown Princess Martha of Norway continues.

At the Lutheran Cemetery, where the carved granite stone had been placed in memory of the Toftezen family, the drill team and honor guard of Silvana Lodge, Sons of Norway, flanked the platform during the dedication. Erna Thomle, of Stanwood, and Martha Brekhus, of Silvana, in native Norwegian costumes, presented a corsage to the Crown Princess, a boutonniere to the Crown Prince and flowers to others in their party.

Opening the dedication, Gunderson said: "We are gathered for an Historic occasion. As the present generation it is our duty to preserve for generations to follow, the acts and deeds of the past generation." Rev. Ylvisaker then gave a "this is his life" story of Zacharius Matin Toftezen, first Norwegian to come to the State of Washington.

In response, Prince Olaf thanked the town and his countrymen for honoring the family of Norwegian birth and the privilege of unveiling the monument. He then placed a wreath of white carnations at the foot of the stone. Next to it, a wreath of white lilies was placed by Mrs. Marie Beebe Toftezen, the only living relative of the family.

At the conclusion of the ceremon, the entourage preceded to

Stanwood and Our Savior's Lutheran Church, where Rev. and Mrs. Ylvisaker acted as hosts at a luncheon honoring the visitors. Twelve flower girls lined the entrance to the dining hall, where Mayor Charles Dockendorf of Stanwood welcomed the Crown Prince and Princess and their party. Graciously answering the mayor, Prince Olaf said:

"It fills us with pride to view with our own eyes, the real part the natives of Norway and their sons have played in the development of this country and we are glad to have been afforded the opportunity of taking such a prominent part in the dedication of the Toftezen Memorial."

Traveling with the Prince and Princess were the Norwegian Minister to the United States, the Master of Royal Household, the Lady in Waiting, a military aide and others. Due in Everett in midafternoon for a yacht trop around Puget Sound, the entourage left shortly after the Juncheon.

Sharing the publicity spotlight with royalty during the summer of 1939 was the first involvement of the Stillaguamish Grange with youth activities, via sponsorship of a Junior Fair. The citizenry gave endorsement and elaborate preparations were made for the event. Come Fair Days, Sept. 15 and 16, FFA and other students at the two high schools responded with a grand array of entries.

Exhibits of manual arts, hobbies, flowers, sewing, cooking and other categories filled the Lincoln gym, which had been made available for the event. Dairy, sheep, poultry and other livestock were proudly displayed in temporary outdoor pens. The event won such acclaim that a repeat fair was planned for 1940, and Harry Dence was given a vote of thanks for enthusiastic promotion of the project.

November bought another dedication...Wenberg Park at Lake Goodwin, the area's first recreational facility and one much used by the public. Labor, time and materials had been donated through the year for transforming the site into a park with baseball diamond, horseshoe pits...even a mini stadium with speakers' platform. Besides those, there were picnic tables, shady trails, kitchen facilities and steps to the beach for surf-side activities.

OUR UNIVERSE IS A BIG PLACE. REALLY BIG.

It was thought, not that long ago, that Earth occupied a central point in the cosmos and those lights in the sky were tied to not so distant spheres. Then we found out those "wandering stars" were actually planets and those planets did not revolve around us. It was quite the blow to the ego. Then we discovered the Milky Way is actually an enormous collection of several hundred BILLION suns, our own residing on one of its outer arms. If we shrink our Sun to a grain of sand, the Earth, a microscopic spec, would be one inch away. Even at this tiny scale, our galaxy would be 100,000 miles across. This, it was thought, must be THE universe. Then Edwin Hubble (for which the telescope was named) discovered those small faint smudges in the night sky were not gas clouds, but other distant galaxies. Not only were they as large, and larger, than our own galaxy, but the space between them was mind boggling. If we launch a spacecraft at a speed of the fastest human object every produced, the Helios probe, at 144,000 miles an hour, it would take 10 billion years to reach Andromeda, our closest galaxy neighbor. These galaxies were then discovered to exist in large groups. We live in the Virgo Galaxy Cluster. Our address would be Earth, Solar System, The Local Group, Virgo Galaxy Cluster, Universe.

Today we can see to enormous distances, distances that make even galaxy clusters seem microscopic, but there is so much more we can't see. How big does it go? No one knows for sure, but if you follow the bread crumbs out as far as we CAN go and project the expected pattern to continue...well, its big, really big, maybe infinite. At a minimum there are more galaxies in the entire universe than there are particles in all the universe we can see. If that isn't enough to make you feel small, there is much evidence to support a multi-verse, a reality in which our entire universe is but a microscopic piece. Our entire universe could be only one of perhaps an infinite number of others.

So next time the sky is clear and dark, take a look into infinity.

ITALIAN PASTA SALAD

This Italian pasta salad is loaded with meat, cheese, and veggies, tossed in a homemade Italian dressing. A quick and easy dish that is perfect for summer picnics, potlucks, and backyard barbeques!

SALAD 1 (16 oz.) pkg. rotini or fusilli pasta; 1 (8 oz.) container mozzarella pearls; 4 oz. dry hard salami, sliced and quartered; 2 c. baby spinach; 1 c. cherry tomatoes, halved; 1 c. artichoke hearts, chopped 1/2 c. sliced black olives

DRESSING: 1/3 c. extra-virgin olive oil; 2-3 T. red wine vinegar; 1 clove garlic, pressed; 2 tsp. Italian seasoning; 1 T. fresh chopped parsley; 1 pinch red pepper flakes; Kosher salt; Freshly ground black pepper

DIRECTIONS: PASTA SALAD: Cook pasta according to package directions; drain and cool completely. In a large bowl, gently toss together cooled pasta, mozzarella pearls, salami, spinach, tomatoes, artichoke hearts and black olives. DRESSING: Add olive oil, red wine vinegar, garlic, Italian seasoning, parsley, and red pepper flakes to a jar, secure with a lid then shake to combine. Pour dressing over salad and season with salt and freshly ground black pepper; gently toss to combine and serve. Cook's Note: Red onions would be a great addition to this salad. I did not add them because my kids are not big fans of onions. I also like to make a double batch of dressing to have on hand to add to the salad if not serving right away or serving the next day.
